Conservation And Farm Production
More positive conservation is necessary if American farmers are to reach their production goals this year and meet the greater demands which will be made of them in future years.
That's what Fred Wallace, national chief of the Agricultural Adjustment Agency, this week told AAA commit eemen in a letter pointing out tha if it had not been for the conservation work of recent years, agricultur 1942 produstio chance of reaching 1942 production goals"
Wallace said that American agriculture, aided by a running start would be able to carry out its war pro duction task by a gigantic effort to do two things: (1) Use every method of adjustment to get the right amoun of each product, without waste; (2) Use every method of conservation to increase yields this year and build up the soil for bigger output next year.
"This means making the best pos sible use of our land in producing the food needed to win the war and writ the peace", he wrote. "Every conser vation measure we know about mus be used to make every acre count in producing this year's record outpu and in building soil fertility for even greater production next year and for the duration. Agriculture must be pre pared for a long war'

Conservation practices increas yields per acre by adding plant food o the land, by preserving fertilizers, by holding water in the soil, by pre venting the rich earth from being dried up by the sun, blown away by the wind, or washed by rains into ditches and rivers and into the sea, he contin ued.
Reminding farmers of the havoc created during the last war by recklessly plowing up additional acres Wallace said: "This time we cannot possibly get the needed production simply through a plow-up spree".
