Dear Friends, I can't believe it. It is February! I love this month! It is almost Valentine's Day.

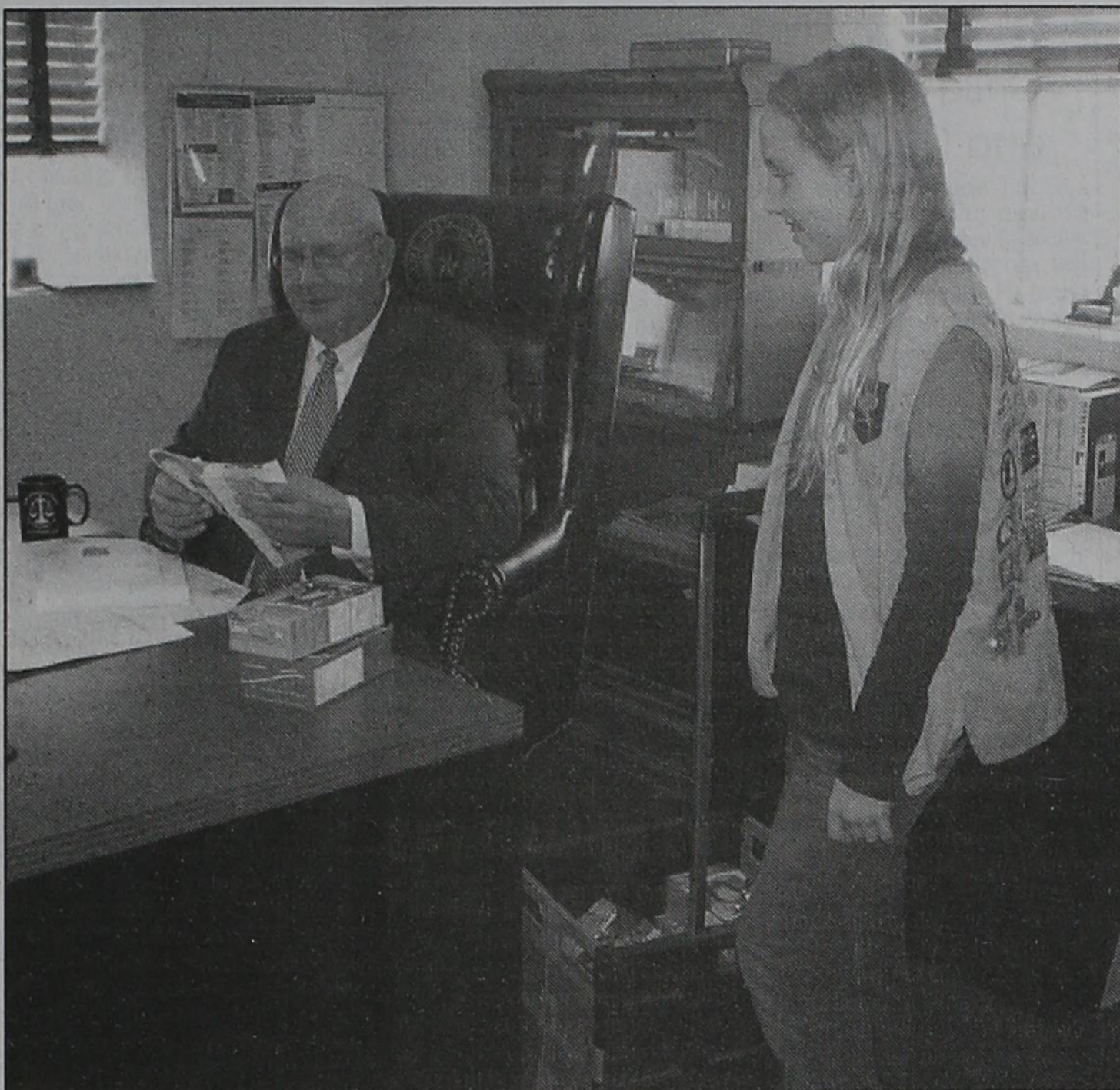
In my Art Class I am making a very special surprise for my Dad.

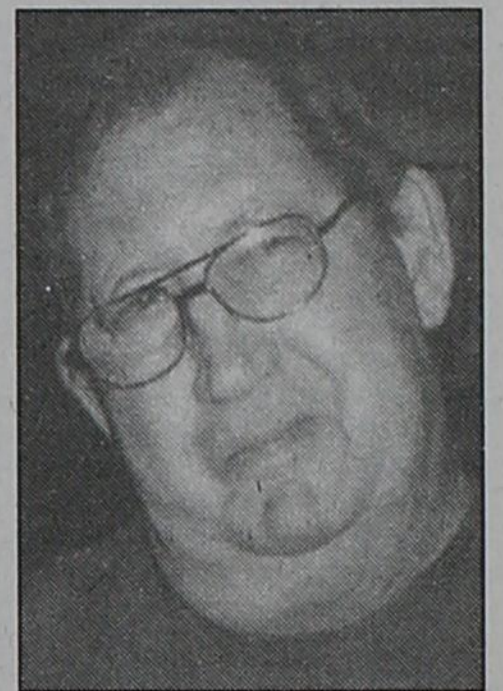
## Services For Mitchell Leon Watson

## Speed Limit At 75 For Area Interstates

The Texas Transportation Commission today approved 75 mph increases on close to 1,500 miles in interstate in Texas. News release is attached and below.

Portions of Texas Interstate Highways to see Speed Limit Increases

Miles and miles of Texas highway will soon see speed limit increases following Thursday's Texas Transportation Commission action approving 75 mph designations for close to 1,500 miles of interstate.

The speed limit changes span 60 Texas counties making it the largest conversion since a new law was passed last year. The 82nd Texas Legislature passed and the Governor signed House Bill 1353 which allows the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to establish 75 mph speed limits on Texas highways providing speed studies show it can be done safely.

Since September, the agency has been reviewing existing 70 mph speed limits across the state to determine where a 75 mph limit may be safely posted. Four Central Texas highways were the first to see higher speeds after the new law took effect. Thursday's Commission action brings the number of miles now zoned at 75 mph as a result of House Bill (HB) 1353 to 1,618.

Posting new speed limits on 1,500 miles of interstate highway is a major milestone in implementing the new law, said Carol Rawson, TxDOT Traffic Operations Division director.

"Texas' economic strength depends on the efficient and safe movement of people and goods," Rawson explained. "These new

speed limits increase highway efficiency while maintaining the safety of the transportation system."

TxDOT recommended to the Commission that speed limits be raised on segments of I-10, I-20, I-27, I-30, I-35, I-37, I-40, I-44 and I-45 after engineering studies showed that higher speeds could be posted safely.

Motorists must continue to travel at the posted speed until new signs are installed, said Rawson.

"The new speed limit is not official until the signs go up," she added.

TxDOT studies of speeds on U.S. highways, state highways, farm-to-market and ranch-to-market roads are still under way.

Prior to HB 1353, Texas had 1,445 miles of 75 mph speed limit and 521 miles of 80 mph speed limits on certain state highways. These speed limits were previously restricted to specific rural counties and highways located mostly in West Texas. Texas now has almost 3,600 miles zoned at 75 mph or higher.

New 75 mph speed limits approved Thursday are located on:

- I-10-289 miles across El Paso, Gillespie, Kerr, Kendall, Bexar, Guadalupe, Caldwell, Gonzales, Fayette, Colorado, Austin, Jefferson and Orange counties

- I-20-423 miles across Crane, Ector, Midland, Martin, Howard, Mitchell, Nolan, Taylor, Callahan, Eastland, Erath, Palo Pinto, Van Zandt, Smith, Gregg and Harrison counties

- I-27-109 miles across Lubbock, Hale, Swisher and Randall counties

### Parkview Artery Child Abuse and Neglect

Child abuse is more than bruises and broken bones. While physical abuse might be the most visible sign, other types of abuse, such as emotional abuse or child neglect, also leave deep, long lasting scars.

Some signs of child abuse are subtler than others. However, by learning common types of abuse and what you can do, you can make a huge difference in a child's life. The earlier abused children get help, the greater chance they have to heal from their abuse and not perpetuate the cycle.

Learn the signs and symptoms of child abuse and help break the cycle, finding out where to get help for the children and their caregivers.

Types of child abuse  
There are several types of child abuse, but the core element that ties them together is the emotional effect on the child. Children need predictability, structure, clear boundaries, and the knowledge that their parents are looking out for their safety. Abused children cannot predict how their parents will act. Their world is an unpredictable, frightening place with no rules. Whether the abuse is a slap, a harsh comment, stony silence, or not knowing if there will be dinner on the table tonight, the end result is a child that feel unsafe, uncared for, and alone.

Emotional child abuse  
Sticks and stones may break my bones but words will never hurt me? Contrary to this old saying, emotional abuse can severely damage a child's mental health or social development, leaving lifelong psychological scars. Examples of emotional child abuse include:  
• Constant belittling, shaming, and humiliating a child.  
• Calling names and making negative comparisons to others.

• Telling a child he or she is "no good," "worthless," "bad," or "a mistake."

• Frequent yelling, threatening, or bullying.  
• Ignoring or rejecting a child as punishment, giving him or her the silent treatment.

• Limited physical contact with the child—no hugs, kisses, or other signs of affection.  
Exposing the child to violence or the abuse of others, whether it be the abuse of a parent, a sibling, or even a pet.

Child neglect  
Child neglect—a very common type of child abuse—is a pattern of failing to provide for a child's basic needs, whether it be adequate food, clothing, hygiene, or supervision. Child neglect is not always easy to spot. Sometimes, a parent might become physically or mentally unable to care for a child, such as with a serious injury, untreated depression, or anxiety. Other times, alcohol or drug abuse may seriously impair judgment and the ability to keep a child safe.

Older children might not show outward signs of neglect, becoming used to presenting a competent face to the outside world, and even taking on the role of the parent. But at the end of the day, neglected children are not getting their physical and emotional needs met.

Physical child abuse  
• Physical abuse involves physical harm or injury to the child. It may be the result of a deliberate attempt to hurt the child, but not always. It can also result from severe discipline, such as using a belt on a child, or physical punishment that is inappropriate to the child's age or physical condition.

• Many physically abusive parents and caregivers insist that their actions are simply forms of discipline—ways to make children learn to behave. But there is a big difference between using physical punishment to discipline and physical abuse. The point of disciplining children is to teach them right from wrong, not to make them live in fear.

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### GALLUSES, CRUPPERS, AND OTHER OLD WORDS

I've always liked old words and phrases that are kind-of out of date, and hardly ever used anymore. It occurred to me that language is constantly changing. We know that new words are being added all the time, because of new inventions and new slang. I could gladly do without some of our current slang. Also, there are a lot of words and phrases that are going out of style, and pretty much forgotten. A few years ago, I got to read some old letters that one of my ancestors wrote, around 1870. I couldn't help but notice, that he wrote in a very descriptive manner, almost "flowery." Since writing letters was about the only way of communicating long distance, they had to do a good job of putting forth their thoughts. Here are some of my favorites, that aren't used much anymore; with a short comment about each one. I'm taking it for granted, that most of you already know what "galluses" and "cruppers" are, so I won't comment about them.

"Fell swoop"—The hawk caught that chicken in "one fell swoop."

"Twang"—The sound a bow-string makes, when an arrow is shot. Also, used by some folks, to describe our speech here in the Panhandle.

"Whang"—Normally describes a taste, usually said when making a bad face.

"Twain"—An old riverboat word that means "two." Remember the old saying; "East is east, and west is west, and never the twain shall meet."

"Smite"—To get hit really hard, usually fatal. This word is frequently used in the Bible.

"Rend"—To tear or rip. Also, used a lot in the Bible.

"Palaver"—To have a serious discussion.

"Chew the fat" To have a leisurely talk.

"Pine" Intense desire or longing for... "He's pining for his "sweet Adeline."

"Nigh"—Near, or almost, as, "It's nigh on to quittin' time," or "I dang nigh got run over." Has been modernized to "purt near."

"Livery"—Boarding or renting horses. Doesn't have anything to do with "liver."

"Watch fob"—A tether to secure one's pocket watch to your coat, vest, or overalls, so you won't lose it.

"Afar"—A long way in the distance. Always plumb out of sight.

"A mite"—A really small amount.

"A jag"—Quite a dab more than a mite.

"A peck"—One fourth of a bushel. Sometimes used as, "I'm in a peck of trouble."

"Got hitched"—Got married.

"Shotgun Wedding"—Father of the bride, making his future son-in-law a deal he can't turn down.

"Hightailin' it"—Taking the quickest way out of town, usually trying to stay ahead of the bullets.

"Tuckered out"—Plumb wore out.

"Got his plow cleaned"—Got whooped pretty bad.

"Snipes"—Cigarette butts; often picked up and smoked by "winos" and "hobos."

"Stogies" Cigar butts; usually picked up by the same guys that smoked "snipes."

Since this could go on indefinitely, I'd better quit for now. I wouldn't want to be thought of as a "twaddler."

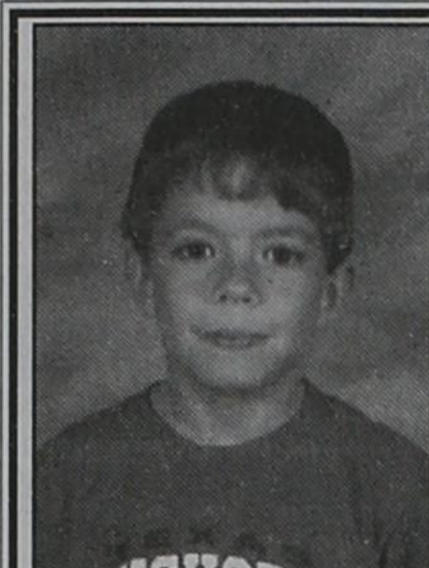

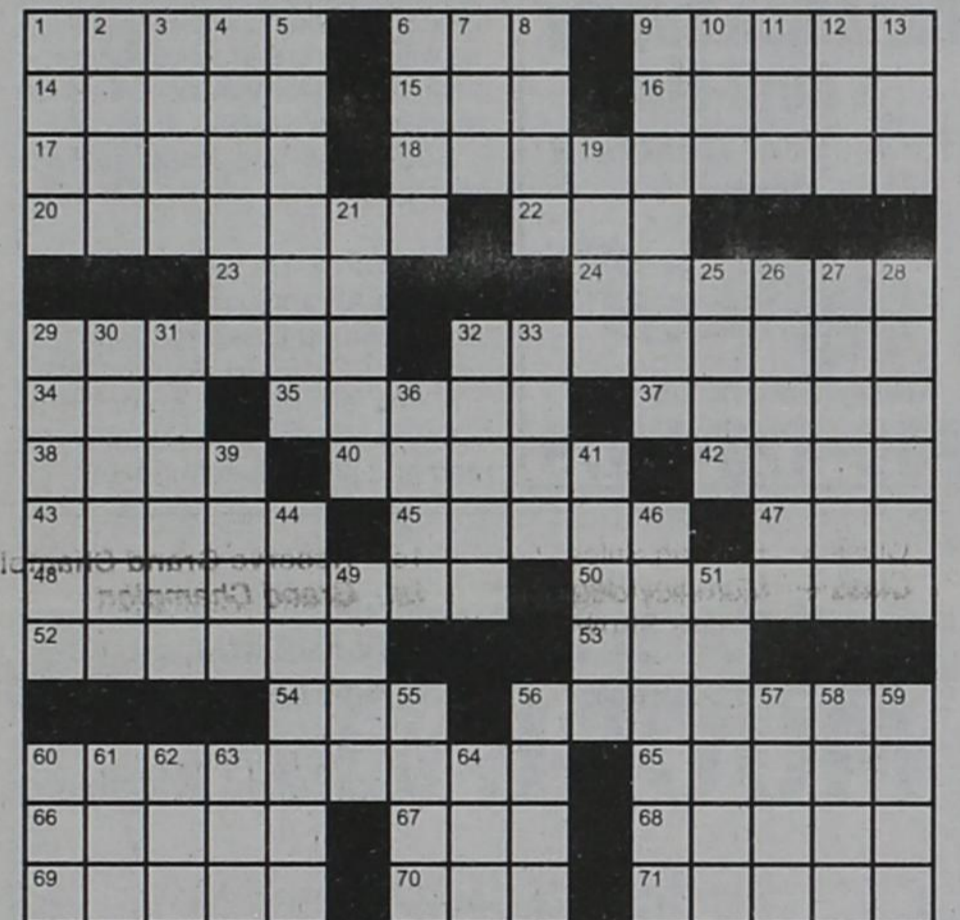
