# You Have Only To January 31 To Pay Your Poll Tax 

## Here Is Important Information relative TO the paying of your poll taxes

Every person who shall have attained the age of 21 years and is a citizen of the United States, and who shall have resided one year in the State and six months in the County preceding an election are enCitled to vote and are subject to a Poll Tax, except those becoming 21 years of age since January 1, $1: 45$, or those over 60 years of age.
Persons over 60 years of age do not need an exemption in order to vote. Exemptions are only isage after January 1, 1945.
A new ruling, (Attorney General's Opinion No. $0-6236$ ), now in effect requires those who are blind,
deaf or dumb, or who is permanently disabled or has lost one hand or foot, to pay $\$ 1.00$ for a Poll Tax, and are not entitled to an exemption as heretofore (World War II disabled veterans will not have to pay the $\$ 1.00$ Poll Tax unless he has been discharged for more than 18 months prior to the date of elec(ion).

A soldier and his wife who still claim Lamb County as their home may cast a vote even if they live and have been out of Lamb County the entire time he has been in the service; he does not have to pay a Poll Tax, but his wife does.

A person may pay Poll Tax without paying their other taxes, and may pay one whether it is assessed against him or her, or not.

A person may appoint an agent to pay their Poll Tax for them. Said appointment must be in writing and the Poll Tax receipt must be mailed back or given to him by the Tax Collector and not by the agent.

Poll Tax must be paid by midnight on Janu 31, 1946, and all applications for Poll Tax must be in the office of Tax Assessor and Collector at that time. No Poll Tax will be issued after that hour.

All persons over 60 years of age are required to have exemption receipts if they wish to vote. These will be issued by the Tax Assessor and Collector.

Soldiers ro not need a poll tax to vote if they have been discharged within 18 months of the day of election. They must take their discharge papers to the polls.
