Shai Dougherty Wins First In State

Shai Dougherty, an art student of Mrs. Harless at Kelton, took top honors in the state Visual Arts Scholastic Event held April 8-9, 2011 at Houston.

Shai Dougherty is a member of a very elite and distinguished group of young artists. She received a VASE medallion because she received a Superior Rating (IV). Statewide more than 24,000 students participated in the 25 regional VASE events. There were 1,195 state qualifiers that came to Houston, TX and only the top 5% received a Superior Rating (IV). She is in the top 5% in the whole state of Texas.

The mission of the TAEA Visual Arts Scholastic Event (VASE) is to recognize exemplary student achievement in the Visual Arts by providing art students and programs a standard of excellence in which to achieve.

The original state qualified artwork is held by the Regional Director and transported to the state event. Students are not interviewed at the State Event. A panel of jurors evaluates each state entry to determine the degree that each work demonstrates originality of concept, technical expertise, understanding of the TEKS, and the interpretation of the student's stated intent. The state jury panel evaluates qualified artwork using a numeric rating system based on an established state rubric. Artworks receiving a Superior Rating (IV) are awarded the State VASE medallion.

Shai is a freshman at Kelton ISD and is an Art I student. Shai is among the best in TEXAS! She advanced to state and then competed at the state level and won. Congratulations Shai for your outstanding achievement!

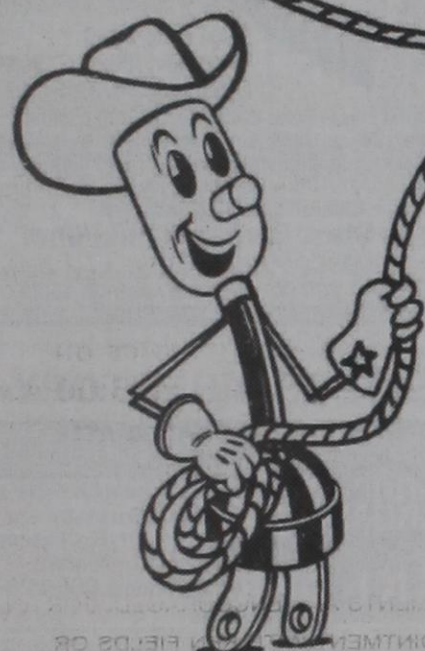

Vitamin D: The New Guidelines

Can supplementing the diet with vitamin D prevent the development of certain chronic diseases? Researchers have known for many years that vitamin D intake promotes good bone health by helping our bodies to absorb calcium, but they are now thinking that it may have a protective effect against developing diabetes, cancer, heart disease and metabolic syndrome (high blood cholesterol and triglycerides, high blood glucose, increased waist size and high blood pressure, which is a risk factor in developing type 2 diabetes). In addition, research suggests that vitamin D intake helps maintain a healthy immune system.

dihydroxycholecalciferol, with help from the sun's UVB rays. Unfortunately, the UVB rays are the same rays that cause sunburn and skin damage; however, the body can make adequate amounts of vitamin D from limited sun exposure — 5 to 15 minutes in the sun without sunscreen 2 to 3 times per week.

Because of the benefits of vitamin D intake, the recommended dietary allowance (RDA) of vitamin D has been increased for all age groups. The new guidelines are as follows:

- Infants — 12 months: 400 IU/day
- 1 year — 70 years: 600 IU/day
- 71+ years: 800 IU/day

International Unit. 40 IU = 1 microgram vitamin D. Some researchers suggest an intake for adults as high as 1,000 — 4,000 IU/day. However, when intake exceeds 10,000 IU/day, a significant risk for vitamin D toxicity is present. Maintaining an adequate intake of vitamin D should keep blood levels up past the recommended 30 nanograms/ milliliter (ng/ml). Although no current standard for determining vitamin D deficiency exists, most health experts agree that levels below 30 ng/ml are insufficient.

The take-home message for vitamin D intake is as follows: Americans should be encouraged to increase time spent outdoors in the sunlight (which shouldn't be difficult with the summer Texas sun!) and eat foods high in vitamin D to obtain the health benefits of adequate vitamin D intake!

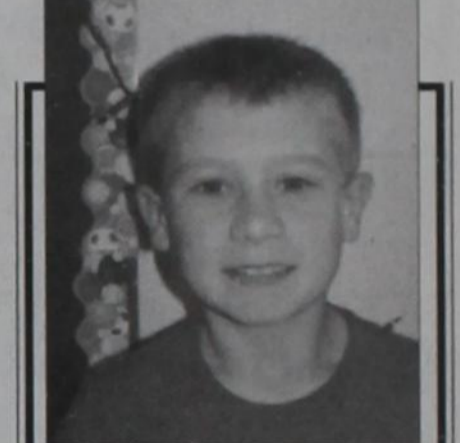

What is an Electronic Record?
An electronic health record (EHR) or electronic medical record (EMR) is nothing but a medical record of a patient in digital form. The digital information is usually stored in a database and is accessible from everywhere via a network. A patient's medical information is normally recorded on paper written in a patient's record at every doctor's office the patient has visited or in the medical chart hanging at the foot of a patient's hospital bed. We all know it is a long journey, but when we reach the destination, physicians and caregivers across the continuum of care will be able to simultaneously review and collaborate on the entire spectrum of information available about a given patient—resulting in informed clinical decisions, and a higher quality of care at a lower cost.

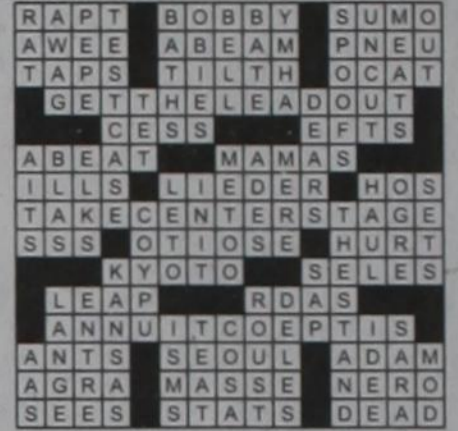
