On this 23rd day of July, 2007, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in Regular Session, and found that circumstances present in all the unincorporated area of Wheeler County, Texas, create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning, therefore,

The Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by this Order, hereby prohibits outdoor burning in all of the unincorporated area in Wheeler County, Texas. This burn ban takes effect July 26, 2007, and will terminate October 26, 2007, Ninety (90) days from that date.

A person who violates this prohibition will be charged with a Class C misdemeanor pursuant to Section 240.906 of the Texas Local Government Code.

A Cancer Survivor's Story—Wheeler Co. Relay For Llfe Aug. 10

1. How and when were you made aware you had cancer? After several years of being sick and

not being able to play like normal kids, my family knew that there was something wrong with me. I would feel good and play hard for one day and then I was sick and running a high fever for the next few days, never having the energy that most 10 year old boy's have. I went to several doctors and lots of different test, before that day at BSA when the doctors found a tumor in my right kidney. They called it a whelms tumor. My family will never forget that horrifying day, our lives were changed. We had hoped that we would never have to relive November 5, 2004. Then it was a nightmare again on January 9, 2007 during one of my many check ups they found a spot on my left lung. They had to get the tumor out and start chemo along with radiation this time.

2. Please tell about the circum-



stances surrounding the discovery, your life circumstances at the time of diagnosis such as family size, employment, and your spouse's employment. My family had moved to Mobeetie, where my Dad had been raised, from Fritch. My Dad works for Warren Cat and my Mom stays home and takes care of us. We were excited to be living here and going to school in a small school and where my Dad's family had attended. I was in the 3rd grade when we first got here, I was in the 5th grade when they discovered that I had cancer. I was home schooled for the rest of that year. My family has my Dad, Jackie Don, Mom, Kellie, and my sister, Peyton . My Pa and Nanny, Tim and Sallie Adcock live just down the road, and my Grandpa and Grandma, Paul and Sheri Bryce live in Arizona. I have a special dog "Chili Bean" that has been a great comfort for me.

3. When were you diagnosed and what course of therapy/treatment/surgery did you choose? Did you choose reconstruction surgery? The first tumor was found on November 5, 2004 and I had to have 21 weeks of chemo every Monday, in Amarillo, the doctors removed the right kidney. I was very sick, didn't want to eat, I lost a lot of weight and was weak; I was in and out of the hospital during those weeks. Then with my lungs they had to remove the tumor and part of the lung around it so they were sure that they got all of the cancer. My treatment this time was to have 8 radiation treatments and 25 weeks of chemo. The treatment would be every Monday and I would have to go into the hospital every third week for five days with 3 chemo treatments a day. This has been very challenging for me and my family. Peyton has had to go to school and Mom is in Amarillo with me and Dad has to work. 4. How did your family deal with your diagnosis and what member of your family was most affected? My family has been there for me



through this with out them. All of my family has been affected by my cancer as we have had to change our live around my treatments and being in and out of the hospital. There have been things that we could not do that we normally do. I have had to stay home from school this year and will have to repeat 7th grade, I was to sick to have home school this year and my family just wanted me not to have other things to worry with, just fighting this cancer.

5. What are your feelings now? How have you adjusted to being

Leave home well rested. Don't tire yourself out with last minute preparation.


Choose the easiest and quickest options - always. avoid long waits and tiring line ups.



The Editor's On His Soap Box

Wheeler's paving project on Highways 83 and 152 is progressing with 3/4 of the intersection of the two highways completed and over half of the roadways resurfaced.

When the project was first presented at a town hall meeting, plans called for sidewalks on both sides of the highways from city limits to city limits. The need for these sidewalks was discussed because of the need to remove trees along the road. It was a consensus of those in attendance that the desire to keep the trees was greater than that of having the sidewalks.

The sidewalks were removed from the plans and the construction is underway.

The curbs were moved in on both highways. With the decrease in the width of the roadway, there is plenty of room for the sidewalks without removing trees and/or other obstacles. (Obstacles being the rock arch in front of the residence at 210 S. Alan L. Bean Blvd.)

With the placing of the curbs, a group of citizens is now seeking to have the sidewalks placed back in the project. A petition was circulated and a number of signatures were obtained. However the 'ball was dropped' and nothing has come of the petition.

It has been brought to the attention of The Wheeler Times that the petition was circulated and a request for the public to be informed of this group's existence.

A publicized meeting with the Wheeler city council will be scheduled and Wheeler citizens interested in seeing the sidewalks put back into the plan are urged to be present at the meeting.

The sidewalks are in place in the other towns along Highway 83

The question of use of the sidewalks was also discussed at the earlier town hall meetings. Those in attendance were not aware of the need for the sidewalks. However, with the narrowing of the two roadways, it becomes more dangerous for our local 'walkers' and those on bicycles to use the edge of the paving.

Each of the corners along the highways have the a section of the curb laid down for disabled access to the lawns and/sidewalks, where sidewalks exist in the 100 and 200 blocks of Hwy. 152-along the 'square' and one block west.
