# EDITORIALS Cox And Newspaper Chains

James A. Cox, the Demo ratic Presiden ... . in 1920, who was deleated by Warren G. Harding, has dieu.

Cox was the first man ever to be elected Governor of Ohio for three terms, but he was badly ustailed at his race against Harding, another newspaper publisher. Use of the most significant memories of the 1920 campaign was that Cox's running-mate was Franklin D. Rooseveit.

The comment we would like to make on the passing of Cox concerns chain ownership of newspapers. Cox was one of those business men who gradually acquired a string of newspapers throughout his career. At his death, he owned papers in Ohio, Florica, Georgia, as well as other states. Among the newspapers he purchased were the Atlanta papers. the Miama, Fla., Daily News, and others.

Absentee-ownership of newspapers is becoming mare general in the United States. Certain problems are raised by the growing practice of outside interests acquiring newspapers in various sections of the country. For one thing, absentee-ownership does not necessarily take into consideration the best interest of the community being served.

Editorially, absentee-ownership, or chain-ownership, of newspapers sometimes produces a policy of mass propaganda ro mass editorialization, and the interests of the different cities involved are not properly considered. There is also the threat that chain newspaper ownership will produce a situation in which competition is stifled, free enterprise is voided and the interests of the people served by certain newspapers are not taken into proper consideration.

# Progress In Small Towns
