# 4th of July Celebration Fast Approaching Reserve Booth Space NOW!

The twenty-fourth 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration will be held again this year under the sponsorship of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce. The activities will start early Saturday, July 4, with the Fun Run/Walk and end with the street dance at the park.

Park activities begin at 10:00 A.M. Saturday morning, continue to dusk with the free fireworks display and end with the dance at the park.

The fourth annual 1<sup>st</sup> Lt. Ben Britt Memorial Fun Run/Walk will be held promptly at 7:35 A.M. at the southwest corner of the square.

Anyone wishing to have a food booth at the park this year for the 4<sup>th</sup> is asked to notify the Chamber office at 826-3408. An effort is made not to duplicate; it is on a first come, first serve basis.

The Fun Run will be under the supervision of Kenna Howard. Individuals signing up for the Fun Run early will be charged a \$10.00 entry fee; those participating without pre-registration will have a \$12.00 fee. Each individual participating will receive a t-shirt; those registering on the day of the race may have to wait for their t-shirts.

It is not necessary to run; many just walk and enjoy the fellowship of fellow participants. The starting

point for the run will be the southwest corner of the courthouse square on Texas Street. Male and female participants will be divided into five groups; 10 and under; 11-18, 19-30, 31-55, and over 55.

Medals and ribbons will be presented following the race.

Registration on site will begin at 7:00 and continue until 7:30 at the southwest corner of the square.

Punt, Pass and Kick will be at 8:30 A.M. behind the old gym on Nicholson School, beginning at 9:00 A.M. The parade will start at 9:30 and continue down Main Street, past the square and then to the City Park. 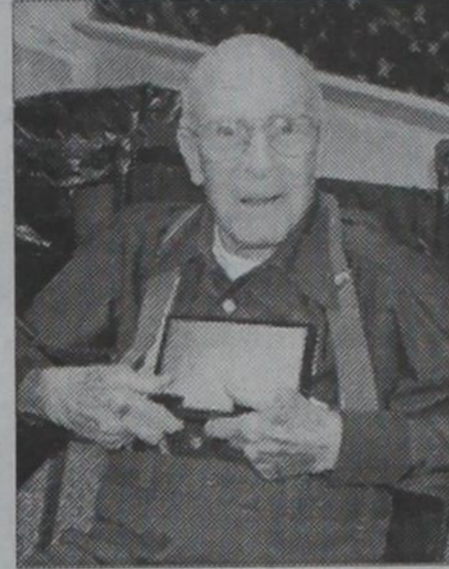
The park activities will kick-off with the raising of the flag and the singing of the National Anthem. Many activities are scheduled for the day, including live music.

## Farmers' Market Open Wed. On West Side Of The Square

Local gardeners and growers are gearing up for another season of farmers' market sales in Wheeler. The market kicked off on Wednesday, June 17th, at 4:00 pm on the east side of the court house square. The Saturday market will begin June 20th at 9:00 am and will last until 12:00 pm or until vendors sell out which-

ever happens first. The Saturday market will be set up on the west side of the court house. The market is open to Wheeler County residents who grow their products in Wheeler County. We do not allow shipped-in produce. There is no fee to participate as a seller, and each seller handles his/her own sales and money. Bring your own table and chair(s) and enjoy the atmosphere of a genuine farmers' market typical of a small town in rural America. This is an excellent opportunity for the people of Wheeler County to supplement their income, give their children a chance to earn a little extra money, or just to share your garden goods with others.

At the first market, growers expect to have new potatoes, onions, green beans, rhubarb, blackberries, herbs, plants, and more. Later in the season we anticipate black-eyed peas, sweet corn, squash, cucumbers, tomatoes, cream peas, okra, cantaloupes, watermelons, peppers, grapes, apples, and much more. The late freeze seems to have killed the apricot and peach crops for this year, but there should be plenty of other goodies.

Growers are welcome to bring to sell any agricultural product.

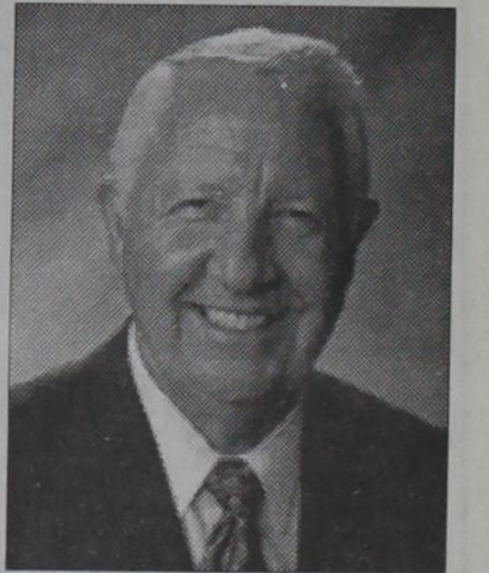

Following 17 years as President of East Texas Baptist University, Dr. Bob E. Riley will retire on July 16, 2009. Dr. Riley attended grades one through eight at Briscoe and graduated from Wheeler High School in 1961.

"Although this presidency has been a wonderful experience, Gayle and I believe that it is time for a new vision and leadership for ETBU," said Dr. Riley, whose term as president is the second longest in the 96-year history of the University.

Dr. Riley's tenure at ETBU has numerous highlights: Record enrollments; significant increase in the endowment; organized the University into seven schools, with Deans; completed over \$25 million in capital projects; expanded institutional and instructional technology; moved from NCAA Division II (scholarship athletics) to NCAA Division III (non-scholarship athletics); elected to the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; served on the Executive Council; appointed to the Marshall Chamber of Commerce



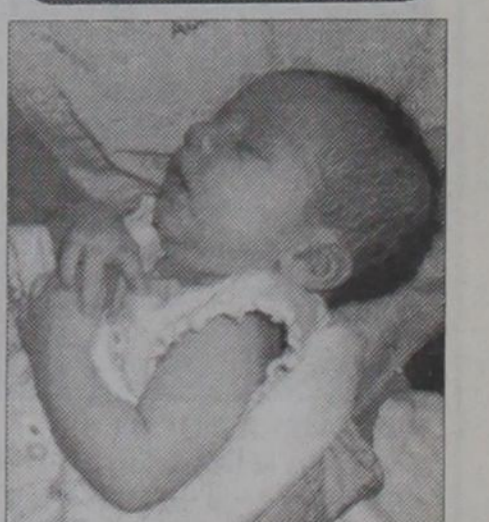

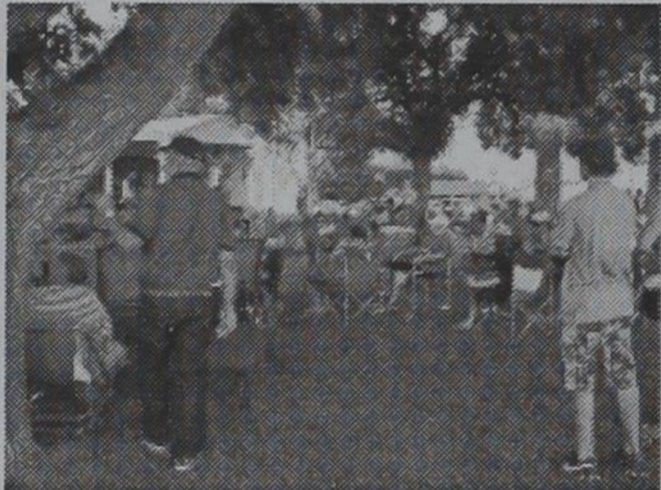

noted historian and author Delbert Trew who will speak on newly uncovered evidence that changes the history of buffalo hunting. In fact, he credits the Internet with providing the evidence that changes the oral history reports of great waste by the buffalo hunters that pursued the great beasts in the Texas Panhandle of the 1800's. Trew says that much unpublished information found buried in libraries and museums has come to light because of the Internet and longtime historical writing are found to be misleading or exaggerated in content. "For example," Trew states, "early-day estimates of the number of buffalo on the Great Plains were probably high. In one of Trew's articles entitled "Separating Buffalo Fact From Fiction," he discusses newly found sales tickets from major hide buyers and freight charges from the few railroads servicing the hunting grounds all point to less buffalo than previously thought." He also discusses recently uncovered railroad freight listings showing where hundreds of tons of buffalo meat, tongues, hair and bones were shipped to the Eastern markets.

Trew's presentation will be complimented by his son Mike Oldham of Lefors. Oldham portrays a buffalo hunter and gunsmith. Oldham will demonstrate and tell about the weapons, knives and reloading equipment used in hunting. They also have numerous artifacts on display. Mike's wife will have knives and other trade items for sell. New this year will be Tonya Buzzard of Lipscomb, Texas with her art gallery presentation "Photos of the West". Artist Cherine Marie will display her paintings and drawings, with a western flair, as well. She is the owner of Horsefeather's Studio. Tradesmen and women that will be set up include Keith and Jennie Latham of Amarillo. Keith is a Forger/Blacksmith and his wife will demonstrate bead work. Joe Rogers will be on hand as a carpenter and wood workers. He is out of Hereford and if you've never seen him create a rose from wood shavings, you really need to stop by and see this. Linda Hayhurst will join the festivities this year demonstrating long forgotten art of Inkle Weaving on a loom.

Other craftsmen demonstrating trades from the late 1800's include a gunsmith, carpentry, a bow builder, fur trapper, forger and an Inkle weaver. Western artists will display their work as well. The arrowhead hunt and silent auction will also be back this year as well as various games for the children and young at heart.

Wagon rides have been added to this year's event as well as music throughout the evening. Of course, what Hoedown would be complete without the chuck wagon supper? Keven Romines will whip up his famous fajitas for the event.

Admission to the event is \$6 for children 6-12; \$12 for adults; children 5 and under are free. Remember, admission includes your meal, wagon rides and all entertainment for the afternoon and evening!

**APPLICATION AND DRAFT PERMIT.** Eagle Rock Field Services, L.P., 16701 Greenspoint Park Drive, Suite 200, Houston, Texas 77060, a Natural Gas Transmission facility, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an initial issuance of Federal Operating Permit (herein referred to as Permit) No. O3173, Application No. 12883 to authorize operation of the Goad-Hemphill Complex, a natural gas treatment facility and compressor station. At the TCEQ Central and Regional Offices, relevant supporting materials for the draft permit, as well as the New Source Review permits which have been incorporated by reference, may be reviewed and copied. Any person with difficulties obtaining these materials due to travel constraints may contact the TCEQ Central Office file room at (512) 239-1540.

**PUBLIC COMMENT/NOTICE AND COMMENT HEARING.** Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit. Comments relating to the accuracy, completeness, and appropriateness of the permit conditions may result in changes to the draft permit.

A person who may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the permitted area may request a notice and comment hearing. The purpose of the notice and comment hearing is to provide an additional opportunity to submit comments on the draft permit. The permit may be changed based on comments pertaining to whether the permit provides for compliance with 30 TAC Chapter 122 (examples may include that the permit does not contain all applicable requirements or the public notice procedures were not satisfied). The TCEQ may grant a notice and comment hearing on the application if a written hearing request is received within 30 days after publication of the newspaper notice. The hearing request must include the basis for the request, including a description of how the person may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the application area. The request should also specify the conditions of the draft permit that are inappropriate or specify how the preliminary decision to issue or deny the permit is inappropriate. All reasonably ascertainable issues must be raised and all reasonably available arguments must be submitted by the end of the public comment period. If a notice and comment hearing is granted, all individuals that submitted written comments or a hearing request will receive written notice of the hearing. This notice will identify the date, time, and location for the hearing.

Written public comments and/or requests for a notice and comment hearing should be submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, Office of the Chief Clerk, MC-105, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087, or electronically at [www.tceq.state.tx.us/about/comments.html](http://www.tceq.state.tx.us/about/comments.html) and received within 30 days from the date of newspaper publication of this notice.

A notice of proposed final action that includes a response to comments and identification of any changes to the draft permit will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments, a hearing request, or requested to be on the mailing list for this application. This mailing will also provide instructions for public petitions to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to request that the EPA object to the issuance of the proposed permit. After receiving a petition, the EPA may only object to the issuance of a permit which is not in compliance with the applicable requirements or the requirements of 30 TAC Chapter 122.

**MAILING LIST.** In addition to submitting public comments, a person may ask to be placed on a mailing list for this application by sending a request to the TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address above. Those on the mailing list will receive copies of future public notices (if any) mailed by the Chief Clerk for this application.

## Tornado Tips

Tornadoes are one of the worst weather-related disasters. They are at their peak, often striking with full fury, between March and June in the central region of the United States. However, records indicate appearances in each of the 48 contiguous states at all times of the year. It's imperative that everyone has a plan of action no matter where they are in case of a tornado emergency. Moving swiftly, sometimes at speeds of 60 M.P.H., a tornado is only about one mile away by the time people in its path hear the deafening noise. At this rate, you have about one minute to implement your emergency plan. To assure the earliest warning possible, every home and business should have a NOAA Weather Alert radio.

**Tornado Watch vs. Tornado Warning**

Knowing the difference can be a lifesaver.

A tornado watch means conditions are right for a tornado to form. Keep apprised of weather conditions and be ready to take shelter.

A tornado warning means that a funnel cloud or tornado has been spotted in the area. Take shelter immediately in case a tornado approaches your location.

Here are several reminders:

If away from home during a tornado watch, be prepared to find shelter. During tornado warnings, immediately seek shelter in the basements of modern, steel-reinforced office buildings, tunnels, underground parking facilities, subways or interior corridors of other buildings. Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls. The safest place is in the basement. If there is no basement, take cover under a stairway or sturdy table, or in a closet or bathroom. Go to the center of the house or the side away from the storm.

Avoid auditoriums, gymnasiums, arenas, supermarkets, barns and other structures with large, poorly-supported roofs (as the may collapse). Also avoid upper stories of office buildings, house trailers and parked vehicles. If caught in such a building, go to the lowest roof, an inside hallway or small room or get under something sturdy. If in a store or shopping mall, stay away from large glass display windows.

Students or factory workers should proceed directly to their assigned locations under prearranged emergency plans.

In open areas, lie flat in the nearest ditch, ravine or other depression and stay alert to the dangers of any flash flooding in your area. Also stay clear of poles and overhead line structures.

While on the road in a vehicle, drive at a right angle to the tornado's path. Most tornadoes travel between 25-40 M.P.H., so you should be able to out-distance them. However, if an escape route is unavailable or the funnel is upon you, abandon the vehicle to avoid being overturned and crushed by the high winds. Urban drivers should leave their vehicles and seek shelter indoors.

While at home, the basement affords you and your family (including all pets) the greatest safety. Whenever possible, take cover under a heavy table or workbench. If no basement is available, go into a windowless room in the center of the house. If that's not possible, take cover against an inside wall, stay away from windows and cover yourself with a rug to protect yourself from flying glass and debris.
