## Wheeler County Commissioners Meet In Regular Session Monday

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, August 23, 2010, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. the following agenda was considered and action taken.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The bills were approved for payment.

Judge Hefley sought permission to transfer \$100,000 from the county's general fund to the commissioners' line item fund; \$25,000 to each of the four precincts.

The judge also requested to move \$26,000 from the County Agriculture and Family Center General Fund to the equipment fund.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The County Treasurer's report for June was accepted by the court.

Dave Myers, ROW Manager, met with the court to bring them up to date on the Cross Texas Transmission line. He presented a map showing the proposed route, which crosses the southwest half of the county.

Amelia Ann (Green) Sims, 92, passed away Saturday, August 21, 2010, in Arlington, Texas. Services were held Tuesday, August 24, 2010, at 2:00 pm at the First United Methodist Church in Wheeler with Rev. Ernie McCaughey of Tulia, Texas, officiating. Burial followed in the Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Wright Funeral Home, Wheeler, Texas.

Amelia was born in Dalhart, Texas, and grew up on her parents' ranch between Dalhart and Stratford, Texas. She married Lyndon H. Sims on November 15, 1936. He preceded her in death in 1988. She moved with her family to Wheeler County in November, 1945, and remained there until moving to Arlington in 1999.

During her life in Wheeler, she was a music teacher in both the schools and as a private teacher of piano and organ. Amelia was the organist for Wheeler United Methodist Church for 46 years and played for thousands of services and hundreds of weddings and funerals. She was a loyal supporter of the church, school and community, having served on the administrative board of the church and as a leader of the local and area United Methodist Women's Groups.

Amelia served as a State Vice-President of The Texas Cattle Women as well as other Top O' Texas and state positions. She started the Wheeler Meals on Wheels program and assisted in the start of the Shamrock Meals on Wheels program. The Wheeler Chamber of Commerce honored Amelia as Woman of the Year in 1990.

She is survived by a daughter, Carolyn K. Jolly (Jim) of Arlington, Texas; a son, M. Kent Sims (Trish) of Flower Mound, Texas; 15 grandchildren, 27 great-grandchildren and three great-great-grandchildren. Amelia was preceded in death by her husband; a daughter, Joyce Haddox of Austin; a son, Dean Sims of Lubbock; and a brother, Keith Green, and sister, Bonnie Green, both of Dalhart, Texas.

**OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN**

**POOL HALLS & DOMINO PARLORS**

As a few of you may remember, there was a time when Wheeler could boast of having not one, but two pool halls. The second one didn't last very long; there just wasn't enough business for two. We also had two drugstores, two lumber yards, three grocery stores, two blacksmiths, and most

important to teenagers...one streetlight right in the middle of the intersection, just southwest of the courthouse. That's where you circled your car and repeated the drag over and over. (After most grown-up had gone home, of course.)

When I finally became a teenager, I sure wanted to go in the pool hall and see what playing that game was like. I mentioned this to my friend, Bobby. He said he'd been in there before and better yet, he even knew how to play pool. The very next Saturday, we got together and off we went, straight to the pool hall. We sauntered in there like this was an "everyday" event and we knew exactly what we were doing...

At first it seemed pretty dark in there, then my eyes started adjusting and I could finally see... what had been a long time mysterious place! Cigar and cigarette smoke filled the area and the pool balls hitting each other created a constant "clacking" sound. Occasional words would be blurted out, words that seemed to indicate someone, wasn't too happy about something...

Against the wall were several big ole' brass spittoons, for the tobacco-chewers to spit in. Hits and misses marked their spot. In the far back-end of the building were six or eight tables...that's where quite a few older men would sit around, smoke, chew and play dominoes. If one of the players needed a spittoon, he'd just drag one over to his table. I couldn't help but wonder, "Who had the job of emptying them?"

We stayed at the front where a couple of snooker tables and three or four pool tables were located. It cost a quarter to play a game. We played for about an hour or more and never did make all fifteen balls. The man that owned the place, finally asked us to quit. I guess he figured he couldn't make any money with "one" game lasting as long as ours had. More than likely, he didn't know that Bobby was a local celebrity, because of his parachute jump with the umbrella. If he'd only known that, maybe he would have let us play longer.

We continued to go in once in a while, but we never did get very good. I don't think I ever did go to the back where the domino tables were. I always felt like those "older" guys playing dominoes, wouldn't want us teenagers back there. They looked pretty serious about what they were doing.

It was always considered kind-of "taboo" for girls to go in the pool hall. As you might expect... a couple of girls decided to challenge that idea. One of my friends had two older sisters who went barging in one fine day. They played pool for about an hour and then left. I never knew of them, or any other girls going in there again, but they sure did get their point across...

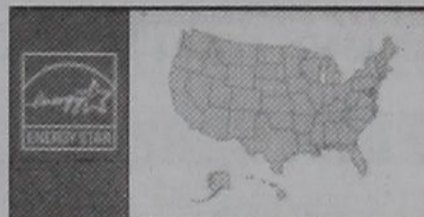

## PARKVIEW ARTERY Electrocution

Do You Know... that each year 3.6 percent of the deaths of youths under age 20 on farms are caused by electrocution? Electrocution is quick and deadly and is one of the most overlooked hazards of farm work. The most common cause of electrocutions are portable grain augers, oversized wagons, large combines, and other tall equipment that come into contact with overhead power lines. Every year 62 farm workers are electrocuted in the United States.

Teen Safety Solutions Be aware that the following types of farm machinery can accidentally brush or get hung up in overhead power lines while in use or being moved:

- Tractors with front-end loaders.
  - Portable grain augers.
  - Fold-up cultivators.
  - Moving grain elevators.
  - Irrigation pipes.
  - Equipment with antennas.
- Watch out for overhead electrical lines. Know where power lines are located.

Treat all overhead power lines as though they are bare and uninsulated.

Keep all equipment away from overhead lines.

Always be aware of where power lines are when:

- Using ladders.
- Harvesting tree crops.
- Moving equipment.
- Always use pre-planned routes that avoid power lines when moving equipment.

Know what to do if equipment you are operating comes in contact with an overhead power line.

Stay on the equipment.

Ask for someone to immediately contact the local utility company to remove the danger.

If there is an emergency such as an electrical fire and you must leave the equipment, jump as far away from the equipment as possible.

Do not allow any part of your body to touch the equipment and the ground at same time.

Shuffle away from where you jumped; do not take large strides. Too large a step could put each foot in a different voltage zone and electrocute you.

Once away from the equipment, never attempt to get back on or even touch it. Many electrocutions occur when the worker dismounts, then gets back on the equipment.

Remember that prevention is the best way to handle emergencies. Respect electricity and avoid contact with overhead lines.

## Choose Your Ride

This year's annual Labor Day Drink, Drive, Go to Jail campaign to prevent drinking and driving will have an emphasis on the importance of choosing not to get behind the wheel if you have been drinking. The "Choose Your Ride" theme features modified patrol cars that have decals making the vehicle look like half a police vehicle and half a taxi cab. In addition to being on billboards and posters, these vehicles will be out on the streets in communities with a high incidence of alcohol-related fatalities. The message is that if you choose to drink, you should call a cab, designate a sober driver ahead of time, use public transportation, stay put, or call a friend or family member for a ride.

The Drink, Drive, Go to Jail campaign runs from August 20 to September 6, 2010. During this time, law enforcement statewide will be working overtime to find and arrest drunk drivers.

Driving drunk is not only dangerous, it can be very expensive. In Texas, if convicted of a first-time DWI, offenders can pay a fine of up to \$2,000, lose their driver's license for up to a year, and serve 180 days in jail. Other costs associated with a drunk-driving arrest and conviction can add up to more than \$17,000 for bail, legal fees, court appearances, court-ordered classes, vehicle insurance increases, and other expenses. Drunk drivers with children younger than 15 in the vehicle face even stiffer penalties. They can be charged with child endangerment and face up to a \$10,000 fine, two years in a state jail, and loss of their driver's license for up to two years.

The real consequences of drunk driving are the senseless deaths and injuries that result from this reckless behavior. Preliminary statistics show that in 2009, there were 27,108 alcohol-related crashes in Texas that resulted in 955 deaths and 17,542 injuries. Data from police crash reports show that in 2008, 28.1 percent of the total traffic fatalities in Texas were caused by drivers under the influence of alcohol. And, 25 percent of people killed in alcohol-related crashes in Texas were between the ages of 20 and 25.

This year, Texans can take a stand to not drink and drive and to keep friends and family from drinking and driving. Remember, choose your ride carefully, and keep Texas roads safe during the upcoming Labor Day weekend. For more information, visit <http://www.texasdwi.org/>.

## PARKVIEW ARTERY BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS FOR STUDENTS AND DRIVERS

With school about to start across WHEELER County, it's time to take a look at safety issues for children either riding school buses or walking to school. Drivers, too, need to exercise caution and pay attention to the rules of the road regarding safety. Safety Tips: For children getting on and off a bus safely:

- Get to the bus stop in plenty of time and have a safe place to wait for your bus, away from traffic and the street
- Always remain in direct eyesight of the bus driver.
- Always follow the driver's directions for how and when to cross the street.
- Be alert to traffic and look both ways.
- Always cross in front of the bus, but only when the bus driver signals it is safe to do so.
- Take 10 giant steps back from the curb while waiting for the bus and 10 steps when exiting the bus.
- When exiting, look before stepping off the bus to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder (side of the road). Move away from the bus.
- Never try to get anything left on the bus after exiting.
- Never reach underneath the bus. For Parents:
  - Supervise children to make sure they get to the stop on time, wait far away from the road and avoid rough play.
  - Teach your child to ask the driver for help if he/she drops something near the bus. If a child bends down to pick up something, the driver cannot see him/her and the child may be hit by the bus. Have your child use a backpack or book bag to keep loose items together.
  - Make sure clothing and backpacks have no loose drawstrings or long straps that could get caught in the handrail or bus door.
  - Encourage safe school bus loading and unloading.
  - If you think a bus stop is in a dangerous place, talk with your school office or with transportation director about changing the location.
- For Drivers:
  - Yellow flashing lights on the bus indicate that it is preparing to stop and load or unload children. This means cars need to slow down and prepare to stop.
  - It is illegal to pass a school bus with its red flashing lights and stop signal arm activated. Vehicles may not pass until the flashing red lights and signals are turned off or when the bus driver motions them through.
  - Vehicles traveling in the same direction as the bus are always required to stop.
  - Unless they are on a divided highway (median where travel is restricted).
  - Never pass on the right side of the bus where children are entering and exiting. This is illegal and can have tragic results! Medcat Accidents hurt - safety doesn't.
