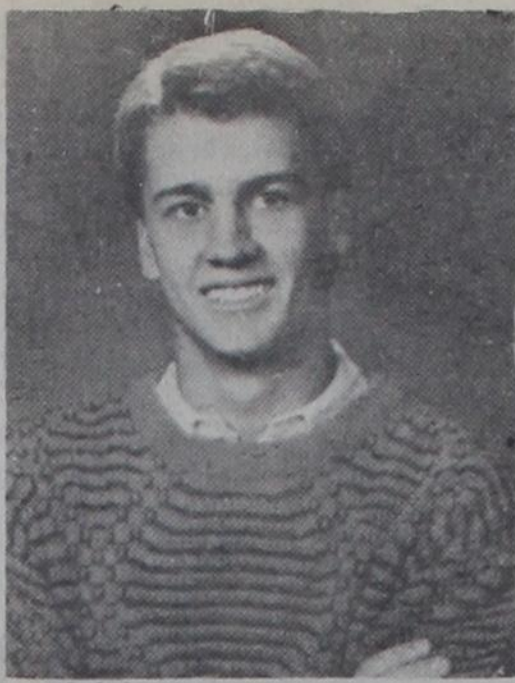

Mustang Drop And Talent Show June 9

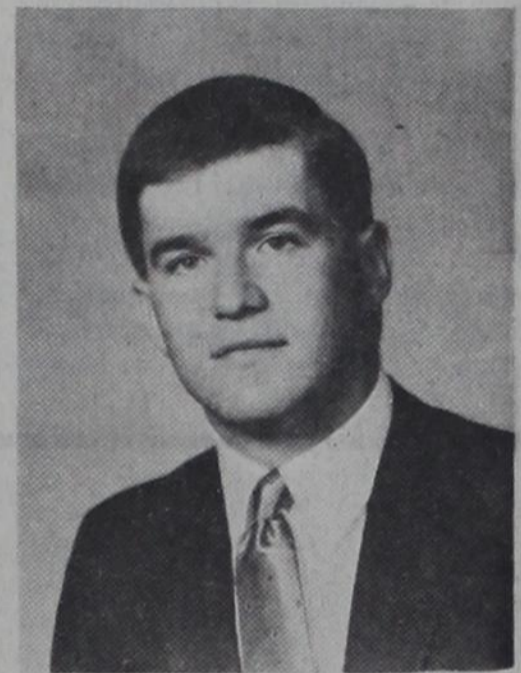

I did have to use the "board of education", a 1' by 4' about 4 feet long, to enforce discipline, the No. 1 essential, in my opinion, for education. I have taught in a school where "self-discipline" let me put the "board" aside.

In 1941, I resigned as principal of Progress School near Muleshoe and joined the US Navy. As a Yeoman, 2nd class, I earned more money in the Navy. When I went on reserve in 1945 as a Lt. From The Minister's Desk:

Preachers often have some extremely amusing things said to them. For example--

"One of these days you are going to be a good little preacher."

The implication of this statement is that it is exclusively the fault of the preacher or the sermon if the listener went to sleep. Apparently the possibility is not considered that the fault lies not with the preacher or with the sermon, but with the listener.

This article is not an attempt to lessen the obligation of a preacher to present well prepared sermons in an effective manner. But it needs to be emphasized that the listener also has the responsibility to listen with a receptive heart.

There are several New Testament texts which emphasize the importance of listening. For example, Luke 8:18 says: "Take care how you listen--". Mark 4:9 says: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." And James 1:19 says:

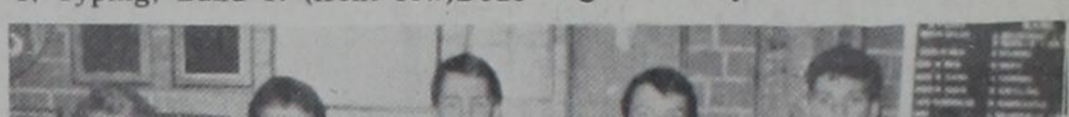

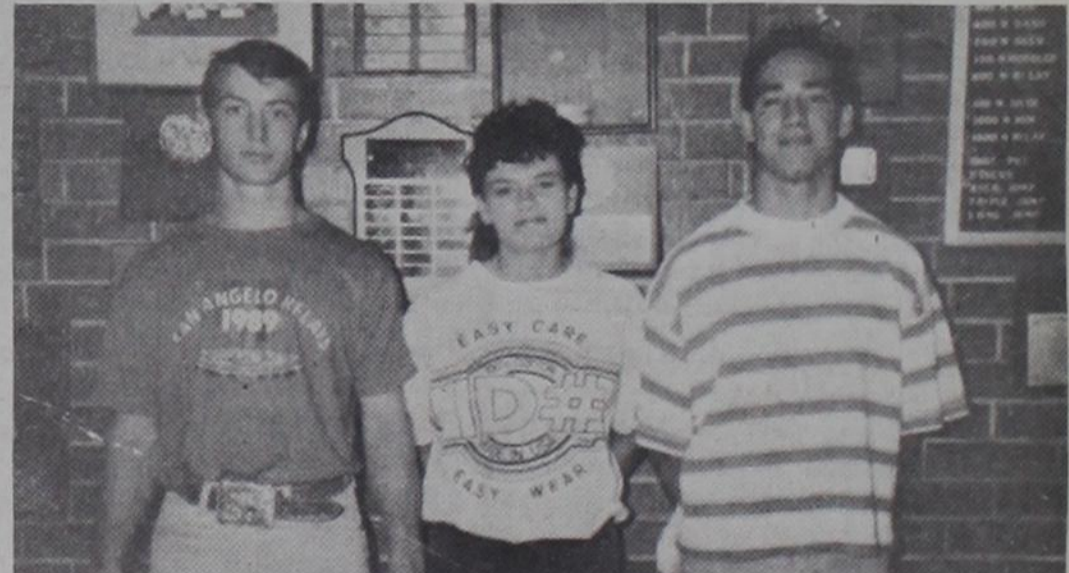
