
Lois Flowers Is **Buried Sept. 12**

WORKING FOR THE CROWS

Strange as it may sound, people usually had a special name for their home place; Sand Hill, Rock Bottom, etc. The first year of the two that we lived on this rented farm, Dad referred to it as, "Old Double Tuff." Nothing seemed to be even close to easy. He had an old, Regular Farmall tractor, which was made by International Harvester Co. Powersteering on tractors, or anything else for that matter, didn't exist. So, it comes as no surprise that this tractor didn't have a power lift that would lift plows out of the ground. At each end of the field (called a turn row) Dad would have to manually push a lever to lift each of the two plows out of the ground. After turning around, he'd release the levers to let the plows go back down. This routine would be repeated 200 or 300 times a day. Dad never weighed more than 130 pounds, but I never once heard him complain. Folks' of his generation were a really hardy bunch. "Double Tuff," you could say.

When our maize (milo) had headed out and the grain almost matured, we borrowed a team of horses, Old Son & Old Blue, along with a wagon, from my "Uncle Fat." The horses would pull the wagon up and down the rows, while you cut the maize heads off with a pocket knife. When you had cut all the heads on your row as far forward as the front of the wagon, all you'd have to do was holler, "up a little," and the horses would pull the wagon foreword exactly one length of the wagon and then they would stop. Immediately, they would go back to munching on the maize heads. It sort of kept them refueled as they worked. Kind of kept them gassed up, too! But, they sure knew their

I talked Dad into letting me try my hand at heading maize, but promptly gashed my finger. He sent me to the house to get bandaged up. That pretty much ended my career as a maize header.

When the wagon was full, we'd haul the load of "heads" to a small barn and unload them with a maize fork. One time, part of the

heads weren't quite dry enough to store in the barn, so Dad unloaded those in a long pile on the turn-row. He planned on hauling them to the barn as soon as they dried out a little more. That never happened, the crows ate every drop of it! At that time, there were countless thousands of crows around the Wheeler area. From then on, we never missed an opportunity to kill a crow.







PROPOSITION 1

HJR 132 would amend the constitution to authorize the legislature to allow a municipality or a county to issue bonds and notes to finance the purchase of buffer areas or open spaces adjacent to military installations. The buffer areas would be construct roadways utilities, or other infrastructure to protect or promote the mission of the military installation. The municipality or county may pledge increases in ad valorem tax revenues for repayment of the bonds or notes.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the financing, including through tax increment financing, of the acquisition by municipalities and counties of buffer areas or open spaces adjacent to a military installation for the prevention of encroachment or for the construction of roadways, utilities, or other infrastructure to protect or promote the mission of the military installation."

PROPOSITION 2

HJR 36 would amend the constitution to authorize the legislature to provide for the taxation of a residence homestead solely on the basis of the property's value as a residence homestead, regardless of whether the property may have a higher value if it were used for other purposes.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to prohibit the taking, damaging, or destroying of private property for public use unless the action is for the ownership, use, and enjoyment of the property by the State, a political subdivision of the State, the public at large, or entities granted the power of eminent domain under law or for the elimination of urban blight on a particular parcel of property, but not for certain economic development or enhancement of tax revenue purposes, and to limit the legislature 's authority to grant the power of eminent domain to an entity."
