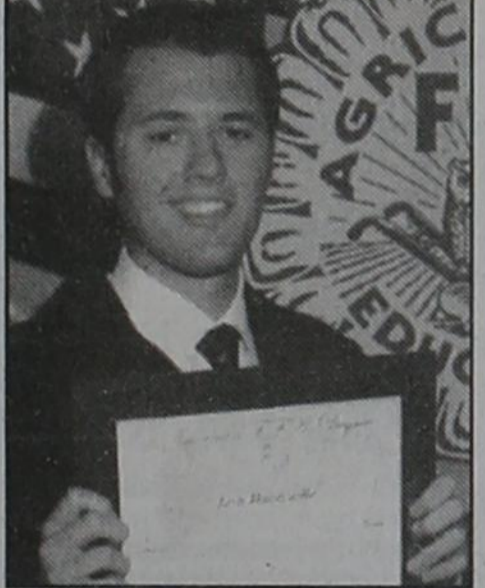

Hardcastle Given National Degree

Local Community Claims National Degree Recipient Josh Hardcastle, a member of the Wheeler FFA Chapter from Wheeler, Texas, to receive the American FFA Degree. Earning the degree means Josh is one of a select group of individuals recognized for years of academic and professional excellence. The honor was presented on October 22, 2011 at the 84th National FFA Convention, held in Indianapolis, Ind.

The American FFA Degree recognizes demonstrated leadership ability and outstanding achievements in agricultural business, production, processing or service programs. To be eligible, members must have earned and productively invested \$7,500 through a supervised agricultural experience (SAE) program in which they start, own or hold a professional position in an existing agriculture enterprise and serve 50 community service hours. Recipients must also make it their mission to demonstrate outstanding leadership abilities and community involvement.

Each award recipient received a Gold American FFA Degree key, and a certificate in a blue leatherette frame. Of the 540,379 FFA members nationwide, Josh was one of only 3,241 to be recognized in 2011.

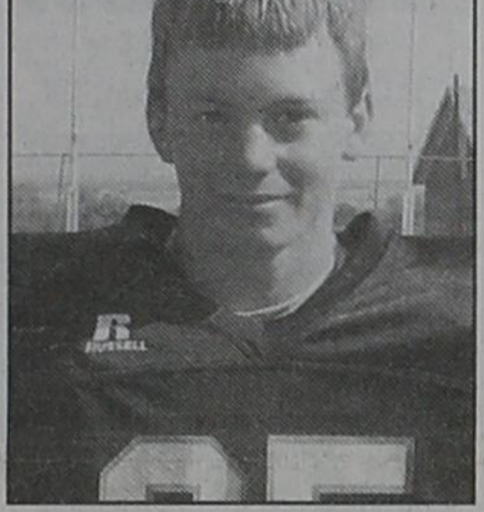

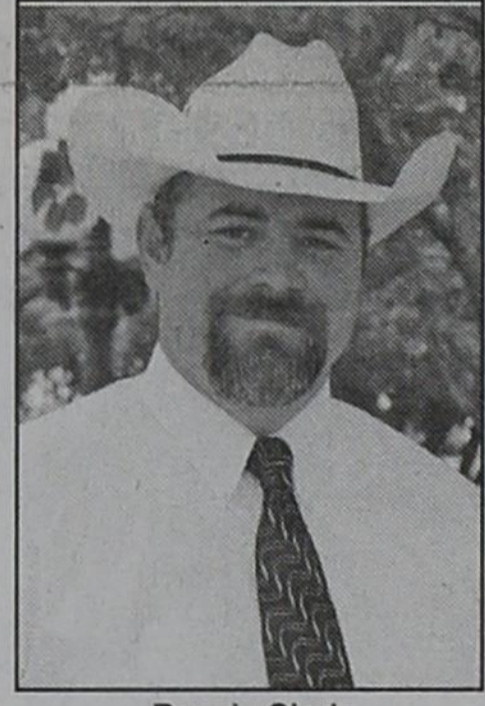

Comm. (from Page 1) burning along fencerows, etc. The court will re-consider the burn ban situation at their next meeting. The public is reminded: "You are responsible for any fires you set!"

Tim Parker and Brad Stepp, representing Colonial Life Insurance Company met to introduce themselves to the court and advise they were available questions by any of the county employees.

Kay Dickey met with the court to express her concern with the condition of County roads "2" and "D" in the Mobeetie area. The road to the Bailey homestead has been a problem for at least the past "18 years". Until the phone line was moved to the fence row, the line was cut each time the road was graded. In an effort to improve the road, a culvert was put into place; this washed out and travelers on the county road drove around the culvert for a year.

"With as little as one-quarter inch of rain the roads are impassible." Red caliche was placed in the roadway; but nothing was placed on top to finish the surface. Over the years the bar ditches have filled with "topping", road ma-

terial, from having been graded off to the side.

On October 27, 2011, Hugh Bailey called for an ambulance for his wife, Mae. After four and one-half hours, the ambulance call was answered. North Wheeler County Ambulance has a 4-wheel drive vehicle, but it was lacking equipment. (The 4-wheel ambulance is now equipped.) A tractor, front-end loader and fire truck were used to get the "EMT" to the scene.

(Note: Kay Dickey is the daughter of Hugh and Mae Bailey. Mrs. Bailey is in re-hab in Amarillo, and is reported to be improving from having suffered a series of strokes.)

Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner, Pct. 1, apologized to Mrs. Dickey and stated they were working on the situation.

The commissioners voted to purchase a heart monitor/defibrillator for North Wheeler County Ambulance at a cost of \$36,363.12.

Scott Porter, County Tax Collector, was re-appointed to the Wheeler County Appraisal District Board for a term of two years.

STDs:
The Hidden Epidemic

Perhaps you've heard someone say, "I don't need to get tested for STDs. I'd know if I had one." Perhaps that someone was you. Unfortunately, it simply isn't true — the vast majority of people with sexually transmitted diseases never know they have them until it's too late. What is too late? It varies for different people. Too late could be when you try to have a child and discover that untreated Chlamydia has rendered you infertile, or it could simply be hearing that you've passed on a disease to someone you love.

One of the factors that make STDs so common is that most people with an STD don't even know that they are sick. It is not uncommon for someone to be infected but have no STD symptoms - in other words to be asymptomatic. Therefore, people can be infected with an STD for many years without knowing. During that time, if they're not careful, they can pass their disease on to some or all of their sex partners. That's why some scientists call STDs "the hidden epidemic."

If one infected person has unprotected sex with a new partner each year, and each of their partners has unprotected sex with one new partner a year, in 10 years the first person could have passed their STD on to over 1000 people. If each person has sex with two new partners a year, that number goes up to more than fifty-thousand.

Chlamydia is the most common treatable STD, but three-quarters of all women and half of all men, with Chlamydia have no STD symptoms. Half of all women with gonorrhea, and 10% of men, don't show symptoms either. Many other STDs can also lie dormant for months or years. No wonder that the Centers for Disease Control estimate that there are more than 19 million new STD infections in the U.S. each year. It's very easy to have an STD and not know about it. That's why safer sex should be the rule rather than the exception.

Although an STD may not be making you feel sick right now, it doesn't mean that it is not having an effect on your or your sexual partners, health. Left untreated, some STDs can cause long-term damage to your reproductive tract, such as pelvic inflammatory disease, and make it difficult or impossible to have children. Over time, others can lead to whole body illness, organ damage, or even death.

Even if you have an incurable STD, there are still precautions you can take to improve your health and protect your partners. One such precaution is suppressive therapy. For example, people with Herpes should consider taking a drug such as Valtrex. This form of treatment not only reduces the likelihood of an outbreak, it also lowers the probability of infecting your partner. However, since it does not remove the risk of transmission completely, it is important to always use safer sex practices. Remember, though, that condoms are not 100% effective at preventing herpes or HPV, since these viruses spread skin to skin.

So take charge of your own sexual health. Safer sex practices, and other precautions, can help keep you free of sexually transmitted diseases. Since you can't rely on how you feel to tell you if you're well, it's your responsibility to get tested and treated if you could possibly be at risk. Not just your health, but also the health of those you love, is in your hands.

Medical You must take personal responsibility. You cannot change the circumstances, the seasons, or the wind, but you can change yourself.

of them was actually, green. I believe they were named "S & H". Another brand I remember, was called "Gunn Brothers" and they were blue in color. I never knew exactly how their deal with the stores worked. All I knew, was that the stamp companies would print up rolls of them and sell them to the participating stores. In turn, when you bought anything at one of those stores, they would give you the appropriate amount of stamps for how much you spent. Most people would just put their stamps in a box, dresser drawer, or bag, until they had a really large amount of them. I knew a few folks who didn't want the stamps themselves, but would save them to give to their friends, or kinfolks. I know in our case, when we finally got around to gluing them in the books, we'd spend the biggest part of a day with that little project.

A full book of stamps was worth about three dollars. (Remember, this was fifty-plus years ago.) The stamp redemption stores had a lot of household products, much like a hardware store. The price tags on the items would list how many "books" they cost, instead of money. The stamp business eventually played out; I'm not sure why. Could be, it cut into the stores profit, too much.

It was kind of fun while it lasted. We actually got some pretty nice things at the stamp store. I wouldn't be surprised if we are using a few items that we got with stamps. I'm advised, we are...
