







The mission of the TAEA Visual Arts Scholastic Event (VASÉ) is to recognize exemplary student achievement in the Visual Arts by providing art students and programs a standard of excellence in which to achieve. The original state qualified artwork is held by the Regional Director and transported to the state

event. Students are not interviewed at the State Event. A panel of jurors evaluates each state entry to determine the degree that each work demonstrates originality of concept, technical expertise, understanding of the TEKS, and the interpretation of the student's stated intent. The state jury panel evaluates qualified artwork using a numeric rating system based on an established state rubric. Artworks receiving a Superior Rating (IV) are awarded the State VASE

Shai Dougherty is a member of a very elite and distinguished group of young artists. She received a VASE medallion because she received a Superior Rating (IV). Statewide more than 24,000 students participated in the 25 regional VASE events. There were 1,195 state qualifiers that came to Houston, TX and only the top 5% received a Superior Rating (IV). She is in the

Keep Baby Rear-Facing If Possible

seat experts what is the safest seat for their baby. Truth be told, it is not the brand of seat they purchase but the direction they will save their child's life. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) just came out with a new policy statement on child safety seats. This new statement clearly recommends that children stay rear-facing until age two or more for the best crash protection. The reasoning behind this recommendation is that rear-facing child safety seats support the head, neck, and spine of infants and toddlers and distribute crash forces at the harnesses. A 2007 study in

Parents often ask child safety showed that children are five times safer when riding rear-facing rather than forward-facing up

to age two or more. Age one is often considered by face the seat in their vehicle that parents as a milestone that means time to turn your baby forward-facing. However, this has always represented just a bare minimum - at least one year and 20 pounds. But this bare minimum is not best practice and will not keep a baby from suffering a broken neck or spine in a crash. Many parents are concerned that their child will be unhappy or uncomfortable staying in a rear-facing position. It is important to know that children's joints are not fully formed until over the entire body rather than they are older. Sitting crossthe journal Injury Prevention small child. more rare in rear-facing children than in a forward-facing one.

It is also important to note that as a child progresses to the next step of child safety seat they are actually being demoted in terms of the safety provided by that seat. Children should stay in the rearfacing infant seat until they outgrow the weight and height limit of that seat and then move to a rear-facing convertible seat until they reach the rear-facing limit of that seat. For most convertibles, that limit is 35 pounds, but now there are several that go to 40 pounds rear-facing and one that goes to 45 pounds in the rear-facing mode. The rear-facing child will always be the safest occupant

in the vehicle. AAP recommends that parents legged is not uncomfortable for a not be too quick to transition chil-

children in harness seats as long as possible to the limit of the seat. Parents should not be anxious to move older children to booster seats; instead, keep them in a forward-facing harness seat to the limit of that seat. Please see below for AAP's recommendation to maximize protection for children

when traveling in motor vehicles. Among child passengers under age 5, child restraints saved the lives of an estimated 309 children in 2009 alone. From 1975 through 2009, restraints (child safety seats or adult seat belts) are credited with saving the lives of 9,310 children. For a child safety seat to do its job right, it has to be appropriate for your child's age and size, installed properly in your vehicle, and adjusted to fit your child securely. Unfortunately, most child safety seats are not used cor-

rectly. The best-way to make sure securely restrained in the back your child is protected is to have a free inspection by a certified child passenger safety technician in your area.

TxDOT Approves Super-Heavy Permits

Three long-haul rigs, each loaded with a transformer, are TxDOT Houston

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) approved super-heavy permits for a Texas company to haul the loads at gross vehicle weights of 510,000, 430,000 and 420,000 pounds. The transformers are headed to Japan to aid in disaster relief in the aftermath of a destructive earthquake and tsunami.

Twenty feet wide and 197 feet long, the super-heavy loads will leave Sweetwater early Wednesday morning and travel south along Texas highways to the final port destination. They will then be offloaded onto a vessel and shipped to Japan.






