## Dogs to be picked up or owners prosecutei

To Whom It May Concern:
The City of Littlefield has entirely 0 many dogs running loose within he city limits.
The month of August we had four dog-bitten citizens in our city. In the approximately 21 dog bites, and that's
way too many way too many.
From this day
From this day on, dogs running
loose will be picked up, or the owner loose will be picked up, or the owner
will be filed on and fined for violation of city ordinance No. 177 , which
regulates animals in the city limits. City Animal Warden, s/Melvin L. Cox
[EDITOR'S NOTE: The City Council Littlefield has recommended that law governing stray dogs within the
city limits be strietly enforced, and the City Animal Warden has been commissioned to pick up dogs running
loose. Some citizens feel that if their loose. Some citizens feel that is their
dog is properly vacinated and ti-
censed, that dog has the authority to run loose on the city, This is not so,
and we repeat here some of the sections of the city ordinance regulat-
ing dogs within the city limits.)

## THE AUTHORITY

Chapter 3 of the Littlefield City
Code deals with animals, and a portion Code deals with animals, and a portion of Article 1, Section 3-1. designates
the duties of the poundmaster or the duties of the poundmaster or
animal warden. "th shall be the duties of the poundmaster and his assistants to take up and impound all livestock found running at large within the
limits of the City of Littlefield and perform such duties as may ber directed by the Chief of Police under the terms of the article." Ordinance In, which was passed Dec. 15, 1960
Section 3-5 states: "The owner shal keep his dog or cat under restraint ai
all times, and shall not permit such dog or cat to be at large off the premises or property of the owner
unless under the control of a the penalty
The Penalty is quoted in Section 3-9, It states: "The person who shal violate any of the provisions of thit
article shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more $\$ 200$ and each and
every day of such violation shall be deemed a separate and complete offense.
