## DEATH ON THE HIGHWAYS

While the year's tally of automobile deaths is not yet complete, the figures already available make it clear that the record in 1936 is higher than that of 1935. About
37,000 persons were killed in motor accidents in the 37,000 persons
twelve months.
With $2,000,000$ more cars on the roads, we may expect even more highway deaths in 1937 .
Those who standy arse who have given this subject the closest ing ligre that the blame for most of these motor kill--: There are still the car nor the road, but with the drivnired to drive a car in many others, the examination of drivers for licenses is so perfunctory that possession of a driver's license is no proof that its owner is a good driver. The most dangerous place to drive is on a wide well-paved highway on a clear day. That is where and when mptorists get careless. Sunday is the most dangerous day in the week, Wednesday the safest. Twice as many persons are killed by cars between 7 and 8 o'clock in the evening as between 7 and 8 in the morning.

The motor death rate in the cities is coming down, by reason of betterlighting, more effective traffic conrol, and better enforcement of the traffic laws. The rate is gotng up in the country. It would take more money than the taxpayers would stand for to light and police a villion miles of highway.

The solution of the problem would seem to be the gut education of drivers, not so much in the art of drivry driver behaved on the road with the same on for others that he shows elsewhere, the toll of moramurders might be greatly reduced.
