Wheeler's 26th Annual 4th of July Celebration will be held Saturday, July 2, 2011. Since it's beginning in 1975, the activities have been held on the 4th, except when the 4th fell on Sunday. (July 4, 2010, was on Sunday and the festivities at the park were held on July 3). As in the past the fun begins with the Fun Run/Walk and ends with the street dance on the square.

For the first time in its 26 year history, there will be no fireworks at dusk at the park. This is due to the ban on fireworks statewide. Wheeler has received less than 0.2" rain all year.

Enogex Gas Gathering, LLC, was given permission to bore under CR "22" and CR "I" for installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

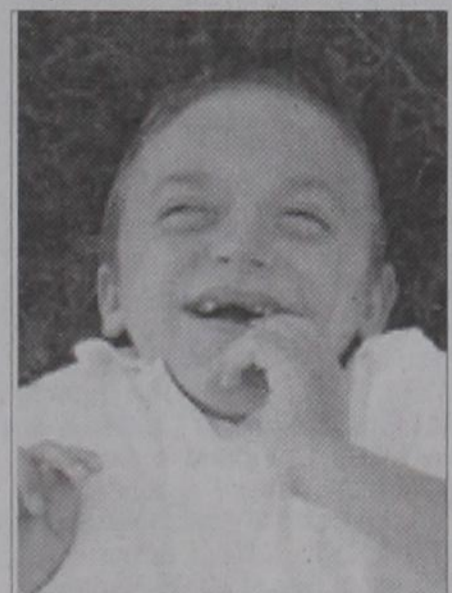

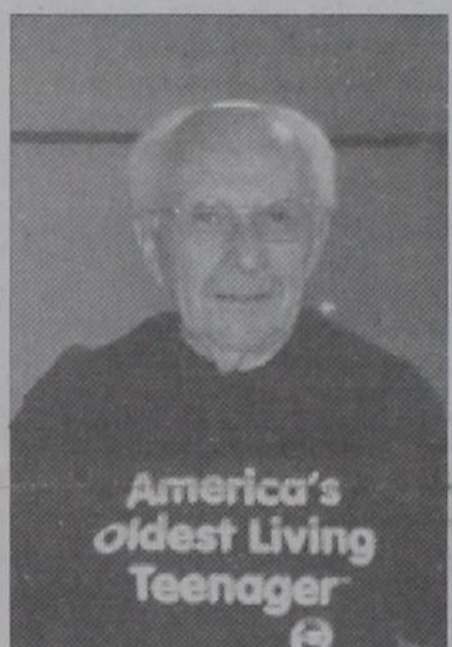
The meeting was called to order by Chairman Helton at 6:00 p.m.

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

FIRST CONSTRUCTION JOB

For part of the summer, between my sophomore and junior years, I managed to get a job help-

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ing widen two bridges. One was the bridge over Sweetwater Creek, just west of Mobeetie, on highway 152. The other one was just east of there about two miles. I think that right-off, they recognized my potential; and fulfilled their requirements. They needed a guy who was young, not overly smart, and willing to work really hard for not much money.

I thought this job was going to be great, getting away from the cotton patch and finally make some real money. The first task they gave me was to take a jackhammer that weighed about the same as I did, and cut off the edges of the bridges. In order to cut off the concrete railing on the edge, I'd have to hold the jackhammer up with my leg. Pretty often, it'd bounce over the edge and almost yank me over the side. It was about fifteen feet down to the creek, so I didn't want to fall off.

It took me two weeks, ten hours a day, six days a week, to get the edges cut off, so they could tie on to the old steel rebar. Every morning for the first week, my hands were so swelled and sore, it would take about an hour for them to loosen up. By the time I got all the edges cut off, I'd just about got-

ten used to the jackhammer. After that, the work became a lot easier; just helping the carpenters with the concrete forms. Finally, with the forms all set and braced up, it came time to pour the cement. When the cement was all poured and smoothed over, they laid some thick blankets over the fresh concrete and wet them with water from the creek. This chore became my "new" job.

The first thing every morning and just before quitting time, I'd make about ten trips down to the creek, fill two, five-gallon buckets with water, carry them back up the dirt bank and throw the water on the blankets. This went on every day for a week, to give the concrete time to cure out slowly, then we removed the blankets.

There would be a few places on the new edge railing that had some "honeycomb" which were little voids created by air that had been "trapped" in the pour. One of the men (who farmed near Mobeetie) was also part of the bridge crew. He was a good concrete finisher as well. He mixed up some cement grout and was rubbing it into the honeycombed spots to smooth them up. We had been working for about two hours and Hiram hadn't said three words all morning. He just wasn't much of a talker. In the distance we heard a car coming toward us. For some reason, the lady kind of panicked when she saw us. She hit her brakes just before getting to the bridge and there was some gravel there. The car started "fish-tailing" and was headed right toward us. I didn't know what Hiram thought, but I was thinking seriously about jumping off the bridge; but knew it'd brake my legs. In that same moment, she got the car straightened up and went on by. Hiram looked up at me and said, "She purt-near got us, didn't she?" Then he went on back to work and didn't say anything else until dinner time.

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WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating declaration of a state of disaster continue to exist; and WHEREAS, 418.10(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a local state of disaster May not be continued for a period of excess of seven days without the consent of the governing Body of the political subdivision: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF Wheeler, Texas:

1. That the state of disaster proclaimed for the imminent threat of wildfires by the Mayor on January 10th, 2011 shall continue until terminated by order of the CITY COUNCIL.
2. The ordinance is passed as an emergency measure and pursuant to local Authority for emergency measures and shall become effective on the 10th day of January, 2011.
3. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure to prevent sales, possession, use, and public displays of fire works in the city limits.

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Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.

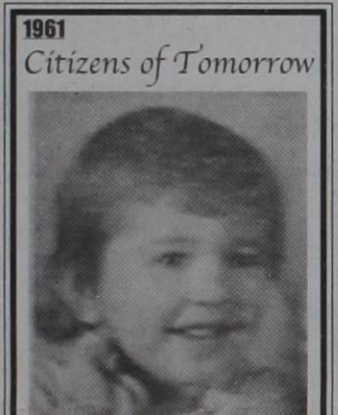

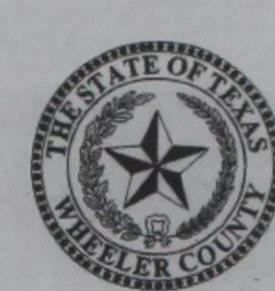

DECLARATION OF DISASTER AND ORDER PROHIBITING THE SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS IN WHEELER COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, Wheeler County has not had rainfall for an extended period of time, creating hot and dry conditions; and

WHEREAS, the hot and dry conditions pose the threat of large, dangerous and fast moving wildfires; and

WHEREAS, such fires have the potential of endangering lives and damaging property on a large scale; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Government Code, Chapter 418, gives the County Judge the power to declare a local disaster within the county "if the threat of disaster is imminent"; and

WHEREAS, the magnitude of the potential damage and the rapidity with which such a fire could escalate to major proportions constitute an imminent threat of disaster; and

WHEREAS, declaration of such disaster authorizes the imposition of controls on activities which tend to increase the likelihood of fires; and

WHEREAS, such controls, once implemented, have the potential of protecting lives and property by mitigating the threat of dangerous fires; and

WHEREAS, a declaration issued under Section 418.108 of the Texas Government Code may include a prohibition or restriction on the sale or use of all fireworks within the County; and

WHEREAS, a local disaster declaration expires seven days after its issuance, unless the Commissioners' Court consents to its renewal or continuance; and

WHEREAS, to the extent that a declaration includes a provision related to fireworks, any portion of the provision that exceeds the restrictions authorized by Texas Local Government Code §352.051 is effective only for 60 hours, unless the County Judge requests and the Governor authorizes an extension of the broader fireworks restriction.

BE IT THEREFORE PROCLAIMED that I, Jerry Dan Hefley, County Judge of Wheeler County, do hereby declare a local State of Disaster based on the threat of large wildfires in Wheeler County, Texas.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that this State of Disaster will continue until rescinded in accordance with the above cited statute, but in no instance will this declaration continue for more than seven days without being authorized by the County Commissioners' Court, or in the event the declaration pertains to fireworks, no more than 60 hours unless an extension of the restriction on fireworks has been received from the Governor of the State of Texas.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that the sale and use of all fireworks is prohibited in Wheeler County, Texas for the duration of this Declaration.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, and the sale and use of all fireworks, which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

This declaration shall be promptly publicized and filed with the County Clerk.

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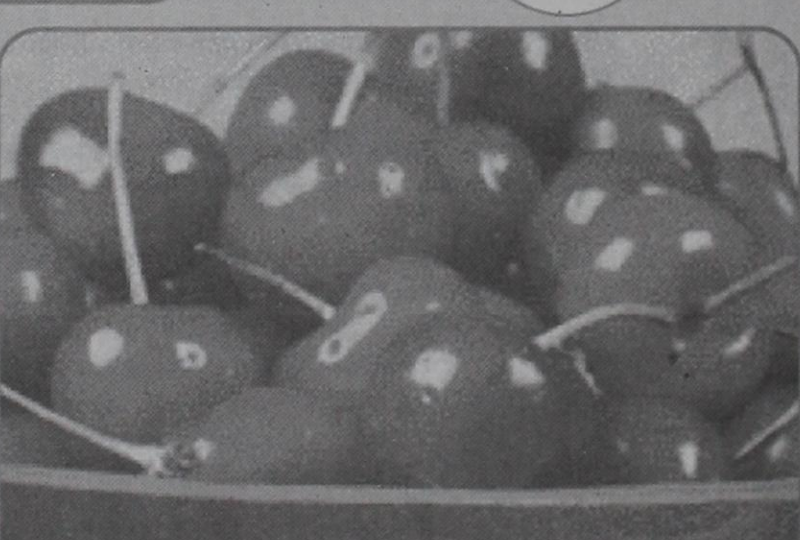
