#### Japan Surrenders Unconditionally; **Fighting Suspended**

V-J Day be Announced Following Formal Capitulation of Japan

The Japanese surrender with victory and peace at last after almost four years of war, was announced Tuesday night at 6 o'clock by President Truman, and Japan has shrunk from a world power,bent upon ruling all Asia, to the state of a fifth rate nation.

Japan surrendered unconditionally, and history's most destructive war is over except for formalities. Arrangements must still be completed for the signing of formal surrender terms. Gen. Douglas MacArthur has been appointed Supreme Allied Commander to receive the surrender, following which V-J Day will be proclaimed.

President Truman in his address to the nation stated that he had ordered the Japanese government to stop the war on all fronts and that the Allied armed forces had been ordered to suspend offensive

"Canada has made commitments to ship its exportable surplus of meat to the United Kingdom and to liberated ureas. Most of the meat shipped to the United Kingdom is supplied under the Mutual Aid (free contribution) program and most of

that shipped to liberated areas is a obtained from the Canadian Govern-of the United States by Canada,

from last year. The Canadians have the United Kingdom for the July-September quarter of 1945.

It is estimated that in addition to the foregoing the shipments by Canada to liberated areas in 1945 may reach about 110,000,000 pounds as canned meat. Canada also is continuing to assume the responsibility of providing meat for certain areas, such as Newfoundland, and British West Indies. Altogether, exports may be 30 to 35 percent of this year's total meat production in Can-

"To obtain meat for export and to restrict domestic consumption, Canada utilizes a system of Government requisitioning at inspected packing plants. This is similar to 'the set-aside' system employed in the United States to procure supplies for lend-lease and the military services. Slaughter plants in Canada are required to reserve for overseas delivery all Grade A hogs everywhere, all Grade B hogs in western Canada and 65 percent of Grade B hogs in Ontario and other eastern provinces. These two grades comprise the bulk of the hog marketing.





#### FLIES TRANSMIT DISEASE TO CATTLE

Austin, Tex., Special: Farmers were given another reason for a war on flies this summer in a report issued today by livestock health authorities.

Flies, the report states, have been found to be carriers of the deadly cattle disease, anaplasmosis, which is causing heavy cattle losses in a number of Western states,

"Recent tests show that horse flies which suck the blood of cattle carrying this disease, can readily transmit it to healthy cattle," says the report released here today by the American Foundation for Animal Health. "Anaplasmosis is caused by a minute parasite which attacks the blood cells of cattle, causing severe anemia. Cattle which contract the disease remain carriers and during the horsefly and horn-fly season such 'carrier' animals can endanger all healthy cattle in the locality. Persons not familiar with proper sanitary and disinfection practices in voccinating may also spread the disease. There is no known cure, so rigid preventive measures are doubly important. A vigorous campaign against biting ially helpful."

#### **Just Completed**

A Rural Electric Project, including a number of short lines, aggregating 110 miles, has just been completed, supplying 200 additional farm homes with electricity.

#### PROJECT COVERING 120 MILES APPROVED-

The Rural Electrification Administration of St. Louis, Mo., last week approved a second project covering 120 miles to take care of about 240 new members over a scattered area of north part of Hockley County, all over Lamb County, and along the west line of Hale County, and east line of Cochran County. Maps plans and lists, were prepared and members secured on this project before the war, and work is getting underway at once.

#### THIRD PROJECT TO BE PRESENTED-

Carrying out their usual progressive program the local organization is also working on a third proposition to present a 200 mile additional project to the Rural Electrification Administration at St. Louis, and will have their application ready to submit in a short time.

We view with pride the progress that has been made in helping to modernize the farm homes in this section. The system which had only 351 members at the end of the first month of operation, after the lines were energized on May 15, 1939, now furnishes electric service to 1427 consumers along 525 miles of distribution lines in Lamb, Hockley, Bailey, Hale and Cochran Counties.
