

The symposium, at the University The 1989 Wheeler County Exten- with her husband, Wilber, and her of Texas campus, is an annual event sponsored by the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation (TAERF). The foundation is composed of 10 electric utilities in Texas, including sps. Although SPS does not own or operate a nuclear power plant, the company's membership in TAERF reflects its commitment to many kinds of energy research.

The four day symposium, featuring a keynote address by NASA astronaut Kathryn Sullivan, was packed with tours and presentations on such subjects as fusion, a form of nuclear power, and the "greenhouse effect," a term that refers to heat becoming trapped in the Earth's atmosphere.

A highlight of the symposium was a tour of the university's Fusion Research Center and its tokamak, a machine that uses magnetic fields to attempt to confine the fusion reaction. The tour was especially noteworthy in light of recent experiments in so-called "cold fusion," a process that purportedly uses room-temperature liquids to create fusion. Prior to these experiments, whose results have yet to be verified, fusion was believed

From the Minister's Desk:

There was a general store in a small Kansas community that was owned and operated by a man of unquestionable honesty. In the store, there was a wooden counter which had two brass tacks nailed in the top of the counter. These two tacks, which were supposedly 36 inches apart, were used to measure merchandise that was sold by the vard.

After operating the general store for several years, this highly principled man died, leaving the store to his son. His son was determined to operate the store as honestly as his father had. But when he assumed the operation of the store, he discovered that his father had unknowingly been dishonest.

He discovered that the two brass tacks on the counter were 35 inches apart not 36 inches. With this discovery, the young man was confronted by an important decision. If he moved the tacks, he would openly acknowledge that his father had been wrong, tarnishing his father's reputation for honesty. But if he did not move the tacks, he would be quilty of a sin that his father never committed-knowingly selling merchandise that was an inch too short. His father never knew that he was wrong, but his son did. You and I can often find ourselves in similar dilemmas. As we conscientiously read and study the Bible, we often discover that we have been taught wrong by deceased loved ones whom we highly respected. These people were honest and sincere, but their knowledge and practice of the Bible was wrong.

Olaf L. Rankin


Mr. O.L. Rankin, 78, was born September 28, 1910 and entered into rest June 4, 1989.
