Swine Flu

There certainly has been allot reported in the last few weeks. The news stories seem to be filled up with talk about the Swine Flu. But getting the information to the General Public, educating the dos and don'ts, will help everyone stay healthy. And keep the level of anxiety down for all.

A Novel strain of the swine flu has recently caused illness in our neighboring country of New Mexico. Milder cases have also been identified in the U.S., including two 16-year-old boys from Guadalupe County, near San Antonio. It is unclear, at this time, why people in Mexico have been effect4d more adversely than those in the U.S. Testing seems to indicate that this particular strain of flu contains some aspects of swine, avian, and human virus. There is a vaccination for swine flu for pigs, but one has not been developed for humans. On the brighter side, the antiviral that are available (such as Tamiflu) appear to be useful in preventing and treating this illness.

The cases of swine flu in Texas are a good way from Wheeler County, but when you consider that other cases have popped up in Kansas, California, and New York, we can't say that it will never happen here. The Texas department of State Health Services is working closely with Centers for Disease Control in tracking this outbreak and keeping it under control. You can go to the CDC web page by typing: CDC Swine Flu and You.

The systems are similar to regular human flu, and include fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, chills and fatigue. Some people have also reported having diarrhea and vomiting.

The symptoms of swine flu in people are similar to the symptoms of seasonal flu in humans

- and may include: • Fever (greater than 100°F or
- 37.8°C) Sore throat
- · Cough Stuffy nose
- Chills
- Headache and body aches Fatigue

 Avoid contact with ill persons. · When you cough or sneeze, cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or your sleeve (if you do not have a tissue). Throw used

tissues in a trash can. After you cough or sneeze, wash your hands with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based

hand gel. If you think you are ill with flu, avoid close contact with others as much as possible. Stay at home or in your hotel room. Seek medical care if you are severely ill (such as having trouble breathing). There are antiviral medications for prevention and treatment of swine flu that a doctor can prescribe. Do not go to work, school, or travel while ill.

Questions & Answers (FAQ) Swine Influenza (swine flu) is a respiratory disease of pigs caused by type A influenza viruses that causes regular outbreaks in pigs. People do not normally get swine flu, but human infections can and do happen. Swine flu viruses have been reported to spread from person-toperson, but in the past, this transmission was limited and not sustained beyond three people.

Are there human infections

with swine flu in the U.S.? In late March and early April 2009, cases of human infection with swine influenza A (H1N1) viruses were first reported in Southern California and near San Antonio, Texas. Other U.S. states have reported cases of swine flu infection in humans and cases have been reported internationally as well. An updated case count of confirmed swine flu infections in the United States is kept at http://www.cdc.gov/ swineflu/investigation.htm CDC and local and state health agencies are working together to in-

vestigate this situation. Is this swine flu virus contagious?

CDC has determined that this swine influenza A (H1N1) virus is contagious and is spreading from human to human. However, at this time, it not known how easily the virus spreads between people.

How does swine flu spread? Spread of this swine influenza A (H1N1) virus is thought to be happening in the same way that seasonal flu spreads. Flu viruses are spread mainly from person to person through coughing or sneezing of people with influenza. Sometimes people may become infected by touching something with flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or

How can someone with the flu infect someone else?

What should I do to keep from getting the flu?

First and most important: wash your hands. Try to stay in good general health. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food. Try not touch surfaces that may be contaminated with the flu virus. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Are there medicines to treat swine flu?

Yes. CDC recommends the use of oseltamivir or zanamivir for the treatment and/or prevention of infection with these swine influenza viruses. Antiviral drugs are prescription medicines (pills, liquid or an inhaler) that fight against the flu by keeping flu viruses from reproducing in your body. If you get sick, antiviral drugs can make your illness milder and make you feel better faster. They may also prevent serious flu complications. For treatment, antiviral drugs work best if started soon after getting sick (within 2 days of symptoms).

How long can an infected person spread swine flu to others? People with swine influenza virus infection should be consid-

ered potentially contagious as long as they are symptomatic and possible for up to 7 days following illness onset. Children, especially younger children, might potentially be contagious for longer periods. What surfaces are most likely

to be sources of contamination? Germs can be spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth. Droplets from a cough or sneeze of an infected person move through the air. Germs can be spread when a person touches respiratory droplets from another person on a surface like a desk and then touches their own eyes, mouth or nose before washing their hands.

How long can viruses live outside the body?

We know that some viruses and bacteria can live 2 hours or longer on surfaces like cafeteria tables, doorknobs, and desks, Frequent handwashing will help you reduce the chance of getting contamination from these common surfaces.

What is the best technique for washing my hands to avoid get

ting the flu? Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs Wash with soap and water. or clean with alcohol-based hand cleaner. we recommend that when you wash your hands with soap and warm water — that you wash for 15 to 20 seconds. When soap and water are not available, alcohol-based disposable hand wipes or gel sanitizers may be used. You can find them in most supermarkets and drugstores. If using gel, rub your hands until the gel is dry. The gel doesn't need water to work; the alcohol in it kills the germs on

What should I do if I get sick? If you live in areas where swine influenza cases have been identified and become ill with influenza-like symptoms, including fever, body aches, runny nose, sore throat, nausea, or vomiting or diarrhea, you may want to contact their health care provider, particularly if you are worried about your symptoms. Your health care provider will determine whether influenza testing or treatment is needed.

If you are sick, you should stay home and avoid contact with other people as much as possible to keep from spreading your ill-

ness to others. If you become ill and experience any of the following warning signs, seek emergency medi-

World War II savings bond campaign poster can be shown to them. Writing activities can be inspired by letters written by WWII veterans to loved ones back home. Geography can be integrated into the historical information with maps that will emphasize where significant events have taken place. Historical documents and exhibits can be used to prompt student understanding of how actions of the government and/or events of the past affect their lives today.

Wheeler's story has a direct connection to the school curriculum as prescribed by£28.002(h) of the Texas Education Code. £113.5 Social Studies, Grade 3,£113.23. Social Studies, Grade 7, and£113.32. United States History Studies Since Reconstruction (One Credit), (4) states that "Throughout social studies in Kindergarten-Grade 12, students build a foundation in history; geography, economics; government, citizenship; culture; science, technology, and society; and social studies skills. The content, as appropriate for the grade level or course, enables students to understand the importance of patriotism, function in a free enterprise society, and appreciate the basic democratic values of our state and nation as referenced in the Texas Education Code.

For instance, in the third grade students should learn how individuals have changed their communities and world. Students will study the effects inspiring heroes have had on communities, past and present. Students will learn about the lives of heroic men and women who made important choices, overcame obstacles. sacrificed for the betterment of others, and embarked on journeys that resulted in new ideas, new inventions, and new communities. Students will expand their knowledge through the identification and study of people who made a difference, influenced public policy and decision making, and participated in resolving issues that are important to all people. Throughout Grade 3, students will develop an understanding of the

economic, cultural and scientific contributions made by individuals. The museum's focus on WWII will be useful to high school United States History classes in regard to history.
