

Wheat Harvest Begins 20 Bushels Expected

The wheat harvest in Wheeler County is underway and about 63 percent of all the wheat has already been cut according to Cecil Richerson, owner of the Richerson Grain Company.

Our neighbors to the north are not nearly so far along however they are in full swing.

Richerson estimated the average yield of Wheeler County wheat at 20 bushels per acre with testa running about 60 with a moisture content of 12-14.



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

DECLARATION OF DISASTER AND ORDER PROHIBITING THE SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS IN WHEELER COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, Wheeler County has not had rainfall for an extended period of time, creating hot and dry conditions; and

WHEREAS, the hot and dry conditions pose the threat of large, dangerous and fast moving wildfires; and

WHEREAS, such fires have the potential of endangering lives and damaging property on a large

WHEREAS, the Texas Government Code, Chapter 418, gives the County Judge the power to declare a local disaster within the county "if the threat of disaster is imminent"; and

WHEREAS, the magnitude of the potential damage and the rapidity with which such a fire could escalate to major proportions constitute an imminent threat of disaster; and

WHEREAS, declaration of such disaster authorizes the imposition of controls on activities which tend to increase the likelihood of fires; and

by mitigating the threat of dangerous fires; and WHEREAS, a declaration issued under Section 418.108 of the Texas Government Code may

WHEREAS, such controls, once implemented, have the potential of protecting lives and property

include a prohibition or restriction on the sale or use of all fireworks within the County; and WHEREAS, a local disaster declaration expires seven days after its issuance, unless the

Commissioners' Court consents to its renewal or continuance; and

extension of the broader fireworks restriction.

WHEREAS, to the extent that a declaration includes a provision related to fireworks, any portion of the provision that exceeds the restrictions authorized by Texas Local Government Code §352.051 is effective only for 60 hours, unless the County Judge requests and the Governor authorizes an

BE IT THEREFORE PROCLAIMED that I, Jerry Dan Hefley, County Judge of Wheeler County, do hereby declare a local State of Disaster based on the threat of large wildfires in Wheeler County, Texas.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that this State of Disaster will continue until rescinded in accordance with the above cited statute, but in no instance will this declaration continue for more than seven days without being authorized by the County Commissioners' Court, or in the event the declaration pertains to fireworks, no more than 60 hours unless an extension of the restriction on fireworks has been received from the Governor of the State of Texas.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that the sale and use of all fireworks is prohibited in Wheeler County, Texas for the duration of this Declaration.

BE IT ALSO PROCLAIMED that the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, and the sale and use of all fireworks, which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.


