"Farmers who market produce through a cooperative should add any patronage dividends received in the taxable year to their gross receipts line, seed, fertilizer, or whe buy, through a cooperative, implements, gasoreduce the cost of such items by the amount of patronage dividends, receivd or add the patronage dividends to income. Patronage dividends received as rebates on purchases of itms not used in your business should be omitted from your return. Patronage dividends are considered paid when remitted in cash, merchandise, stock certificates, or when credited to you."

The tax instructions are specific, and the government has a cross-check to insure accurate tax reporting.
