Crosby of Olton. <br> Texas NYA Lowers Age Limit To 16 <br> AUSTIN, December 9 - Unem ployed boys and girls in Texas who are 16 years of age, out of school, in need and who want the work experience provided on National Youth Administration projects are now eligible for such employment, J. C.
