7. Don't give too much imports. 8. Don t give too much importance to
the term "natural ingredients". Th the word is often abused. 9. Look out for other misleading words such as "amazing", "secret", "painless", "discovery"
through", "exclusive", "immediate", "quiclusive", "or "fastest". immediate " "quick", or "fast".
