overseas. The test measures
general aptitude and the ability

tion or achievenent. (If test
scores indicated a limited lan-
scores Indicated a limited lan-
guage--learning ability for exam-
ple, the Peace Corps tries to
ple, the Peace Corps tries to
place the applicant inan Engilish-
speaking country.) The place-
ment test requires nopreparation
and is non-competitive-an
applicant can neither pass nor
fall.
The application form, not the

portant factor in the selection of
