

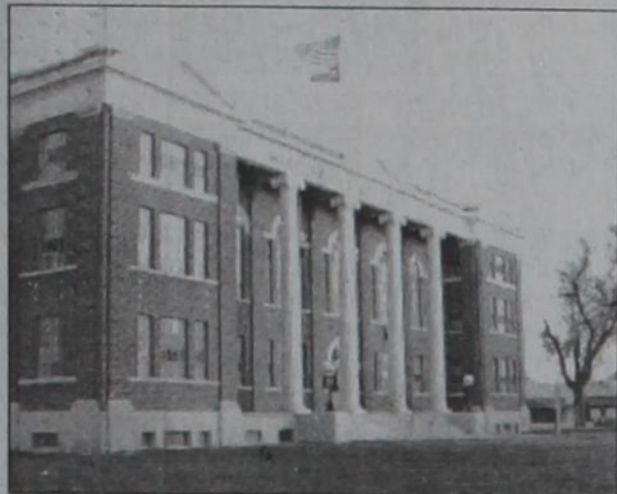

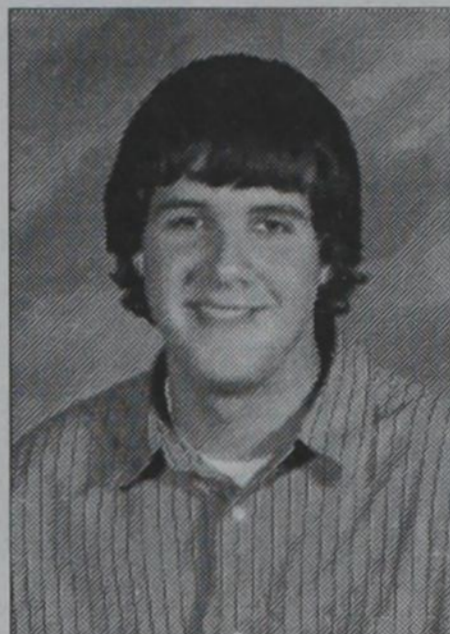

Wheeler Is Ready To Tell Its Story

Wheeler can have a museum that will tell the story of the people who built the community and the county. Like many other small towns, Wheeler has a group of individuals dedicated to telling the story of these real people and real places. These are the real stories of the founders of the city, the pioneers of the community, the veterans of WWI and WWII and later wars and conflicts, Law Enforcement and Firemen.

The group interested in preserving the history of Wheeler is the Wheeler Centennial Historical Association, Inc. "WCHA" WCHA was formed in July of 2005 during the Centennial Celebration of Wheeler. An application was filed with the Internal Revenue Service for 501(c)(3) or non-profit status. Non-profit status was granted on March 3, 2009 and was back dated to July 6, 2005. The purpose of the organization is to preserve, protect, interpret and educate the public about the history of Wheeler, Texas and the surrounding area including its culture, natural resources, streets, structures and objects and will endeavor to include the public in its educational projects.

The WCHA has identified the West-Passion Post of the American Legion owned by the Wheeler Independent School District as the location for the museum. The American Legion is of significant historical interest since it is nearly 70 years old, built by the veterans returning from WWII, the land was given to the veterans by Dr.

A fundraiser to benefit victims of the fire and project graduation is planned for Tuesday, April 28, 2009, at the Wheeler school cafeteria. The event is sponsored by the Wheeler High School National Honor Society, Student Council, FFA and FCCLA.

The Meal/Meat Pile-On will be served from 5:00 – 6:30 p.m. Donations will be taken. There will also be a silent auction.

Following the benefit the Wheeler Seniors will play the Teachers with the admission set at \$3.00 per person. The cheerleaders and Mighty will hold cake auctions.

At halftime the Firefighters, EMS and local Law Enforcement will be recognized.

H. E. Nicholson who also donated the land for Nicholson Field, it is eligible for designation on the National Register of Historic Places, it is listed as a potential WWII site by the Texas Historical Commission World War II Program because of its hardwood floor built from the hardwood floor at the Prisoner of War Camp McLean and because the post was named for 1st Lieutenant James P. Passons, a Wheeler high school graduate and a member of the First Battalion of the Twenty-ninth Marines who died a hero when he was killed on the island of Saipan, June 23, 1944 in WWII.

Because the original purpose of the building was a home for the American Legion, the first focus of the museum will be on the World War II Veterans of Wheeler County as well as earlier and later veterans of the United States wars and actions. The photographs of all county WWII veterans have been collected and stories of the veterans will be told so that the public can learn and celebrate these men and women. There are hundreds of untold stories about these men and women.

Law enforcement men and women also have great stories to be told. Volunteer fire fighters will also be recognized and honored. These men and women are civilian heroes. Their stories need to be documented and told. Some work has been completed on the civilian heroes, but more work needs to be completed.

Rangeland Recovery Help Available Thru Texas NRCS

April 15, 2009— High winds, low humidity and prolonged drought conditions led to the recent wildfires in Wheeler County where landowners may be faced with making plans for possible rangeland recovery.

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Assistant State Conservationist Mickey Black said, "NRCS in Texas is prepared to assist landowners with their efforts to address wind erosion that is continuing to occur due to drought and the effects from wildfires."

"Landowners impacted by recent wildfires are encouraged to contact their local USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) district conservationist." The NRCS provides technical, and in some cases, financial assistance, to install measures that reduce post-fire damage and aid in the rehabilitation process.

Landowners can apply for possible financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) for range defoliation of all livestock grazing throughout the growing season, plant health concerns, and cross fencing assistance.

Black said, "We want to provide assistance that will enable landowners and livestock producers to accelerate the recovery of the health and vigor of affected grazing land."

He suggests landowners consult with their local NRCS district conservationist to develop a conservation plan, which can be an effective strategy for pasture and rangeland recovery and mitigating the effects of the prolonged drought Texas is experiencing.

Wildlife habitat can also be impacted by the wildfire and NRCS can provide technical and financial assistance in re-establishing the habitats for desired species.

In order to apply, landowners must visit the NRCS office in Wheeler County to fill out an application. Applications will be ranked and those approved for funding will be offered an EQIP contract.
