OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

HOEING COTTON AND PULLING BOLLS

As far back as I can remember, cotton has been a major crop around Wheeler. At one time, we had two "cotton gins" in town that sat right across the road from each other. They did a lot of ginning and baling in the fall. Both of them are gone now....

Hoeing the weeds and crabgrass had to be done after the cotton plants got up several inches tall and then a little more spot-hoeing later in the summer. As I've mentioned before, at about ten years old, I thought of myself as quite an expert tractor driver. At this particular time, it became pretty obvious that I was the only one thinking along that line.

My dad was really good about always hoeing with me and I suppose I'd become spoiled to that. One hot summer day, he told me to go ahead and start hoeing, but he needed to do a little cultivating with the tractor. He said it wouldn't take long and he'd be back and help me, as soon as he finished. I got to feeling sorry for myself, me being the good tractor driver that I was, left alone to hoe. So, I pouted up pretty quick. For some dumb reason, I started hoeing everything in the row, cotton and all. I hoed it clean as a whistle! I did this for about two hundred feet or more.

When dad got back and saw what I'd done, he wore out two or three cotton stalks on my hide. I never was inclined to do that again.

Pulling bolls was a bit more tolerable to me than hoeing, for several different reasons. For one thing, there were always quite a few people who would come and help. Secondly, and high on my list of importance, were watermelons. Yep, my dad was one of the good-hearted souls who would throw some watermelon seeds in the planter boxes, just so people pulling bolls could find a tasty watermelon. I'm not sure if that was an old tradition, but I'd heard of some other farmers doing it, also.

One fall, a couple of mom's grown brothers were helping pull bolls. They'd been pulling all week and on Friday, I believe it was, they ate supper with us after coming in from the field. After supper, we were all sitting outside where it was cooler and visiting about the day, while dad played his guitar for us. Someone, commented that the moon was so full and bright, it was almost like daylight. Then, one of them commented, "It's so bright, you could pull cotton and never miss a boll." As ridiculous as it sounds, someone else belted out, "Let's go pull a weighing by the moonlight, just to be able to say we did it." They all got up, got their cotton sacks, and went back to the field.

A little later that night, they came back to the house. Each

one had pulled about a fifty or sixty pound weighing. They were all laughing, grinning, and very proud of themselves. This was something they could talk about for years to come. "Do you remember when...."

Up to that point, I'd only suspected that insanity ran in our family. After that, there wasn't much doubt....



Destructive and/or defiant behavior.


Inability to concentrate.




