NOTICE OF DRINKING WATER NITRATE VIOLATION

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the WHEELER MUNICI-PAL WATER SYSTEM that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for nitrate. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for nitrate at 10 milligrams per liter (mg/L) based on a single sample, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for nitrate indicates a compliance value in quarter three 2012 of

21 mg/L for EP001. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.



\$182 Million Available For **Housing Loans**

An additional \$182 million has been made available for rural housing loans, Secretary of Agriculture, Orville L. Freeman, announced.

Today's action makes a total of \$182 million available through Farmer's Home Administration for this type of credit during fiscal 1963. The funds come from \$430 million authorized by the Housing Act of 1961, to be expended within a 4-year period. Approximately \$95 million was obligated during fiscal 1962.

"These funds will help 20,000 families, who do not now have adequate housing, to obtain credit to finance a new home or improve the home they already own," Secretary Freeman said.
