The varsity teams traveled to Chilicothe Friday, February 10 for tune-up games before Bi-District playoffs. The girls won 72 to 59.

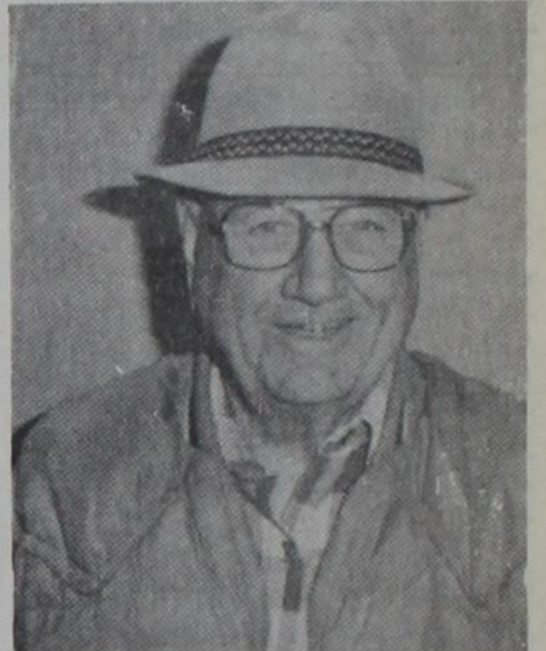

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Wheeler Independent School District was held at 6:30 p.m. in the Board Room with Mr. Jim Wright presiding and all members present except Mr. Ware.

- 1. Motion by Mrs. Hennard, seconded by Mr. Ledbetter to approve the minutes of the two previous meetings. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Motion by Mr. Gill, seconded by Mrs. Hennard to approve the January accounts as presented except the Wheeler School Payroll. Motion carried unanimously.
3. Motion by Mrs. Hennard, seconded by Mr. Gill to approve the Wheeler School Payroll with Mr. Morrison, Mr. Wright, and Mr. Ledbetter abstaining. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Motion by Mr. Morrison, seconded by Mr. Ledbetter to call a school board election on May 6, 1989, to fill places 6 and 7 and give Mr. Wilson the authority to take the proper legal steps to see that it is held. Motion carried unanimously.
5. Motion by Mr. Ledbetter, seconded by Mr. Morrison, to re-employ Mr. Ronnie Karcher as driver education instructor and charge students \$125.00 each. Motion carried unanimously.
6. Motion by Mr. Ledbetter, seconded by Mr. Wills to appoint the following as members of the 1988-89 textbook committee: Nancy Hampton, Becky Hardcastle, Mickey Porter, Billy Wiggins, Ed Richardson, Cecil Thomas, Rhonda Blanchard, Elaine Martin, Doyle Wilson, Clayton Neal, and Thomas Helton. Motion carried unanimously.
7. Motion by Mr. Wills, seconded by Mr. Morrison to hold the March Board meeting on March 20, 1989, at 6:30 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
8. Motion by Mr. Ledbetter, seconded by Mr. Gill to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board re-convened into open session at 7:38 p.m.
8. Motion by Mr. Wills, seconded by Mr. Morrison to re-employ Mr. Ronnie Karcher as athletic director for the 89-90 school year at the same salary as the 88-89 school year. Additional benefits will be discussed at a later date. Motion carried unanimously.

The board went into open session. Greg Estes stated the board would prepare any decision on the Level III grievance at this time.

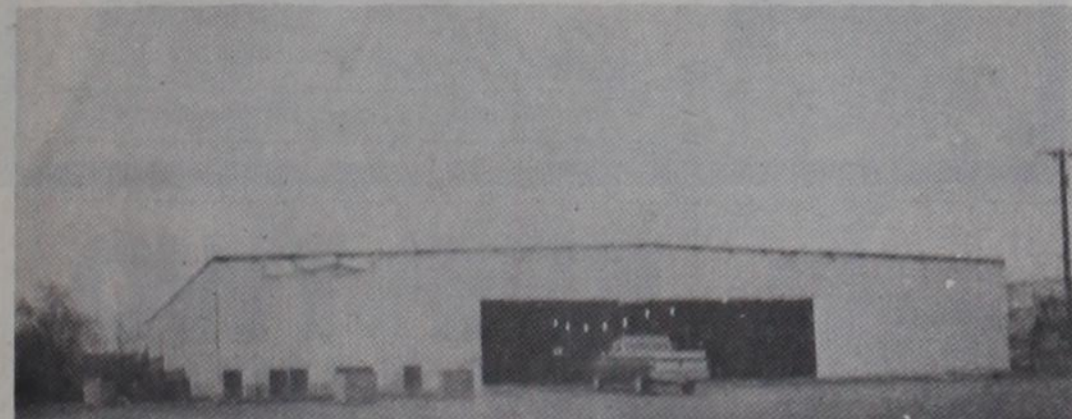
The board went into executive session under Article 6252-17, Sec 2(g).

I still love all of you, Becky.

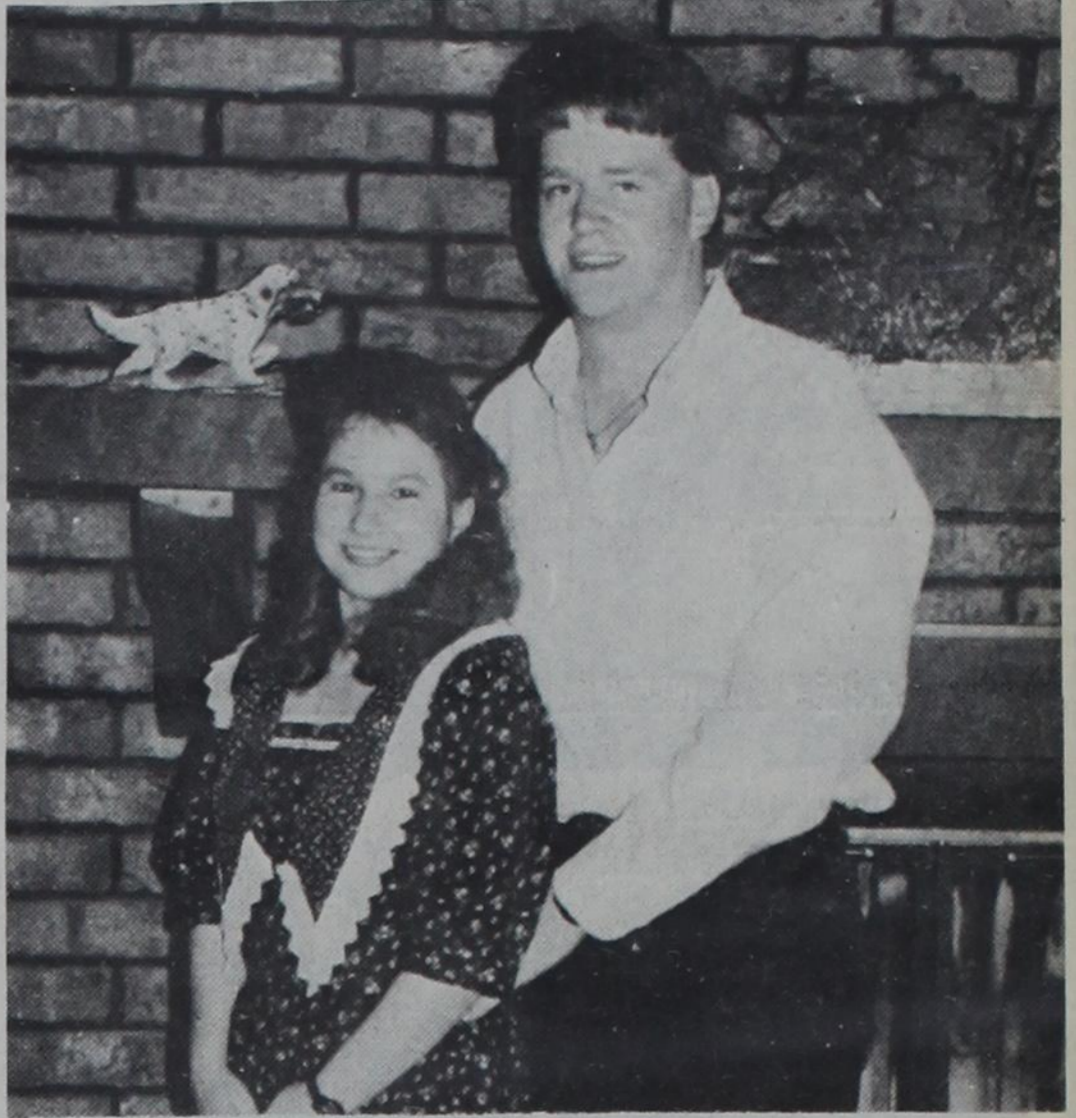

**AT&T ANNOUNCES PRICE CHANGES FOR LONG DISTANCE CALLS WITHIN TEXAS**

AT&T announces April 1, 1989, price changes for Long Distance Service (MTS) within Texas. AT&T's prices for long distance calling within Texas will be increased by two cents per minute for calls under 82 miles in distance and one cent per minute for calls that are 82 miles or greater in distance. AT&T's current discounts of 25% for evening calls and 40% for night and weekend calls will remain in effect. The price increases are expected to produce approximately \$22.8 million, which is nearly 2.9% of AT&T's annual revenues for Texas Long Distance Service.

This represents the first AT&T price increase for long distance calls within Texas. AT&T's long distance prices for calls within Texas have been reduced overall by about 12% since 1986.

The Long Distance Service price changes will also impact AT&T's PRO<sup>SM</sup> WATS Texas offering, which offers subscribers a 10% discount on all long distance calls within Texas. These price changes are expected to produce approximately \$661,000, or about 3.5% of the annual revenues for AT&T's PRO<sup>SM</sup> WATS Texas offering.

Prices for AT&T's REACH OUT<sup>®</sup> Texas offering will also change. The price for initial hour usage will increase from \$12.55 to \$12.95; the additional hour price will increase from \$11.40 to \$12.00. These price increases are expected to produce approximately \$364,000, or about 2.1% of the annual revenues for AT&T's REACH OUT<sup>®</sup> Texas offering.

AT&T's tariffs implementing these changes will be filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas on March 1, 1989, with an effective date of April 1, 1989. The combined price increases are expected to produce approximately \$23.9 million, which is approximately 2.4% of AT&T's annual revenues for all Texas intrastate services.

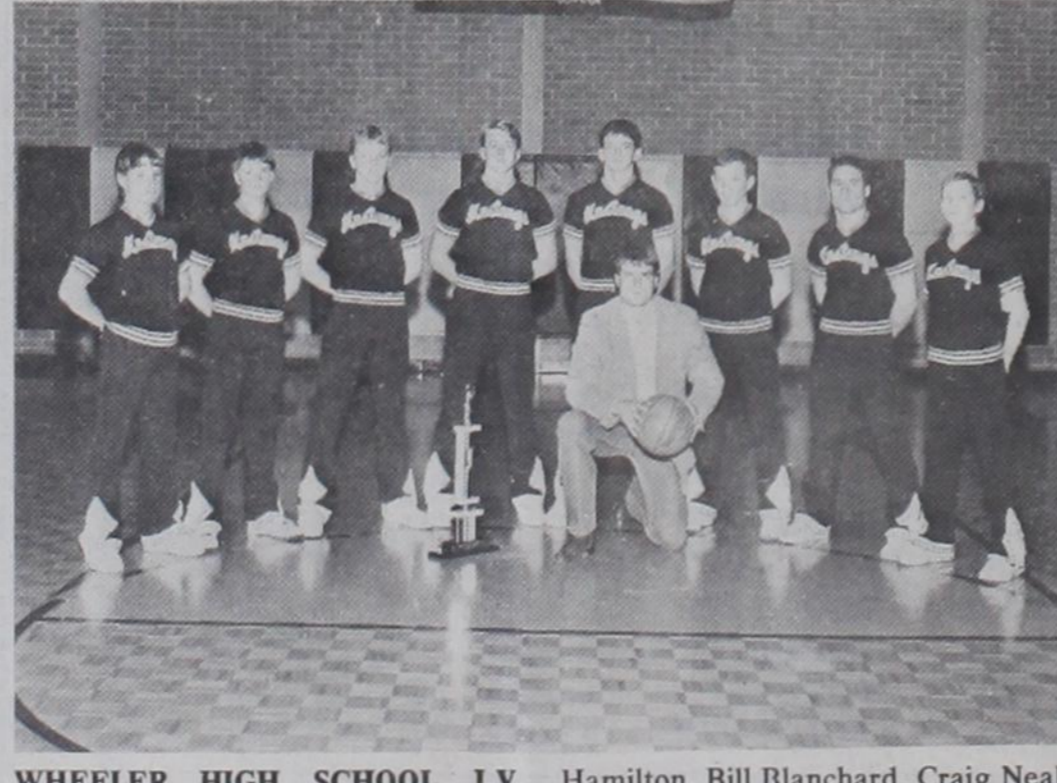

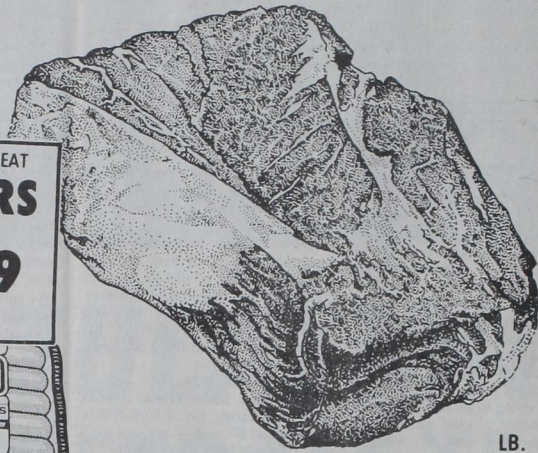
