Mobeetie Man Is Injured In Crash

On 11-09-09 at 7:17 AM on TX 152 E of Pampa near Milepost 378 an 06 Chevy pickup and a 08 Ford F-350 pickup collided. Ronnie Ledbetter 46 of Pampa was traveling East on 152, Jeffery Fraley 38 of Mobeetie was traveling West.

Ledbetter's Chevy drove onto the wrong side of the road into Fraley's lane of traffic. Ledbetter's vehicle struck Fraley's pickup on the front left. The two vehicles then skidded off the main roadway.

Ledbetter was pronounced dead by Justice of the Peace Kurt Curfman. Ledbetter and Fraley were wearing seatbelts. Fraley is in the Pampa medical center in stable condition. The weather was wet surface and foggy. It is unknown at this time why Ledbetter's vehicle traveled onto the wrong side of the road.

Commissioners' Court Meets; Video Equipment Purchased

Wheeler County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, November 9, 2009 in the commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler county courthouse. The meeting to address the agenda was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

Thirteen items were on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2; County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted by the court.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The court voted to pay the bills as presented.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The commissioners voted to allow Leo Lee to install a cattle guard on Co. Rd. T, west side of County Road 14 at SE corner of Section 19, Block A-8, Wheeler County, Texas, in Precinct #1. This is a short (1/2 mile in length) road, which would be impossible to fence.

40 mph speed limit signs will be placed on County Line road, south of Hwy 152.

The commissioners approved changes in County Policy Manual, relating to medicare coverage and the filing of time sheets by county employees.

No action was taken on the purchase of Bunker Gear for Kellon VFD. Commissioner Puryear said he had taken care of that agenda item.
