Bobwhite Quail
Population Report
Texas diminished suignificantly during the winter of $1983-{ }^{\prime} 84$. Wheeler County was no exception. The dry
year that followed was not conductive for quail reproduction. As a result, quail decreased or disappeared from many areas. This past spring and
summer were excellent in terms of quail production. The observed broods have been ranging from 10 to
17. Areas that had very few quail last year should have fair to good hunting this year. The areas that were totally void of quail may not have a huntable
