





The one on Tarawa was especially well kept and the chapel of native construction was very beautiful. The principal cemetery on Guadalcanal was similar in appearance and had an equally beutiful chapel. There is a little office adjacent to the cemetery where a soldier keeps the register of the men buried there. Some fresh graves were being dug in the Guadalcanal cemetery. It was explained that during the thick of the fighting a few of our men were buried at isolated places on the island and that their remains were being brought to the main cemetery. It was also explained that the remains of a number of the men who had been buried in the New Hebrides Islands were being brought to Guadalcanal for re-inter-

Our plane did not stop at Iwo Jima but circled the tiny island at low albut the cemetery with its many aitude a couple of times. The island was rimmed with war installations, ibut the cemetery with its many white crosses was about as obvious from the air as Mount Suribarhi, where the flag was raised and the memorable photograph taken.

I saw three of the seven cemeterses on Okinawa. In the center of one of them was the grave of Lt. General Simon Bolivar Buckner, who led our forces there, and all about him were the graves of heroes of the Okinawa campaign. There were no chapels at Okinawa cemeteries, but they were well kept. At one of them I observed a little shelter which protected a register of the names of those bursed there.

The largest cemetery in the Pacific area is at Finschhafen, New Guinea, where about 7000 of our men are interred. The remains of our men in many of the smaller cemeteries throughout the Pacific are being removed to the larger cemeteries where they can be better cared for about 50 cemeteries thereby being abandoned.

In the European theatre, the remains of our men who lost their lives on German soil are now being removed to semi-permanent ceme-




