

## Senator Speaks, New C-CA-BCD Directors Announced At Meeting

Wednesday was "Senator Max Sherman Day" in Littlefield. Residents who visited with the senator of this district and heard him speak at the noon luncheon of the combined civic organizations Wednesday learned first hand some of the reasons Sen. Sherman is eighth in seniority in the Texas Legislature even though he is a youngster among seasoned politicians. Tom Tollett emceed the annual joint meeting of the Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture, the Lions, Rotarians and "We, The Women". Dr. Bill Armstrong introduced Sen. Sherman. Prior to the luncheon, "We, The Women" hosted a coffee for the legislator, and the senator spoke to the civics classes at Littlefield High School. After lunch businessmen took Sen. Sherman on a tour of the denim plant,

feedlot, and the town. Speaking briefly but pointedly, Senator Sherman said death of democracy will be from apathy and undernourishment. His sincerity, dedication and philosophy were graphic in illustrations and quotes he used in his talk. He said offices such as his are offices of trust—not offices of an office holder. Quoting Twain, he said, "Always do what's right. You'll please some of the people and astonish the rest." He puts much emphasis on youth. Telling of the father who held up a picture of the world to his young son, he said the boy's dad then tore the picture into little pieces and told his son to put it together. The father was amazed at how quickly the lad put the picture together.

"How did you figure it out so quickly?" he asked his son. The boy replied, "When you held the picture up I noticed there was a boy on the other side. I figured if you put the boy together, the world would come out alright." Significant quotes from Dickens, Harry Truman, Benjamin Franklin, and J. F. Kennedy sparked his remarks. At the luncheon, C-CA board of directors were announced following an election recently. New Chamber board members are Richard Wall, Fred Edkins, Hubert Henry, Bobby Brunson, Jim Settle, and Rad Richardson (who will serve one more year as past president). Outgoing directors are Benny Zahn, Wade Warren and Doyle Winfield. Directors will meet for a noon luncheon on Jan. 6 to elect officers. City Development board members for the coming year are Calvin Price, president, Eloise Cox, Marge Anzeline, Joe Montgomery, Ed McCanlies, James Settle, D. C. Stuart, and Mickey Ratliff.

The Littlefield City Council formally accepted the resignation of Municipal Judge Florence Dunn Thursday night effective Dec. 23 and later in the council meeting, appointed F. A. Fitzgerald as her successor. Fitzgerald, an experienced law enforcement officer, served as Chief of Police for Littlefield from July, 1957 till October, 1971 before he was relieved of his duties by then City Manager Pat Bradley. The vote on Fitzgerald was unanimous by the Council. Councilman Pat Downs was not in attendance. In other matters considered by the Council in their last meeting of the year, action was delayed until a later date on a request by the South Plains Health Provider Organization for financial assistance for the local Migrant Health Program, unanimously accepted the new City Plumbing Code and the Water and Sewer Extension Policy was discussed.

Texas Tech this summer.



## Federal Minimum Wage To Rise January First

A hike of 20 cents an hour in the federal minimum wage will go into effect Jan. 1, 1976, a U.S. Labor Department official in Dallas today reminded employers and workers.

Phillip F. Arrien, who heads the Department's Employment Standards Administration in Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas, said the basic minimum wage, applicable to most workers, will go from \$2.10 an hour to \$2.30 an hour.

The increase was scheduled by Congress when it amended the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) in May 1974.

Arrien said the minimum wage of those workers whose jobs were not covered by the FLSA prior to 1966 goes from the present \$2.00 an hour to \$2.20 on Jan. 1. They will catch up in 1977, when their minimum, too, goes to \$2.30.

Covered agricultural workers, those on large farms, go to \$2.00 an hour on Jan. 1, from their present \$1.80. They will reach the basic \$2.30 in 1978.

Arrien also noted that some retail establishments will come under the FLSA for the first time on New Year's Day when the Annual Dollar Volume of sales or business done criteria is

reduced to \$200,000. The new minimum applies mostly to establishments which are parts of chain operations, such as retail clothing stores, grocery stores, and variety stores.

## Lamb Library Area Member

The Lamb County Library in Littlefield is among 23 libraries in the 29-county area served by the Lubbock Area Library System qualifying for system membership for the fiscal year that began September 1. They are among 247 libraries that have qualified for membership in ten Texas systems. A total of 86 percent of all Texans are served by these system member libraries. As members, they are participating in activities to improve public library service in the region.

The regional systems are authorized under provisions of the Texas Library Systems Act and are supported by funds administered by the Texas State Library. In order to qualify for system activities, libraries must meet certain criteria concerning number of volumes, amount of local per capita support, and staff.

Each member participates in planning for system activities. Lay representatives from all member libraries attend the annual meeting of the Advisory Council at which council members are elected. The Systems Act gives the Major Resource Center responsibility for drawing up the annual program of service, and Rules and Regulations for its administration direct that the Advisory Council and librarians participate in formulation of the plan.

System funds are allocated according to a per capita formula. They may be used for a variety of cooperative activities, including purchase of materials for local collections, development of film collections to which all system members have ac-

cess, centralized purchasing of materials to obtain discounts for large orders, and technical assistance for small libraries. Books-by-mail and deposit collections extend service to persons who are isolated from library service.

The basic requirements are three years of general experience, or four years of college, or an equivalent combination of education and experience; plus two years of specialized experience which was actual platform teaching at the secondary school or higher level in the subject-matter field of the position for which application is made, i.e. entomology or inhalation therapy.

If your experience and training match these requirements, and you are available complete and return two copies of the application form SF-171 to the following address: U.S. Civil Service Commission, Dallas Area Office, Attention: Mid-Level Section, 1100 Commerce Street, Dallas, Texas 75202.

Your application must be postmarked no later than Dec. 20, 1975. You may obtain the SF-171's from any Federal Job Information Center.

If you are found to be eligible for the position, your name will be referred for consideration in accordance with Civil Service regulations. If you are not selected for the position and duty location at San Antonio, you may receive future consideration for similar positions on the basis of your qualifications and availability.


