## PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS AVAILABLE FOR DISABLED VETERANS

Veterans with a service-connected disability can receive property tax relief in 1996 by filling out a
simple exemption form at the Wheeler County Appraisal District office. Applications must be filed by April 30, 1996.

Proof documentation must be provided to qualify. A letter from the Veterans Administration or the branch of service in which the veteran served is sufficient if percentage of disability is listed. However, depending on the applicant, proof of marriage, death or age may also be required

The amount of exemption is based on the veteran's percentage of disability and ranges from $\$ 5,000$ to $\$ 12,000$. This exemption can be applied to any one taxable property the Texas veteran owned on January lst.
The following taxpayers are eligible: A disabled veteran, a surviving (unmarried) spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, a surviving minor child of a deceased disabled veteran (with qualifications), a surviving spouse of a person killed on active duty and a surviving minor child of
duty (with qualifications).
