Annual Old Mobeetie Music Festival Set For July 23, 24, 25

This summer's Old Mobeetie Texas Music Festival will be held on July 23, 24 and 25 on the grounds of the Old Mobeetie Jail Museum. Salt Creek will be making a return appearances.

Seven bands will be performing at the festival. The three day festival will be divided into four performances on Friday evening, Saturday and Sunday morning.

Cedar Ridge will kick off the festival on Friday evening, playing from 6:00 to 6:45. With a five minute break between bands, Cedar Ridge will be followed by Triple "L", Short Creek, Salt Grass, Batten Family Band and Star Canyon Band. The Friday performances will end at 10:55. Jam sessions will be found at different locations on the jail park and continue into the evening.

Bill Candler Buried In San Antonio April 1

Born on October 5, 1926 in Greenville, TX and entered into rest on March 27, 2010. Survived by wife of 59 years, Barbara Lynn Candler; sister Nell Candler; numerous cousins; nieces; nephews; great nieces and nephews. Preceded in death by parents, Charles and Nettie Candler, brother Bob Candler.

During college Bill was drafted and served in the U.S. Army. He then went back and graduated from North Texas State University. He was Professor Emeritus at San Antonio College for over 35 years. He served as basketball, tennis, track, golf coach, school nurse, Dept. Chair and Athletic Director during his tenure. In April 1999, the Physical Education Center was renamed the Bill C. Candler Physical Education Center.

Bill was the chairman of the Bexar County Water Safety Committee for the American Red Cross. He also served as Vice President of the Texas Junior College Teachers Association.

Graveside Services were held at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday.

Once again, the Mobeetie Volunteer Fire Department will be running the concession stand, offering a selection of food, sweets, drinks and homemade ice cream.

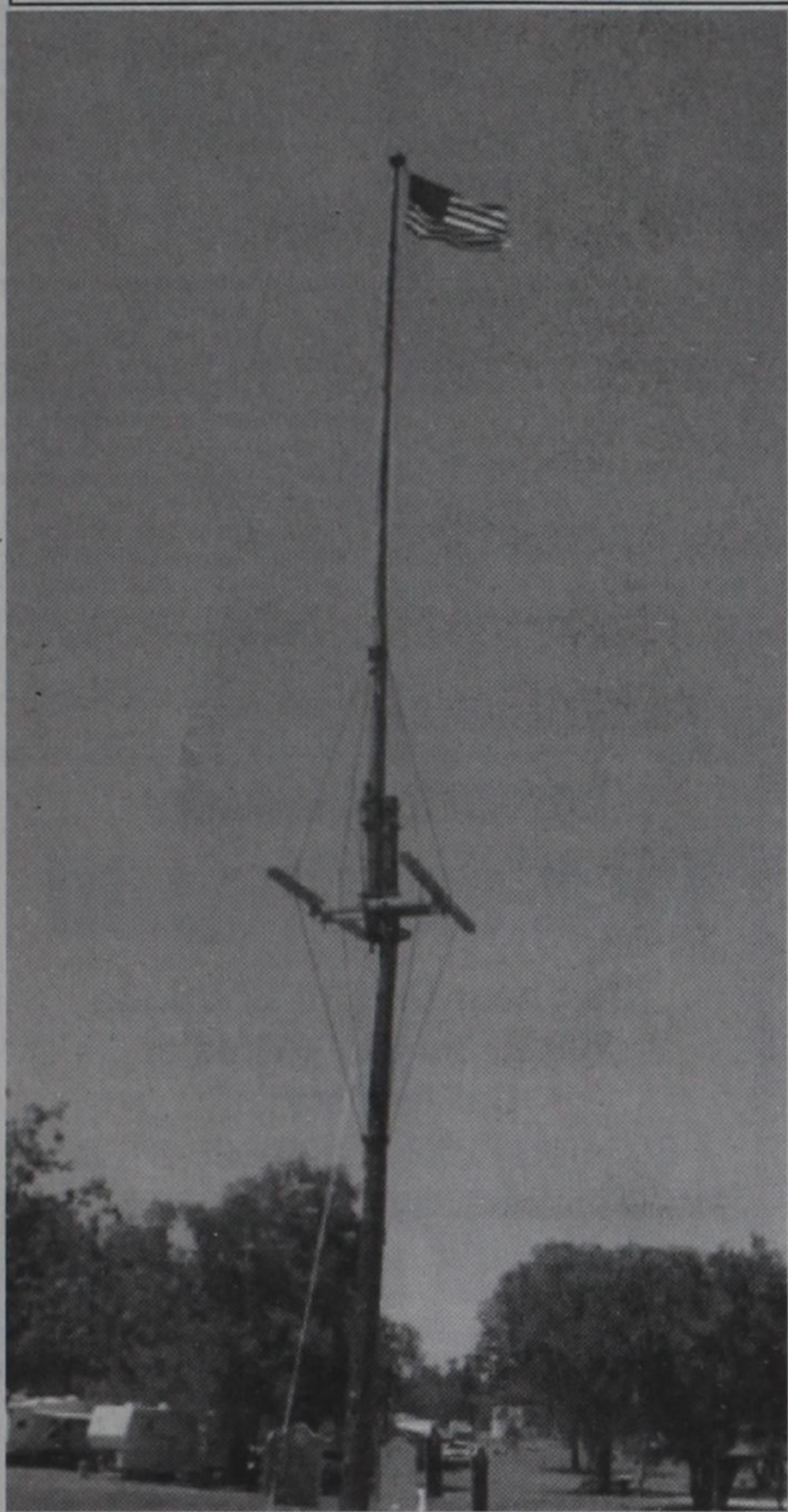
Food and prices will be posted at the concession with homemade ice cream \$1.50 per cup. The concession stand is the fire department's only big fundraiser.

Professor Bill Candler Recalled As College Legend, Influence

(Editor's Note:) This article was taken from The Ranger April 9, 2010 written by Laura Garcia. The name Bill C. Candler should sound familiar. He dedicated 37 years of his life to San Antonio College before many students here were even born. On the way to the gym, students walk past Candler's portrait. The physical education building was named for him in April 1999.

The former physical education chair died March 27 at 83.

President Robert Zeigler calls him one of the college's pioneers. "He was one of the people who kind of made the school," he said during a telephone interview March 30.

Candler not only built the physical education program, Zeigler said, but he was responsible for creating the college's atmosphere.

Zeigler said he felt it was appropriate that the family chose the college to hold the memorial service because Candler made a huge contribution to the college's history.

Speakers at the memorial included Zeigler and Candler's former students and co-workers.

A memorial service in the auditorium of McCreless Hall followed the burial at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery April 1.

The service began with Candler's niece, Bobbie Lynn Candler, singing "Amazing Grace" followed by a "Welcome from Zeigler."

"Bill's spirit will live on through all the students who pass through SAC on their way to bigger and better things," Zeigler said during the memorial.

Friends and family along with college administrators and employees current and retired made their way after the service to Room 126 of Candler Physical Education Center for a reception.

Nearly 100 guests packed the room as a slideshow shown on a back wall slipped through photos of Candler. Coffee and cakes were served during the reception.

Kinesiology Chair Bill Richardson worked with Candler for about 10 years and described him as a great boss and a low-key kind of guy.

During the memorial, he reminisced about "the man" visiting the department with a can of popcorn.

Richardson said in the time that Candler was there, he hired good people and set a precedent for updating the program and introducing new equipment as funds became available.

"As times changed, the department was always poised to keep up with trends," he said during the memorial.

"We're a part of his legacy; he deserves a lot of credit,"

Richardson said.

Candler said during the dedication, "It's been a great career and this is a great honor."

In 1949 before the college moved to its current location, Candler was the 20th faculty member hired and he helped build many of the programs and facilities that exist today.

He is recognized as a professor emeritus and served as a basketball, tennis, track and golf coach, school nurse, department chair and athletic director.

Former colleagues Dean Fox and Lewis Fox knew Candler when they were students at this college with their brother John.

Dean Fox and Lewis Fox both returned to San Antonio College to teach after graduating from the University of Texas in Austin.

Lewis Fox taught at this college for 37 years and was an economics chair for 22 years. Dean Fox, who was elected kinesiology chair after Candler retired, worked for Candler in the physical education department.

Dean Fox remembers Candler was his track coach during his freshman year and described him as a jack-of-all-trades who taught math in addition to physical education classes for a full-course load.

"He was a person who respected you and you had to respect him," Dean Fox said during the memorial.

Candler was president in 1970-71 of Texas Community College Teachers Association, then called Texas Junior College Teachers Association. Dean Fox said it was fairly unusual for a physical education instructor to become president of the association.

"He loved to tell jokes. Nobody could top him," Dean Fox said. He added that they were always clean and he never heard him say a curse word.

Dr. Jerome Weynand, former college president and district chancellor, called Candler "friendly, honest and trustwor-

thy to the core."

Weynand was a past president of San Antonio Union Junior College District, which included San Antonio College and St. Philip's College.

"Bill never smoked, drank or cursed. He tried to be a role model," he said. Weynand added that Candler made such an impression that many of his students came back to work with him at the College.

Lewis Fox said, "He's a wonderful guy. Bright and friendly."

Candler was also chairman of the Bexar County Water Safety Committee for the American Red Cross and president of the Retired Teachers Association.

Candler was born Oct. 5, 1926, in Greenville. During college, Candler was drafted and served in the U.S. Army. After his separation, he returned and graduated from North Texas State University.

He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Barbara Lynn Candler, and sister Nell Candler of Dallas.

In lieu of flowers, Candler's family requested that donations be made to the Alamo Community College District Foundation.

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

GOING TO TOWN ON SATURDAY NIGHT

There was always a lot more involved in "going to town on Saturday night," than simply, going to town...

As most kids, we all looked forward to 'Saturday night' the whole week. We knew most of our friends would be there. If it was summer time and you hadn't seen or talked to them since the last Saturday, it was almost madness trying to get caught up. Kind of a mini-reunion, once a week. Our mouths wouldn't slow down and neither would our feet.

Weaving in and out between the grown ups on the side walks was a challenge in itself. Occasionally, one of us would accidentally bump into someone and get told to slow down. We would... for a few minutes, but those words were soon forgotten and we'd be on the run again.

Now, you understand... you don't go to town casually. This is serious business! First, were the baths we all had to take. This too, was not as simple as it sounds. Mom, would spend a lot of time just heating water on top of the stove. The galvanized, round tub was set on the floor in my bedroom and it would be filled about one-third up (only one time) with a little more hot water added after each person got out.

Needless to say, Mom had first "dibs" on the tub. Next, on the seniority list was Dad, then me. My little brother was about two at the time and was last.

I sure was glad when we got rid of that round tub and got an oval one. Wow, now you could let your knees down and straighten your legs out. After all the bathing was finished, we'd drag the tub out back and empty it on the grass. We usually left for town shortly before dark.

Mom had a place she especially liked to park. This spot was right in front of Levi Reid's barber shop, just south of the Corner Drug. My grandma and aunts, would sit in

the car with her. The men would sit on the window sills of the businesses, or lean against the brick wall with one foot on the sidewalk and the opposite leg bent and that foot pressed against the brick wall. A lot of visiting, chewing and smoking, would go on.

The kids all headed for the "picture show," usually with a quarter to spend. That was an adequate allowance at the time. It cost fourteen cents to get in the theater if you were under twelve years old (we all stayed twelve for about two or three years) and this left you enough money to get a sack of popcorn, a small drink and have a penny left over.

The movies were usually cowboy shows, with Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, Gene Autry, Hopalong Cassidy, Randolph Scott and several others. After the main show there was a comedy and for a while, a serial called, "The Phantom." Even one called, "Jungle Jim." I think we all identified with most of the cowboys. However, movies of "Tarzan" were a big hit and most of us at one time, or another, did our own version of the Tarzan 'call.'

In the fall, Wheeler, along with most small towns around us, would have people, elbow-to-elbow, on Saturday night. Fall was dull-pulling time and it was all done by hand then, unlike now. Lots of families would appear, it seemed like overnight, to pull boll's. I was never sure where all these folks lived, or where the kids went to school...?

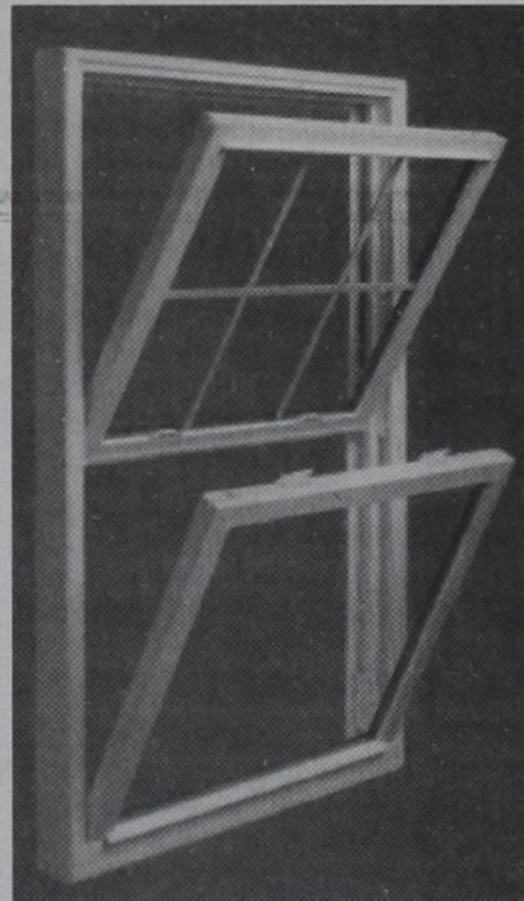

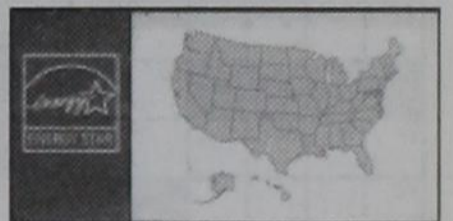
