



## Candler To Enter Teaching Hall of Fame

Longtime Fort Sumner teacher Nell Candler was inducted in to the South Eastern New Mexico Teachers Hall of Fame in ceremonies May 4 at 10 a.m. at the Sally Port Inn in Roswell.

Candler, who spent 34 of her 40 teaching years with Fort Sumner Schools, was presented by Mrs. Ethel Achen, a 1981 recipient of the Hall of Fame award. Following the induction, Candler was presented a memory book of pictures, accolades and letters from friends, former teachers, school personnel and former students, telling of the ways she enriched their lives.

Candler is being honored for her constant renewal of teaching curricula and her innovative methods of instilling leadership in her students. She will be commended for her work as chairman of the local Hall of Fame committee by attending state and district National Education Association assemblies, as a delegate to the state assembly and as a delegate to the South East Regional Council.

Candler, who graduated as the valedictorian of her high school class, was twice the recipient of the Coe Foundation Fellowship, helping teachers coordinate American heritage into the basic curriculum. For many years, Candler was a member of the American Association of Universities, helping women develop leadership training and the language arts. As a member of the International Reading Council, she kept abreast of modern trends in reading education.

She has a lifetime membership in PTA, Beta Sigma Phi and the New Mexico and National NEA. She received honors for her work as a Brownie leader and was active in 4-H. To her honor is her devotion to teaching Sunday school classes in the Church of Christ. Too numerous to list are the certificates of appreciation, honors and commendations from her peers.

Along with the induction into the Teachers Hall of Fame, Candler will be remembered for the support of, and her untiring work in community activities, social, special clubs and school organizations.

## TAXPAYER PROTEST PERIOD BEGINS

Property owners in the Wheeler County Appraisal District who are subject to local advalorem taxes may now protest or challenge the appraised value of taxable properties

for the 1996 tax year. The protest period officially began Friday, May 24th, when the appraisal district mailed "Notices of Appraised Value" to all taxpayers of record. The final day of the official protest period is June 26th. This gives taxpayers 30 days to file a formal protest according to state law.

According to Chief Appraiser, Larry Schoenhals, many values are settled each year without the need to file a formal protest. Taxpayers who have questions about their appraised values should contact the appraisal office and provide all the information they have concerning the property in

As a litle shaver, livin in the Texas Panhandle, I recall the years they called the seven year drouth. Year after year you would see the farmers and ranchmen shake their heads and wonder how they would make another year without crops or grass. Many thousands of them didnt. 

Congratulations to Jackie May and Pat Kennedy on their marriage in Amarillo Saturday, May 25th.


Nancy Shelton would like to thank the Briscoe and Allison fire departments for responding to the fire on her land. Thanks to their quick response only about 10 acres were damaged.

# Deadline for Filing Protests

#### Usual Deadline

The 1996 deadline is June 26th, (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides

Late profests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

If you believe the appraisal district, or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to

\*The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

#### Special Duties

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.



If the appraisal district and the taxpayer cannot agree as to the taxable value of a property, the taxpayer may file a written protest to the Appraisal Review Board (ARB). 1995 ARB protest hearings have been scheduled for July 17th (mineral/industrial) and July 18th (real estate/personal property).

The ARB is an independent panel of citizens responsible for hearing and settling protests from property owners who disagree with some action by the appraisal district. Property owners who protest their valuation must not attempt to contact ARB members outside the formal hearing. Each property owner who files a written protest must sign an affidavit stating that no such contact has occurred before a hearing can begin.

Schoenhals said that property owners would no longer receive a notice of appraised value for mineral or business property valued at under \$500 unless there is a cumulative factor within an entity. Property owners with address/legal description corrections, and those with questions should call the appraisal district at 826-5900.
