Farmers' Market To Open On The Square Wed., July 6

The Wheeler County Farmers' Market is set to kick-off on Wednesday, July 6th and on Saturday, July 9th at the courthouse in Wheeler. Wednesday markets are from 4 to 6 pm on the east side of the courthouse and Saturday markets are from 9 to 11 am on the West side of the courthouse (We follow the shade). Despite the exceptional drought that the Panhandle is experiencing and the extreme heat and wind, We are still getting in our gardens although We are having to water constantly. In talking to the growers, there promises to be a good crop of peaches, apples, pecans, green beans, tomatoes, peppers, squash, cucumbers, okra, peas, corn, melons, etc.

The market is open to any grower in Wheeler County with fresh fruits and vegetables that

are locally grown. We do not allow out-of-county produce such as Colorado peaches, Oklahoma watermelons, etc. We would encourage any gardener to bring his produce including fresh eggs, nuts, honey, baked goods, canned goods, etc. and each vendor is responsible for bringing his own table, chairs, and bags/sacks, and he tends to his own sales and money. Mayor, Bob McCain called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Walter Simmons motioned to approve the May minutes as presented. Don Rose seconded and the motion carried with 5 in favor and 0 against.

Don Rose motioned to approve payment of the bills presented. Barbra Koelzer seconded. Motion carried with 5 in favor and 0 against.

Mike Reams and Steve Alexander, with Blue Knight Energy Partners, presented a proposal of their interest in leasing 8

acres the City has available east of town, to build a new location of their trucking company. They have about 20 trucks hauling crude oil, condensate, and salt water in our area and need enough land for their trucks and a building that will be secured with a fence and locking gate.

Paul Arganbright reported monthly activities of the city maintenance dept.

Don Rose motioned to advertise in the Wheeler Times for bank depository. Barbra seconded the motion and all 5 directors voted in favor with 0 against.

Barbra Koelzer motioned to appoint Mark Brown, J.P. as the Municipal Court Judge. Stacy McCasland seconded with 5 voting in favor of and 0 against.

Crystal McEntire addressed the council with her intentions of building a new pharmacy. She had made a presentation to the E.D.C. and was asked to be present to answer any questions the Council members might have.

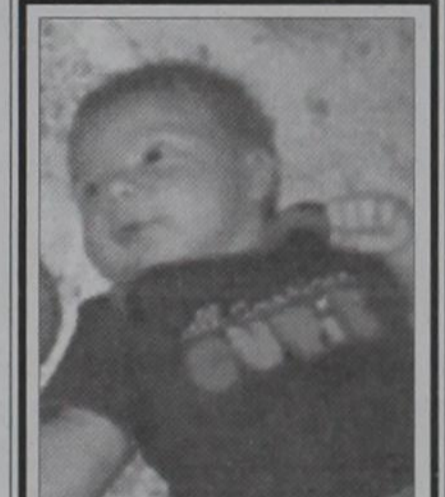

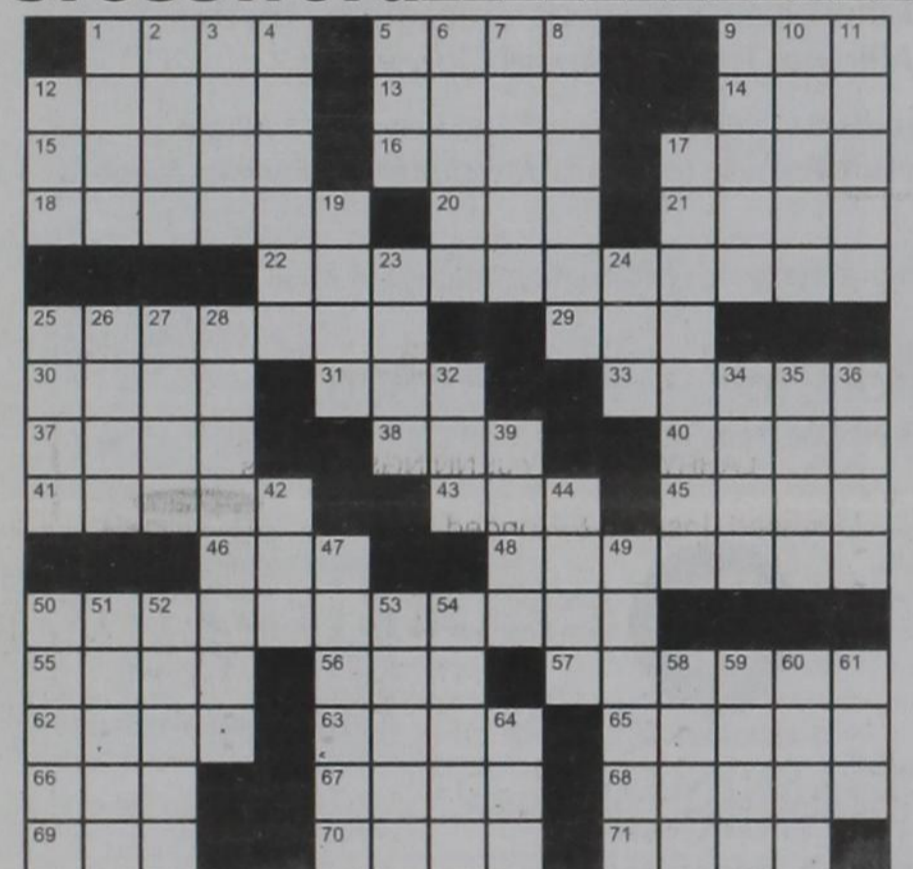

REAL HOLLYWOOD HEROES

New Red River Bridge Is Open For Traffic

A new 1251 1/2-foot bridge over the North Fork of Red River was opened to traffic at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, June 27, by L. Clyde Drake, resident engineer of the Texas Highway Department.

This project, which included widening and paving 3.026 miles of U.S. Highway 83, had been under construction since last October 16. Work on the \$573,603 project was done by Givin-Terril, Inc., Amarillo.

The new bridge is located approximately 100 yards east of the old structure. It is the first bridge in the Texas Panhandle built with pre-stressed concrete beams, a relatively new process, said Engineer Drake, who was in charge of the project.

The three miles of new pavement begins at Roundup Creek and extends to the south end of the new bridge and from the north end of the bridge northward.

The latter strip of pavement eliminates the curve on the hill immediately north of the bridge and cuts down the steep grade still further north.

A truck lane was constructed on the hill so that heavier motor vehicles can pull out of the way of the faster traffic.

Are you fatigued by your computer screen?

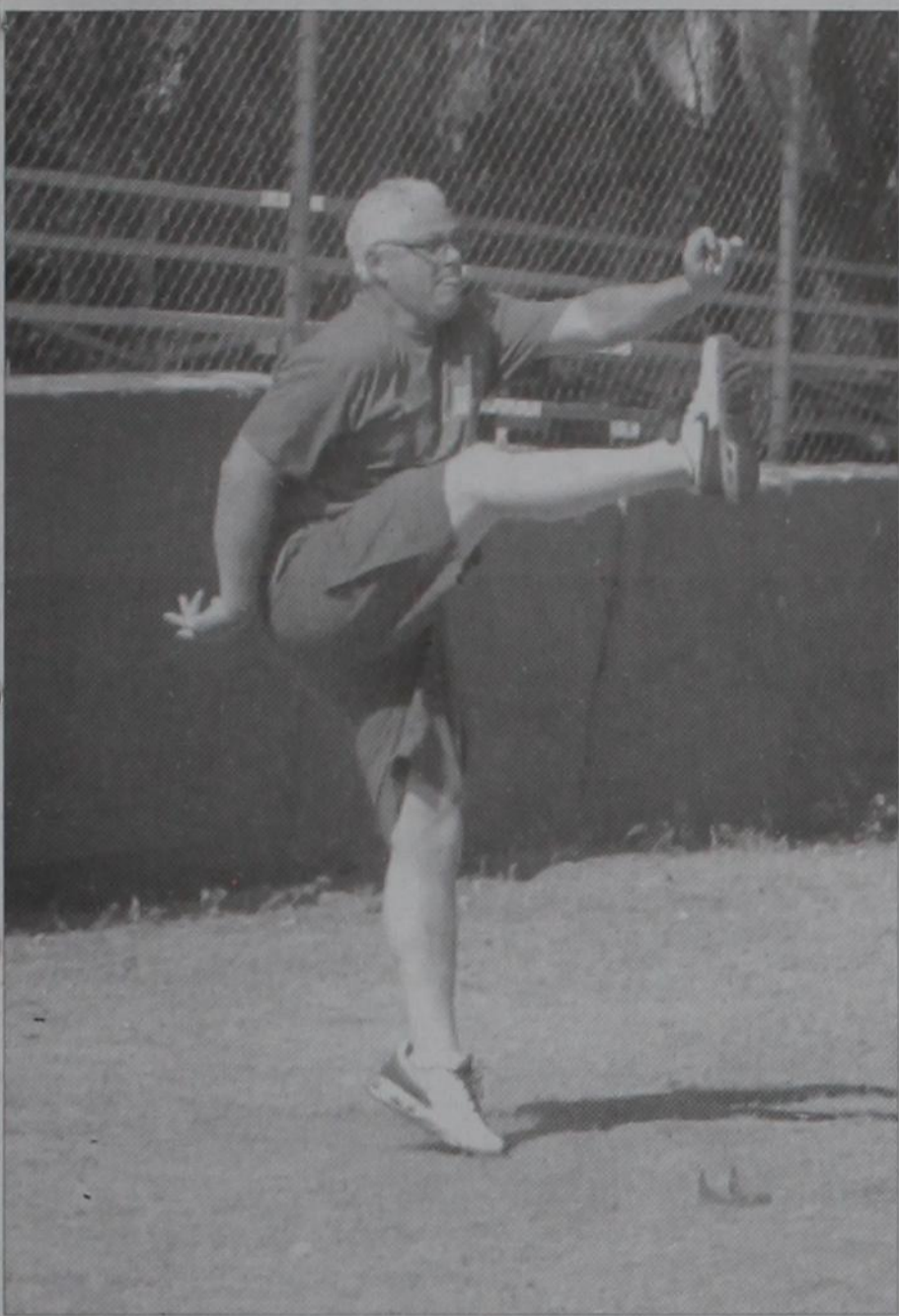

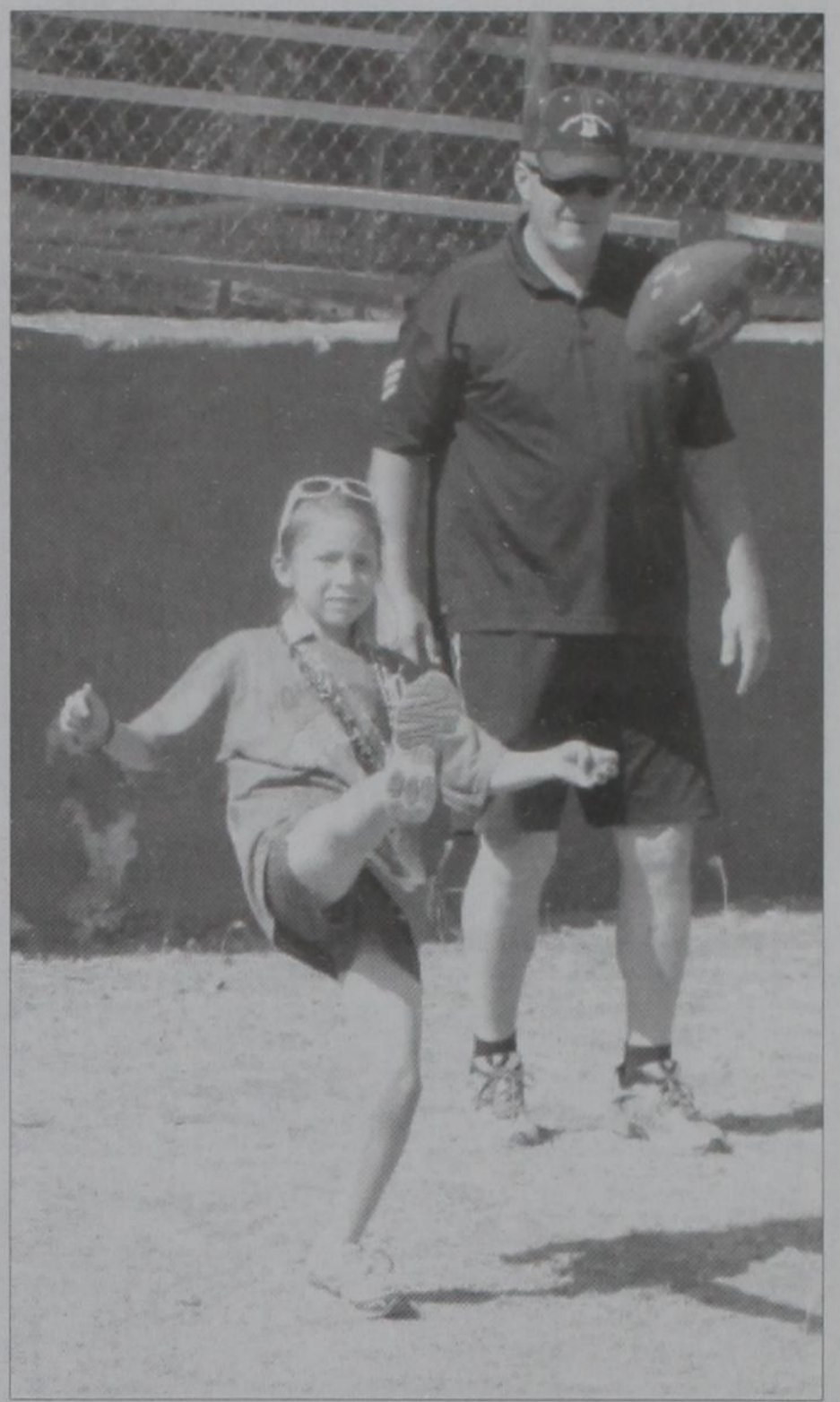

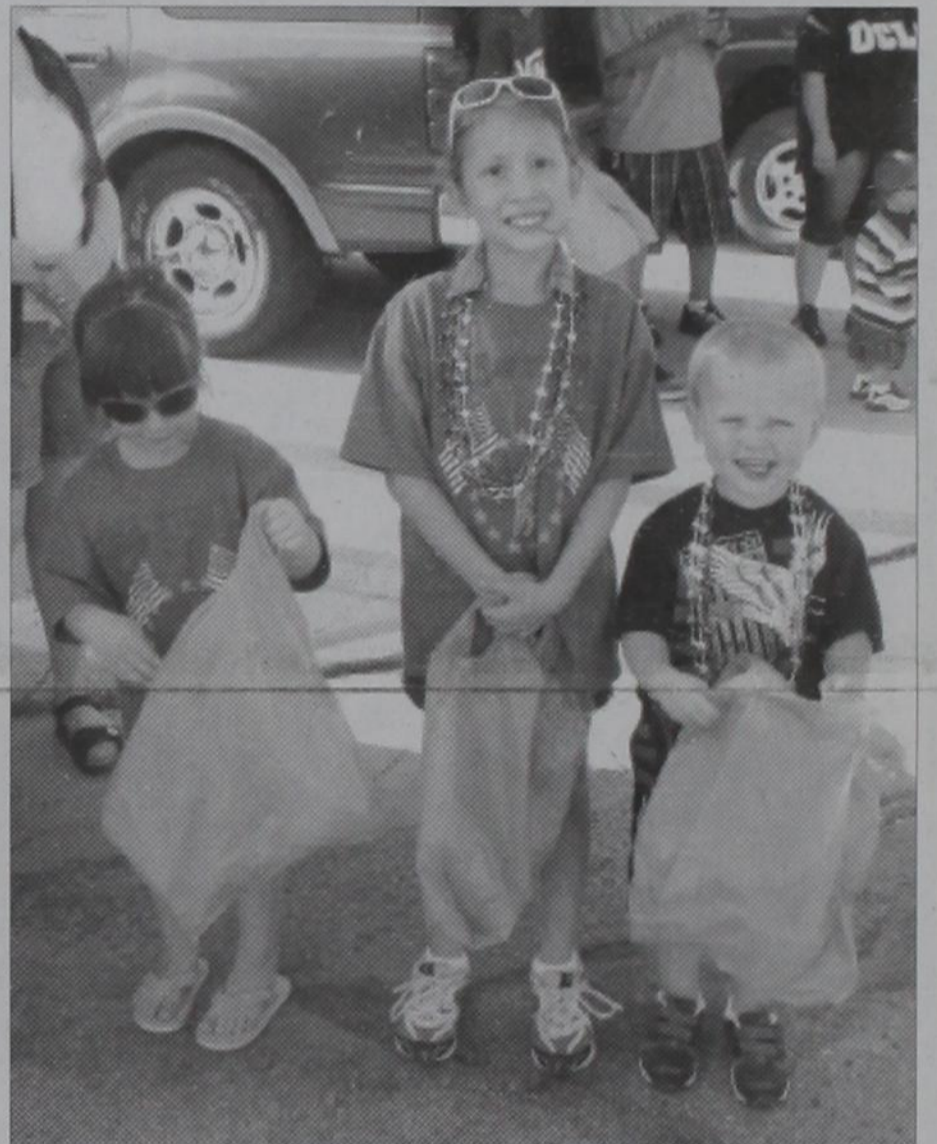

Uncle Glenn (Meriwether) took Jaeden and me outside to catch bugs. Now I miss him. I love him to take me to catch bugs.

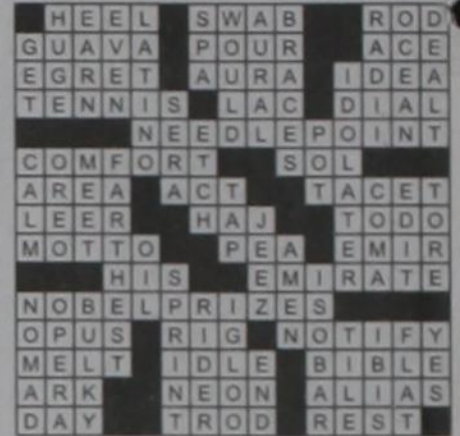
Baba made macaroni and cheese and chocolate chip cookies for Seth and me. Pop made the ice cream.
