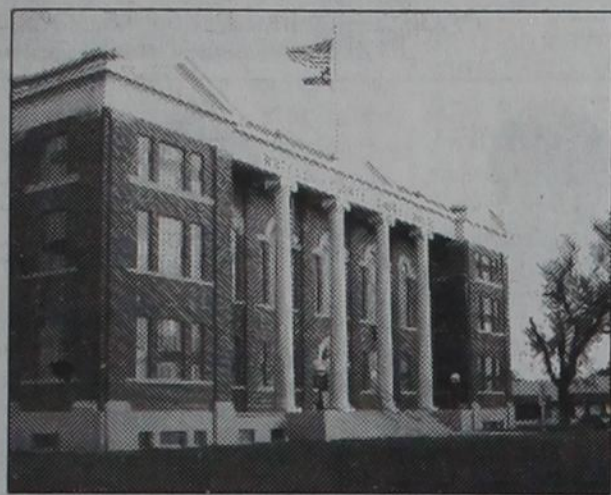

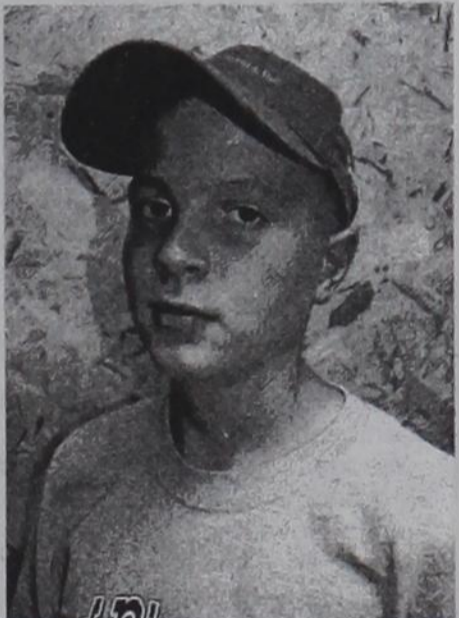

ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

On this 23rd day of July, 2007, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in Regular Session, and found that circumstances present in all the unincorporated area of Wheeler County, Texas, create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning, therefore,

The Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by this Order, hereby prohibits outdoor burning in all of the unincorporated area in Wheeler County, Texas. This burn ban takes effect July 26, 2007, and will terminate October 26, 2007, Ninety (90) days from that date.

A person who violates this prohibition will be charged with a Class C misdemeanor pursuant to Section 240.906 of the Texas Local Government Code.

The court approved the payment of the hourly payroll time sheets as presented.

The bills were approved for payment.

The sheriff's department moved some funds around in their budget with the court's approval.

It was decided to put the burn ban back into affect, starting Thursday, July 23, 2007. Three fires were reported within the past few days.

The treasurers' report was accepted as presented.

Ralph Wallace, Texas County and District Retirement system representative met with the commissioners to go over the retirement program for the county.

The gift of the Masonic Lodge, building and property, had been accepted by the court at an earlier meeting. It was decided to get the paperwork in order.

Willis Smith was reappointed by the court to the Board of Trustees of Texas Panhandle Mental Health Mental Retardation for the term September 1, 2007 until August 31, 2009.

Hubert Moore, Commissioner, Pct. 3, asked the court for permission to transfer ownership of two 1984 dump trucks from Precinct 3, to the City of Shamrock. It was decided it would be necessary to enact an inter-local agreement and the transfer could be made.

The TAC insurance was renewed by a vote of the commissioners.

Elk City, Oklahoma Pipeline, L.P. was given permission to cross County Roads, "D", "13", "10" and "9" for the purpose of installation of oil and gas pipelines. Each crossing was an individual

I get a number of church bulletins every week. Usually, there is a section that mentions specific people either in the congregation, community, or known to someone that is in need of prayers. There is a section related to numbers such as attendance or contributions. There is the announcements area that talks about upcoming events or news that everyone in the congregation needs to be aware of. Usually, there is only one other type of element included and the best way to describe it is as an Op/Ed piece.

Although some preachers may be quick to debate this, let me clarify. Most who write a church bulletin want part of it to have some Bible teaching included. That is a valiant desire, and certainly can be a ministry in and of itself. But, unless it is a direct quotation from scripture, it will always be just an Op/Ed piece. By the way, "Op/Ed" stands for opinion and editorial. In big newspapers, the writers on those pages often throw out wild or extreme thoughts on the hot topic of the day. Their opinion is stated. Their opinions may be accurate and biblical every preacher should try their best to be accurate and biblical.

Church bulletins get sent out to members, former members, other congregations and people who, at one time or another, probably asked to be put on the mailing list. However, not everyone always understands the context of something written and that is how misunderstandings happen. For example, a preacher writes on the subject of grace (a very biblical topic), but gets interpreted by someone who might not even know the original writer that he does not consider Christian works to be all that important. My suggestion (that I need to remember, too) is that when we read a bulletin article by someone else and we don't like it or disagree with it, try your best to contact the original writer of it. Perhaps you will find there is more agreement than you previously thought.

I am in the hospital now getting my three day chemo, and I have one more 5 day and one more 3 day yet to go. I hope to be on schedule so I'll be done around August 22, 2007. I hope to be able to go back to school.

6. What advice do you have for other people who are at risk? Go early! If you feel that there is something that the doctors are missing keep going. The longer that you put off finding the problem the harder it will be. Find a new doctor, just make sure that you get all the treatments and you can WHIP this.

7. Other comments?

Once again I want everyone to know how much it means to me and my family, how everyone is always here for me and supporting us. We have had so many friends bringing food to our house, helping with fund raisers to help us with medical cost, and mostly all the prayers that you have said for me through all of this. My family could not have got through this without Gods loving hands. It means more than anyone will ever know. I am excited to be able to help raise money for the Cancer Rally. My team will be out there. I had the chance to be one of the spokes children for the Children Miracle Network, in Amarillo and raised money for BSA hospital pediatric ward, it is a great honor to be able to help others, as so many have helped me. I have been in two of the cancer walks and it is a great way to help others, I hope that all will give and maybe we can find a cure for this thing called CANCER.

The Editor's On His Soap Box

Wheeler's paving project on Highways 83 and 152 is progressing with 3/4 of the intersection of the two highways completed and over half of the roadways resurfaced.

When the project was first presented at a town hall meeting, plans called for sidewalks on both sides of the highways from city limits to city limits. The need for these sidewalks was discussed because of the need to remove trees along the road. It was a consensus of those in attendance that the desire to keep the trees was greater than that of having the sidewalks.

The sidewalks were removed from the plans and the construction is underway.

The curbs were moved in on both highways. With the decrease in the width of the roadway, there is plenty of room for the sidewalks without removing trees and/or other obstacles. (Obstacles being the rock arch in front of the residence at 210 S. Alan L. Bean Blvd.)

With the placing of the curbs, a group of citizens is now seeking to have the sidewalks placed back in the project. A petition was circulated and a number of signatures were obtained. However the 'ball was dropped' and nothing has come of the petition.

It has been brought to the attention of *The Wheeler Times* that the petition was circulated and a request for the public to be informed of this group's existence.

A publicized meeting with the Wheeler city council will be scheduled and Wheeler citizens interested in seeing the sidewalks put back into the plan are urged to be present at the meeting.

The sidewalks are in place in the other towns along Highway 83.

The question of use of the sidewalks was also discussed at the earlier town hall meetings. Those in attendance were not aware of the need for the sidewalks. However, with the narrowing of the two roadways, it becomes more dangerous for our local 'walkers' and those on bicycles to use the edge of the paving.

Each of the corners along the highways have the a section of the curb laid down for disabled access to the lawns and/sidewalks, where sidewalks exist in the 100 and 200 blocks of Hwy. 152—along the 'square' and one block west.

The *Times* is interested in your opinion on this subject and you will be informed of any additional information learned on this subject.

I was at the meetings and was opposed to the sidewalks because we were told the trees would have to be removed. I can now see there is no need for the cutting of trees and do not object
