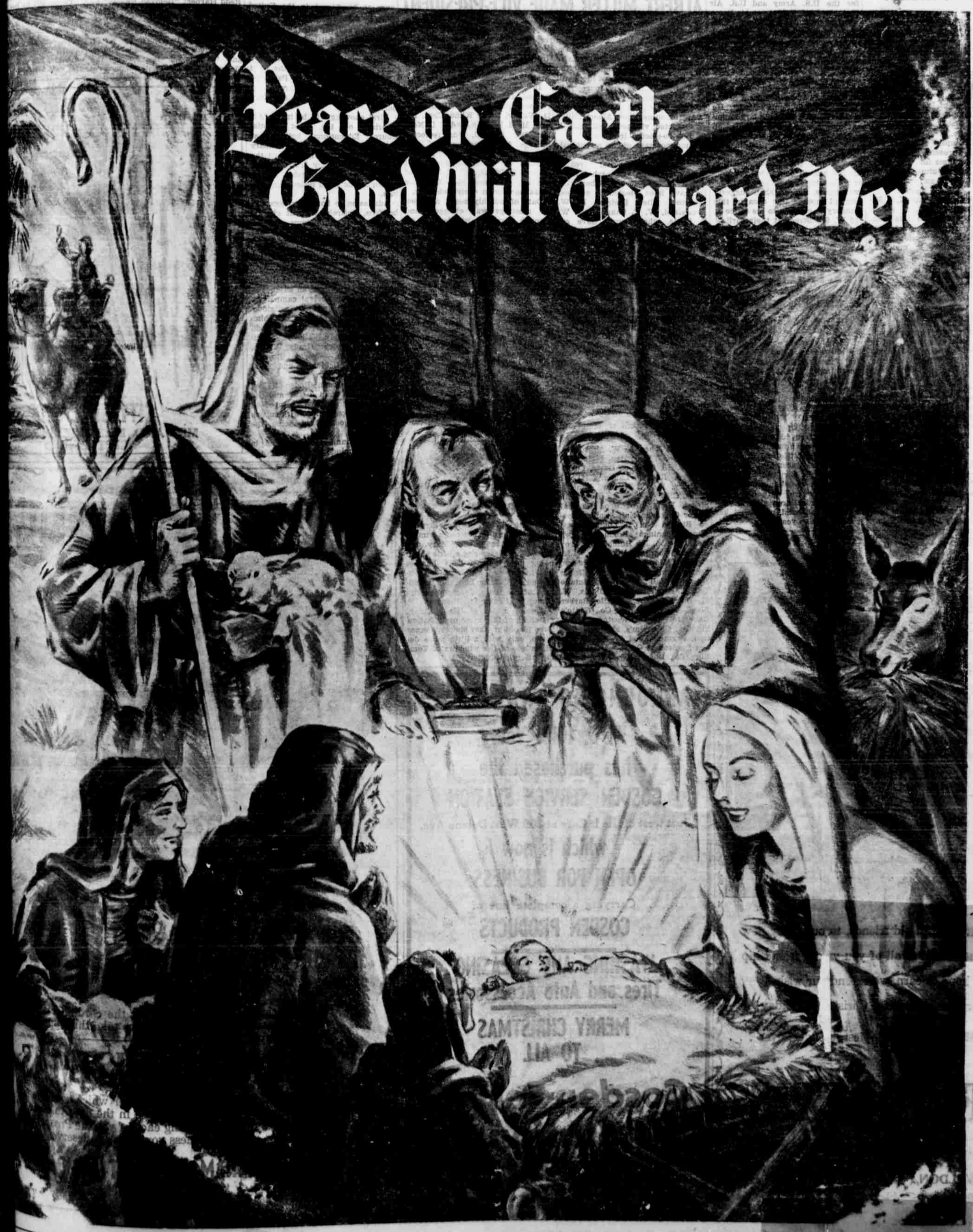

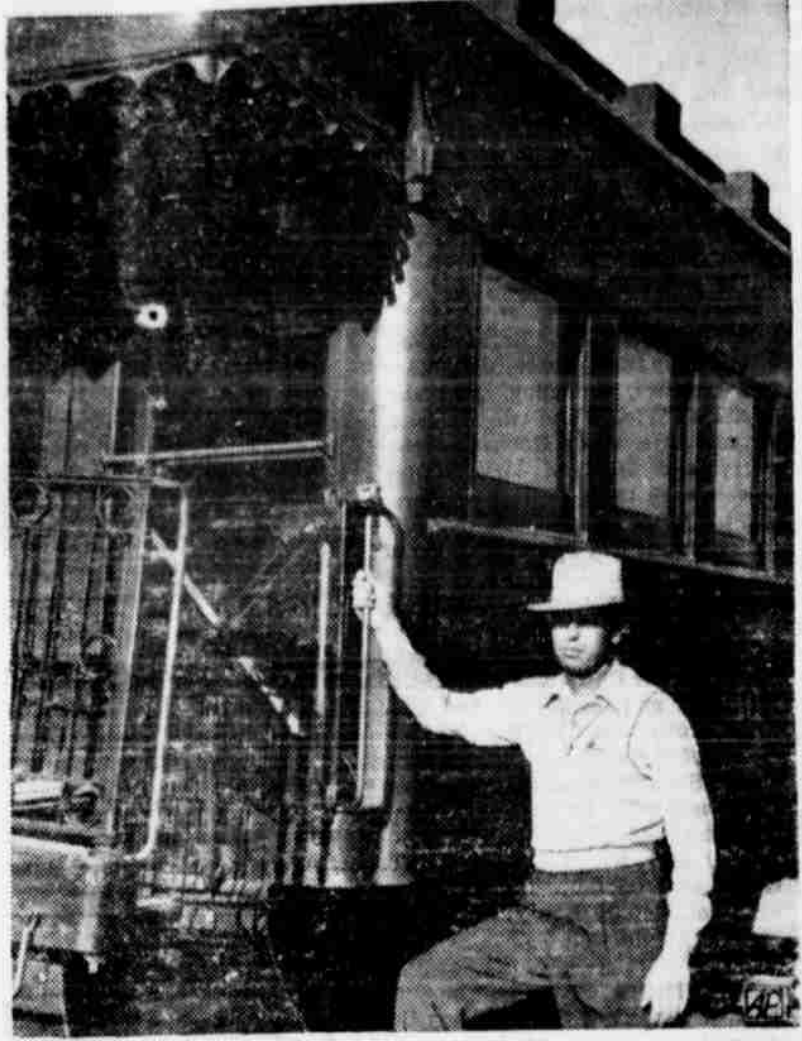

# New, Big Power Plant To Go Into Operation This Summer

## R. E. DRAKE NAMED SUPERINTENDENT OF NEW PROJECT Second Unit To Be Functioning In Mid-1953 Is Plan

The manager of Plant X, Southwestern Public Service Company's super-power plant near Earth, will be R. E. Drake. Mr. Drake is manager of the company's Denver City plant at the present time. He is expected to assume his new duties in the immediate future and begin to assemble a crew and prepare for operation of the new plant.

The first unit of Plant X, a 50,000 kilowatt generator, is scheduled to go in the line this summer. A second generator, a 100,000 kilowatt unit, is scheduled to be ready for operation in mid-1953. When the second unit is on the line, Plant X will be the largest of the company's base load power plants, with a generating capacity itself in excess of that of the entire system in 1943.

Mr. Drake has been associated with the Southwestern Public Service Company, or predecessor organizations, since 1934, except for his military service and a brief period before World War II. He went to Denver City as assistant plant manager in 1946, and was named plant manager in 1949.

R. E. Dyer, manager of the Tuco plant near Abernathy, succeeds Mr. Drake at Denver City. P. S. Sterrett goes from the management at the Clovis, N.M., plant to Tuco as manager, and G. R. Maxwell, an engineer at the Amarillo plant, becomes Clovis plant manager.

M. Sgt. Cutshall, local recruiter for the U.S. Army and U.S. Air Force in Littlefield, says Air Force enlistments for the remainder of this month are just about filled, as far as the quota for the Amarillo area is concerned. He said that men in this area are not responding to the advantage of volunteering in the branch of service of their own choice, at this time, as they are doing in the other parts of the Panhandle and South Plains. He also said that due to the large number of men that are to be called up for induction, most all married men without children, sometime in February next year, these men will have a hard time in volunteering for the branch of service of their own choosing if they wait until the last minute. Sgt. # Lamb County Cotton Is Harvested

J. D. Jordan, local office manager of Texas Employment Commission, announced Monday morning, that a total of 106,000 bales of cotton had been harvested as of Wednesday night, December 12th. He predicted that a total of 110,000 bales will have been ginned by the end of the week.

come this week, Jordan said. "Most of the cotton in Lamb County has been harvested. However, some cotton is being brought in from Castro County and Deaf Smith County—but that too should be harvested by the end of the week," he said.

Gins are catching up on ginning daily, and should be through with ginning by the end of the year.

David Eaton, agricultural agent for the county estimated 325,000 acres will be devoted to cotton in Lamb county next year, according to a survey completed by Eaton, in 1951, although the equivalent of 130,000 acres planted were lost this

year due to hail.

South Plains cotton production estimates were slashed 50,000 bales late last week, hand-in-hand with an announcement that cotton classers were preparing for their one-millionth bale.

K. N. Clapp, cotton buyer for Anderson-Clayton & Co., lowered his product on estimate for 21 South Plains counties to 1,260,000 from 1,310,000 on Nov. 28. Clapp reported: "High winds last week covered up or blew away an estimated 2,000 bales of cotton. In making our survey, we find an additional 25,000-bale freeze loss."
