\section*{COUNTY JUDGE hayRULES THAT COUNTY SEAT ELIECTION BALLOTS MUST BE PRINTED BLANK}

In compliance with the Attorney General's ruling last Friday, in that Amherst must be placed on the ballot, County Judge Simon D. Hay, ruled at Olton, Tuesday, that the ballots would be printed blank and that the correct form of ballot used would be as follows:
"For removal to
(inserting the name of the place)
"For remaining at (inserting the name of the place)

The report has been rumored and advertised throughout Lamb County that only Littlefield would be on the ballot, but County Judge Hay' decision, stated above, together with the Attorney General's opinion, conclusively and definitely settles the issue. The names of all towns will be omitted from the ballot, and the voters maygo to the polls and write in the name of the town they desire the County Seat to be moved to, or, if they desire the County seat to remain at it's present location, the voters may also write in the name of Olton.
REMEMBER: Amherst is the logical place for the County Seat. Amherst IS situated within five miles of the geographical center of the county. A majorty of one vote is all that is needed to move the County Seat to Amherst.
