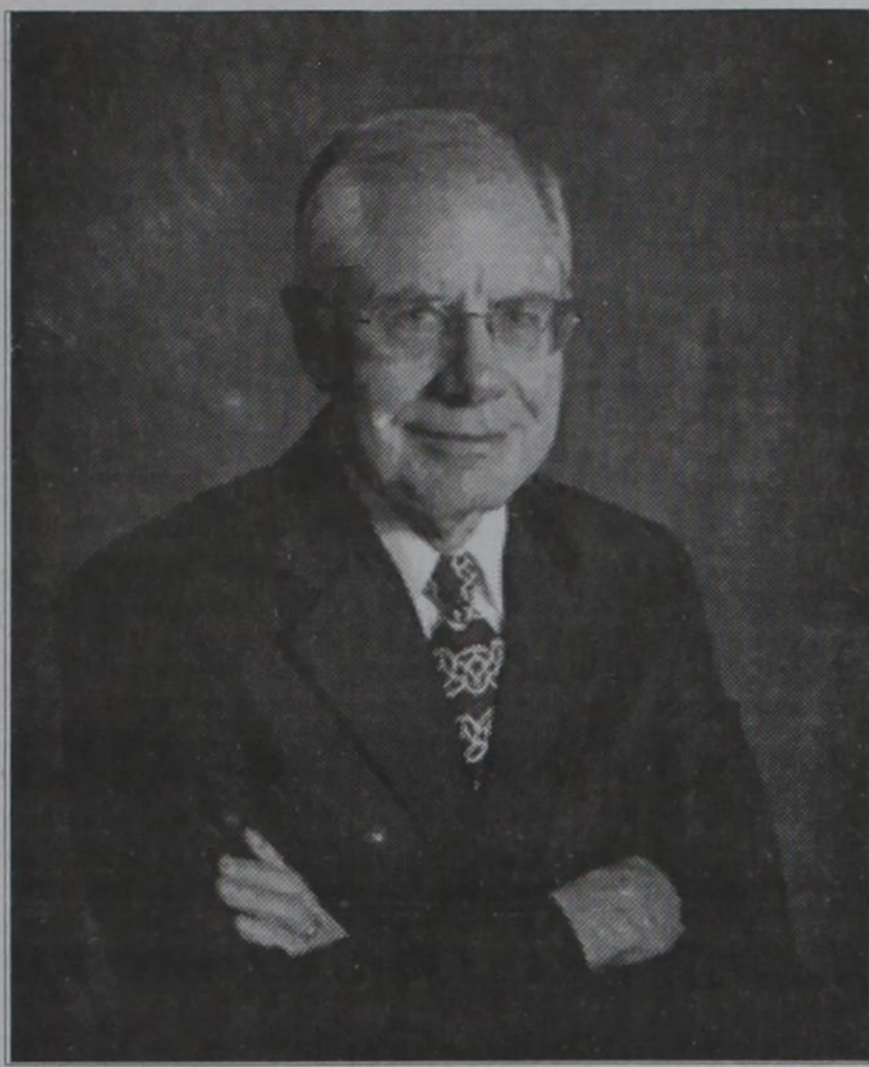


Super Lawyer Designation

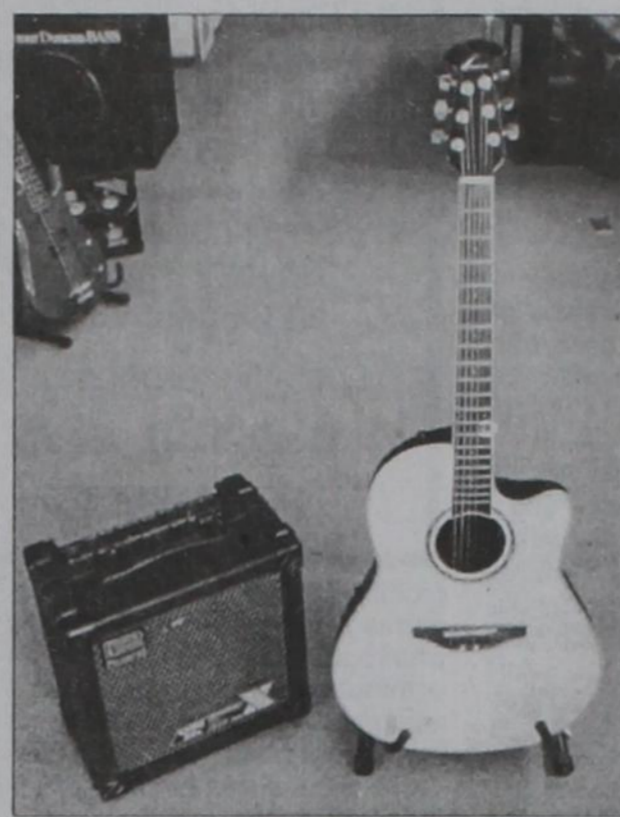

of the proposed lines will be located in Wheeler County. The exact dates for the meeting will be announced at a later date.

Henry Davis with Doshier, Pickins and Francis met with the court to discuss the audit report findings for Fiscal Years 2007 and 2008. He made some recommendations to the county officials on what changes should be made in posting income and expenses.

Joel Finsterwald, County Sheriff, asked permission to add Tony Sellers on the payroll as full-time employee, effective 9/16/09, at a salary of \$2,716.88. The commissioners approved the action.

The county agreed to enter into

a contract with Childress County for the housing of county prisoners for one fiscal year, 2009-2010.

The Commissioners' Court date for the next meeting was changed from October 12 to October 13 due to October 12 being a holiday.

The commissioners also agreed to their Cooperative Working Agreement with Tralee Crisis Center.

The court agreed to the moving of voting Precinct 2 from the Senior Citizens wing of the Wheeler Library to the Girl Scout wing of the Wheeler Library. The Girl Scout room is located on the north side of the Wheeler Library building. The change is necessary because repairs are needed in the

Senior Citizens section. The change will not be made in time for the November election, but will be completed by the March elections.
