

AGENT D. A. ADAM GIVES ADVICE CONTROLLING CONTAGIOUS ABORTION CATTLE AFFECTED IN THIS SECTION

In a few weeks several cases have been reported to the county agent. Whether the disease is abortion or not is not determined. However, the symptoms are the same. It has been obtained from the laboratories in the county given to the farm of this county through the

the greatest sources of spread is from bulls. Fetus when dropped if not destroyed, and the places disinfected, will quickly spread disease to other cows.

Information now available on the control and treatment of this disease in cattle is neither complete nor extensive. The committee on Abortion of the American Veterinary Medical Association state that while most abortions are due to infection, there are a number much too great to be ignored unassociated with any determined infection.

The committee further reports for the year 1927 that abortion vaccine (live culture) seems to be important influence upon the abortion rate in the herd. It should be borne in mind that the use of the vaccine reduces the number of abortions but does not eradicate the disease.

The report of the proceedings of the thirty-first meeting of the United States Live Stock Sanitary association in their symposium on abortion reports that there are three states now recommending the use of abortion bacterin and vaccine in their control measures. One state reports to the committee that many veterinarians seem to get favorable results from the use of abortion bacterin. This report states that research work has demonstrated a definite connection between contagious abortion in cattle and human welfare, and recommends that proper steps be taken to protect the human family from infection conveyed by cattle affected with contagious abortion.

Bacterins and vaccines should not be depended upon for a full control of contagious abortion, but the following should also, be employed, states County Agent D. A. Adam.

Of first importance is the agglutination test (blood test) of all animals on the premises, including bulls, and a retest of all animals over six months old every three months or oftener if the sanitary authorities direct, until all have been negative at least one year. After this time, tests should be made once each year in order to detect and weed out sources of infection.

Sanitary measures and proper feed-

ing rations are of equal importance.

One or two methods are recommended by the county agent (1) vaccinate all animals with abortion bacterin and revaccinate every 4 to 6 months, (2) Blood test every animal. Eliminate all reactors and make replacements with clean animals from non-infected herds. The last is not always the most economical but sometimes necessary.

A licensed veterinarian should be employed to do this work, and should be attended to as soon as possible wherever cases are observed.

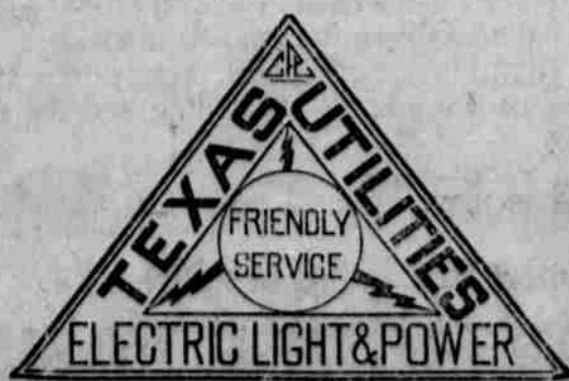
