study of previous weather cycles, If there is anything in the weather cycle theory, then we may be in for a long series of cold, wet winters, succeeding the 25 years or $s$ so

The science of meteorology, however, has not yet reached the point, in Dr. Greggs opinion, where a areat
reliance can be placed upon efforts to tell the weather for more than a week or two ahead.
