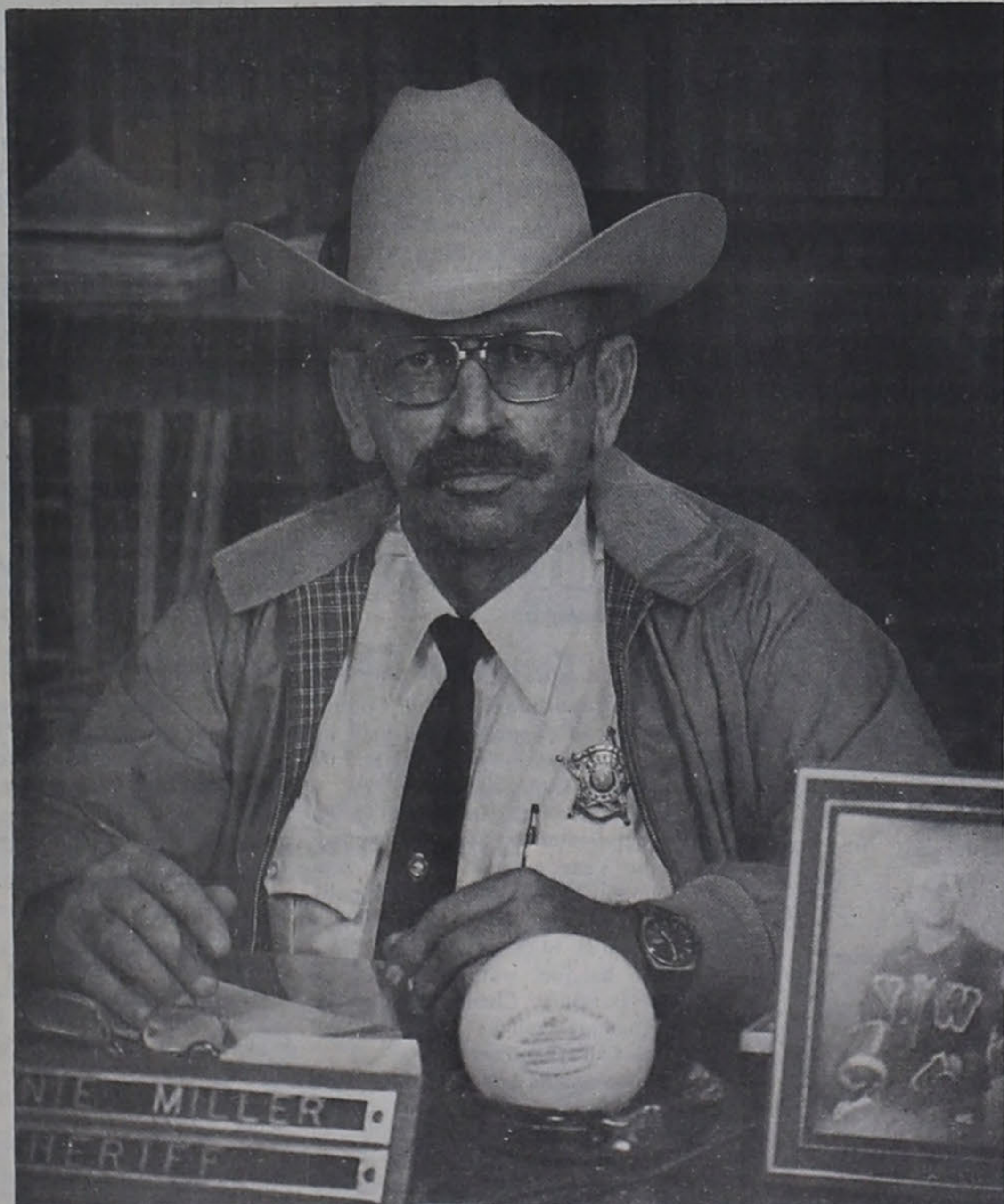

Anytime you need advise, don't take a chance, call me. As your sheriff, it is my responsibility to prevent a crime, if possible, as to catch a criminal after the act.
