The time has come for co-operation in a mutual plan of adjustment. Briefly, we outline the delinquent tax law as passed by the 43rd Legislature. The General Law provides that all delinquent taxes (meaning the year 1932 and prior years) shall at present bear 6% interest until June 30th, 1934, and thereafter such taxes bear a 10% penalty and 6% in terest per year, which means that 1930 taxes amounting to \$100.00 paid on July 1 would bear a penalty of 10% plus 21% interest; in other words, it would take \$131.00 to pay a \$100.00 tax item July 1, 1934 under the General Laws. Therefore the necessity of paying taxes before July 1, 1934. This same \$100.00 if paid before July 1, 1934 can be settled for \$106.00-a saving of \$25.00.

It is our intention now as in the past to consider the efforts of those who have paid as well as those delinquent. Those delinquent have perhaps done their best and may not have grasped the importance of the enormous penalties that are attached on July 1st. This additional cost is the outcome of the State law; something we are unable to help.
