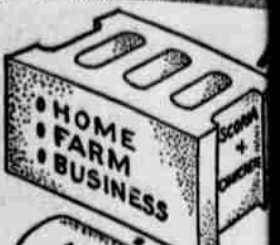

W. O. Reed of Dallas, Speaker of the House of Representatives in the 50th Legislature, has resigned as assistant general attorney of Texas & Pacific Railway Company to join the law firm of Clark, Coon, Holt and Fisher in Dallas.

Mr. Reed, a member of the legis-lature for the past 16 years, was praised by Robert L. Clark, brother of U. S. Attorney General Tom C. Clark, as "...an able lawyer with wide experience and proven ability. My firm and I are happy to welcome Mr. Reed as a member of the firm in the private practice of the law."

During his tenure in the legisla-ture Mr. Reed served, at one time or another, as chairman of almost every committee of the lower house.

Mr. Reed's 27 years with the rail-road was primarily in commerce law before the ICC and Texas Railroad Commission. He is admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court.
