First, I want to introduce myself. My name is Theresa Klinger. I'm 17 years old and an exchange student from Germany. I spent 4 weeks in Texas, one week in Amarillo at the Jimmy Ross Youth Camp, and 3 weeks at the Kuntz's home in Wheeler. The first week I spent with 15 other exchange students from all over the world with the Lions International Club in Amarillo. We did a lot of fun things and have seen and learned a lot about this country. We went to the Panhandle Museum, saw the musical "Texas", walked through Palo Duro Canyon, rode a horse, went shopping and had a lot of fun together.

The next 3 weeks, I spent with Charles & Margaret Kuntz in a little village called Wheeler. Although it is a little village, I had a lot of fun. My Texas family took care of me as if I was one of their own children. They showed me how to live in Texas, and how to live in Wheeler. I've seen some

"real Texas things" like the oil stations, the feed yards (with real Texas Longhorns), and windmills. I also have done some "real Texas things" like shooting a gun (but only at flying targets), training dogs, riding horses, and going Uptown. I saw the biggest pickup I've ever seen and took a ride in it. It was taller than me and I had a problem getting into it. I also took my first ride on an inner tube at the lake. It was one of the funniest things I've ever done.

I met a lot of young people Uptown and really got close to some of them. They taught me how young people celebrate and have fun in Texas.

I just want to thank the Lions Club for giving me the chance to come here. It was one of the most impressive things I've ever been allowed to do. I learned about this country, the culture and the people. Some of them will stay in my heart forever. Thank you.

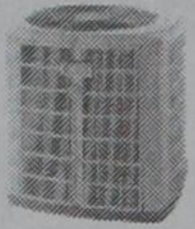

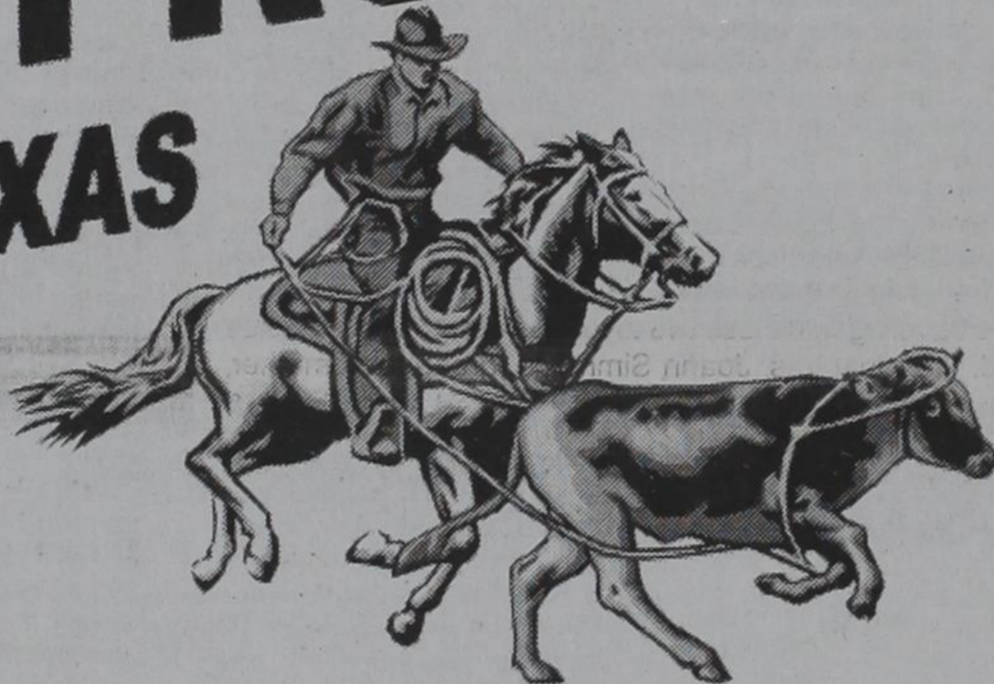

Water. Your Body is made up of mostly of water. Approximately 85% of your brain, 80% of your blood and 70% of your muscle is water. Every cell in your body needs water to live. You can see how important water is to you.

discovered that the location that was selected for the Wheeler Substation was in an area that allowed water to stand because of poor drainage. A new site for the proposed Wheeler Substation was selected approximately .3 of a mile west of the original location. SPS is providing notice of the new application.

SPS is proposing to construct a single-circuit, 115-kilovolt (kV) electric transmission line between the new Wheeler Substation, located approximately 2,000 feet west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 83 and County Road Q on the north side of County Road Q and the new Howard Substation located approximately 917 feet due south of the intersection of South Osage and FM 2473, directly east of the Wheeler Cemetery. The line will be built using single-pole, self-supporting steel structures. Depending on which route is ultimately selected, the proposed project would be approximately 7 miles long and located entirely within Wheeler County, Texas. Depending on the route selected, the total estimated cost of the project, including the transmission line and substation costs, is \$13,720,014.

The proposed transmission line is presented with a preferred route and two alternate routes consisting of a combined five segments and is estimated to be approximately 7 miles in length. The proposed 115 kV single circuit transmission line would be constructed utilizing single-pole steel structures requiring a smaller surface area and eliminating the use of guy wires for dead-end and corner structures. The steel structures would also increase the line reliability and decrease normal maintenance costs of using wood structures and also greatly lessen exposure to damages from range fires. Except for the areas that are double circuit, the proposed transmission line will be constructed on new right-of-way consisting of a proposed easement width of 60 feet. There are two areas where the proposed 115 kV transmission line will become double circuit with existing SPS transmission lines:

(1) [230 kV transmission line (Circuit K54)] The proposed line runs parallel with Circuit K54 along County Road Q until the road dead ends at the northeast corner of Section 28, then the line

parallels Circuit K54 along the section line and becomes double circuit with K54 for approximately 0.5 miles in order to avoid an extremely large grove of trees. SPS attempted to minimize constructing double circuit with Circuit K54 due to the critical nature of the line serving Public Service of Oklahoma and the safety issues involved with performing maintenance or emergency work on one circuit when the other is energized.

(2) [69 kV transmission line (Circuit Y62)] The proposed 115 kV transmission line becomes double circuit with Circuit Y62 for 735 feet in order for both circuits to follow the outer edge of the cemetery and enter Howard Substation. By becoming double circuit with Circuit Y62 into Howard Substation, this allows for future transmission access into Howard Substation.

The new Wheeler Substation will be designed to accommodate two 230 kV transmission line terminals, a 230/115 kV - 250 MVA autotransformer and one 115 kV transmission line terminal. This line is not designed or intended to carry the full output of the 230/115 kV transformer. This transformer is sized for possible future 115 kV lines being served from the Wheeler Substation 115 kV bus. Wheeler Substation will be served with a 230 kV source from SPS's existing transmission line Circuit K54 in Wheeler County. The Wheeler Substation site is located approximately 2,000 feet west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 83 and County Road Q. The substation location is on the north side of County Road Q about 200 feet north of the existing 230 kV Circuit K54 which is located on the south side of County Road Q. The 230 kV line will be tapped and brought into Wheeler Substation utilizing steel structures for the in-and-out lines. The Wheeler Substation site was determined by the accessibility of paved roads for transporting equipment and for emergency operations. Alternative substation site locations would have required the construction of several miles of all-weather road for access. The new 115 kV transmission line will be constructed from Wheeler Substation to the new Howard Substation located in Wheeler County. The new Howard Substation will consist of one 115 kV transmission line terminal, a 115/69 kV - 40/46 MVA autotransformer, a 115/13.2 kV - 10 MVA transformer, and two 69 kV transmission line terminals.

The existing Grave Substation would have been the terminus for the proposed project; however, SPS determined that the Grave Substation was inadequate and that a new site for the substation was necessary for several reasons. SPS required 8.0 acres for the substation, but the Grave Substation sits on only 1.15 acres. An 8.0-acre site will accommodate future expansion of the substation and also will allow enough room to set up mobile substations for maintenance or in the event of emergency switching conditions. An expansion of the Grave Substation is not possible due to limitations of existing development features including the proximity of existing roads and other obstructions. Grave Substation is bound on the west side by South Osage Road, on the south side by FM 2473, on the east side by a large, above-ground tank, and on the north side by a residence. Although, all property owners adjacent to the Grave Substation were contacted in an attempt to expand the existing site, there were complications in acquiring property—either due to no interest in selling or an inflated purchase price. Upon completion of this project, the load from the Grave Substation will be transferred to the new Howard Substation located approximately 2,000 feet to the south and at that time, the Grave Substation will be dismantled. Figure 3.1 illustrates the area surrounding the Grave Substation and the new Howard Substation and details the proposed changes. The Greenbelt Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Greenbelt) 69 kV transmission line will be terminated into the new Howard Substation as illustrated by Figure 3.1 with the work to be performed by SPS and coordinated with Greenbelt.

**Route 1 – Line Segments A, B, and C (The Preferred Route).** This route consists of approximately 7 miles of a new single circuit 115 kV transmission line from

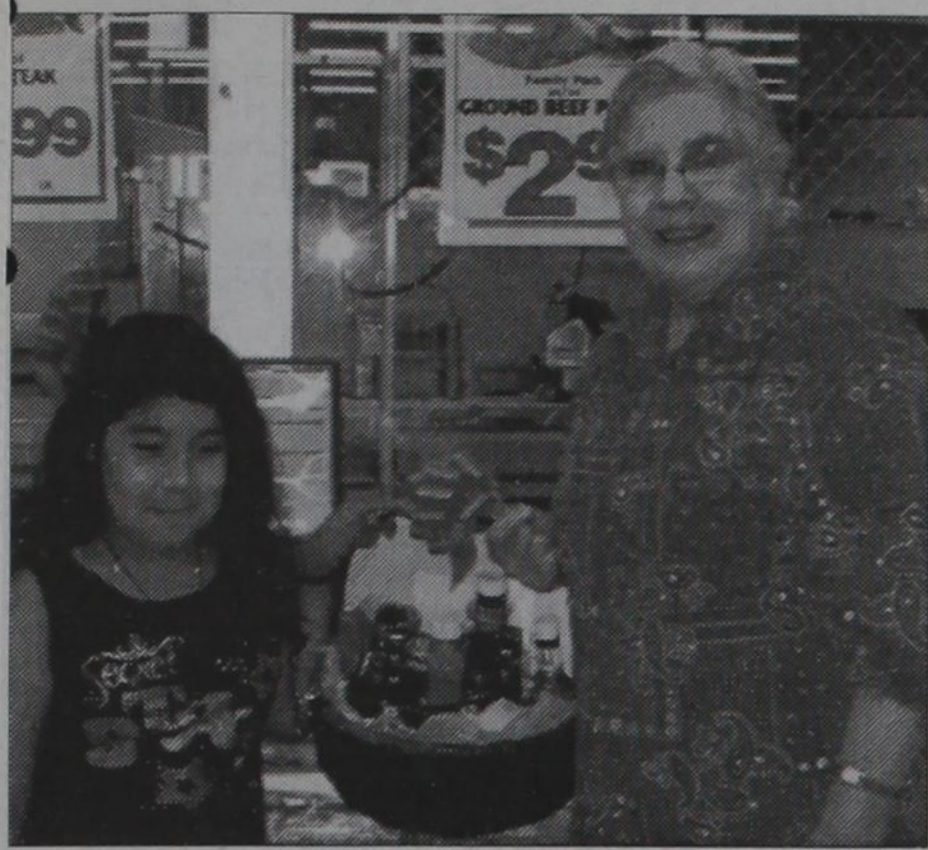

## New Traffic Laws Set To Go Into Effect On September 1

HB 2730 is the DPS's Sunset Legislation, and many of the DPS-related bills this session were included in HB 2730. Notable traffic and criminal laws that go into effect on Sept. 1 (unless otherwise indicated) include:

**Seatbelts:**  
HB 537 requires all occupants of a vehicle, no matter their age, to be secured by a safety belt, no matter where they are seated in the vehicle; changes the definition of a passenger vehicle to include a passenger van designed to transport 15 or fewer passengers including the driver; removes the current exemption for third-party Medicaid transportation provisions regarding the use of child passenger safety seats; and prohibits a motorcycle operator from carrying a passenger under the age of 5 unless the child is seated in a sidecar attached to the motorcycle.

SB 61 amends the existing statute regarding child passenger safety seats. The bill requires that any child younger than 8 years of age be restrained in an approved

## SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

1. Always TAKE A FRIEND when walking or riding your bike to and from school. It's safer and more fun to be with your friends. Walk and ride in well-lit areas, and never take short cuts. Follow all the bicycle rules, especially the one about riding on the right side of the street.
2. Stay with a group while waiting at the bus stop. If anyone bothers you while going to or from school, get away from that person, and TELL a trusted adult like your parents or teacher. If an adult approaches you for help or directions, remember grownups needing help should not ask children for help; they should ask other adults.
3. If someone you don't know or feel comfortable with offers you a ride, say NO. Never hitchhike, and only accept a ride from someone if your parents have told you it is okay.
4. If someone follows you on foot, get away from him or her as quickly as you can. If someone follows you in a car, turn around and go in the other direction. Always be sure to TELL your parents or a trusted adult what happened.
5. If someone tries to take you somewhere, quickly get away and yell, "This person is trying to take me away!" or "This person is not my father (mother)!"
6. Never leave school with someone you don't feel comfortable with or know. Always CHECK FIRST with your parents or another trusted adult. If someone you don't know or feel comfortable with tells you that there is an emergency and they want you to go with them, always CHECK FIRST before you do anything. Make sure you TELL a trusted adult if you notice someone you don't know hanging around.
7. Leave items and clothing with your name on them at home. If someone you don't know calls out your name, don't be fooled or confused.
8. If you want to change your plans after school, always CHECK FIRST with your parents. Never play in parks, malls, or video arcades by yourself. Make sure you have your parents' permission, and they know where you are going to be. Never accept money or gifts from anyone until you CHECK FIRST with your parents.
9. If you go home alone after school, check to see that everything is okay before you go in. Once inside, call your parents to let them know that you are okay. Make sure you follow your "Home Alone" rules of keeping the door locked; not opening the door or talking to anyone who stops by unless the person is a trusted family friend or relative, you feel comfortable being alone with that person, and the visit has been preapproved by your parents; and not telling people who call that you are home alone. Have a neighbor or trusted adult that you can call if you're scared or there's an emergency.
10. Trust your feelings. If someone makes you feel scared or uncomfortable, get away as fast as you can and TELL a trusted adult. You deserve to feel safe, and you should keep asking until you get the help you need.

2010. Police officers are allowed to issue a warning before that date.

**Driving:**  
HB 55 makes it illegal to use a wireless communication device in a school zone unless the vehicle is stopped or a hands-free device is used. Cities or counties wanting to enforce this law must post a sign at the beginning of each school zone to inform drivers that using a wireless communications device is prohibited and the operator is subject to a fine. It is a defense to prosecution if the operator was making an emergency call.

HB 2730 increases the penalties for driving while intoxicated with a child passenger by adding an automatic driver license suspension period for first-time offenders and an increased suspension period for repeat offenders. The driver license re-instatement fee for completing an education program will rise from \$50 to \$100. Closes a loophole so a person who commits an offense as a minor cannot circumvent the driver license penalty if the person turns 21 before their court date.

HB 2730 allows a new Texas resident to operate a vehicle without a Texas license for 90 days instead of the current 30. (This provision went into effect on June 19, 2009.)

HB 2012 creates two new punishment enhancements: a Class B misdemeanor if a person drives with a suspended license and without insurance; and a class A misdemeanor if the person driving without insurance or a valid driver license has an accident and someone is seriously injured or dies as a result of that accident.

SB 129 authorizes neighborhood electric vehicles (NEVs) to be operated on roads with a posted speed limit of 45 miles per hour or less. The bill authorizes driver license holders to operate NEVs without having a motorcycle endorsement, clarifies that drivers and passengers in such vehicles are not required to wear helmets and specifies that enclosed three-wheeled vehicles as described in the bill are authorized to operate in preferential lanes.

**Concealed handgun:**  
HB 2730 amends numerous provisions regarding concealed handgun licenses (CHLs), including eliminating student loan defaults as a disqualifier, to clarify that DPS must suspend or revoke a license when the licensee becomes ineligible and mandating that a magistrate suspend a CHL held by the subject of an emergency protective order.

HB 2664 provides a defense to prosecution if a concealed handgun license holder carries a concealed handgun into an establishment that gets 51 percent or more of its income from the sale of alcoholic beverages, but has failed to post the statutorily required notice that it derives 51 percent

or more of its income from the sale of alcoholic beverages. (Under current law, a concealed handgun licensee can be charged with a Class A misdemeanor for doing this.)

HB 2730 removes DPS authority to suspend a concealed handgun license (CHL) for the holder's failure to display the CHL to a peace officer on demand. It removes associated penalties and suspensions for the failure to display.

**Driver license:**  
HB 2730 requires that all applicants under the age of 18 take the driving skills exam to receive a driver license. The law also requires that a provisional driver license (under 18) or instruction permit expire on an individual's 18th birthday, removes the requirement that a provisional driver license or instruction permit be renewed annually and increases the fee for those licenses from \$5 to \$15. It also extends the current phase-two restrictions for holders of a graduated driver license from 6 months to 1 year. These restrictions include limited night driving, prohibited use of wireless communication devices and a limited number of passengers.

HB 339 increases the total hours of behind-the-wheel driving instruction a teen receives from 14 to 34 and creates an adult driver education requirement for applicants older than 18 and younger than 21.

SB 1317 creates a six-hour driver education course required for driver license applicants 18 years of age or older. It also mandates that applicants 25 or under must submit to an approved driver education course. (Goes into effect March 1, 2010.)

SB 328 gives DPS the power to suspend a minor's driver license if they fail a breath or blood alcohol test while operating a watercraft. Chapter 524 of the Transportation Code also clearly defines the suspension period for an individual who was under the age of 21 at the time when the offense of boating under the influence or driving under the influence of alcohol occurred. The law also increases the reinstatement fee for a license suspended under sections 49.04-49.08, Penal Code from \$50 to \$100.

HB 2730 increases the driver license sanction from a one-year CDL license disqualification to a lifetime disqualification if a person uses a motor vehicle to transport, conceal or harbor an alien. If a child is engaged in conduct involving a severe form of trafficking persons, a judge at a juvenile hearing is required to order the juvenile's driver license or permit to be suspended.

HB 2730 prohibits DPS from issuing a driver license or identification card to a person who has not established a domicile in Texas. The law specifies that an applicant may receive a driver license at a post office box only if the applicant's residence address has also been provided, with some exceptions.

**Crime:**  
HB 558 allows minors to be charged with public intoxication.

HB 2386 allows courts to immediately seal juvenile criminal records if the juvenile successfully completes a drug court program, or another special program ordered by the court.

HB 1282 makes it a Class B misdemeanor to steal a driver license, commercial driver license or personal identification.

SB 554 makes it illegal to own or possess dog-fighting equipment and establishes that such equipment and property where dogs are found to be engaged in dog fighting is contraband and is subject to forfeiture. The law also makes dog-fighting subject to the elevated penalties authorized in the Texas Penal Code, Section 71.02(a), in an effort to deter organized criminal activity.

HB 1813 makes it a third-degree felony to tamper with forensic, medical, chemical, toxicological and ballistic reports, as well as reports of certification, inspection or maintenance of instru-

Sept. 1, the minimum amount is removed. The bill requires the Texas Department of Insurance to prescribe a standard proof of health insurance for issuance to persons who are at least 21 years of age and covered by an applicable health insurance plan. The law also increases the penalty for failure to yield the right-of-way if there is a crash that results in injury to a person other than the motorcycle operator.

**Vehicle inspection:**  
SB 589 requires that a vehicle equipment safety compliance label be placed on a windshield, side or rear window stating that the window tinting complies with the appropriate provisions of the

Transportation Code. Failing to place the required label on the vehicle could lead to a \$1,000 fine.

**Miscellaneous:**  
HB 2730 increases the fine for a parking violation at the state Capitol from \$10 to \$25, and increases the late fee from \$2 to \$5. SB 1188 authorizes a Texas resident to buy firearms, ammunition or firearms accessories in any other state, not just those contiguous to Texas, to reflect updated federal statutes.

## Got Headache?

Nearly everyone has had a headache, and most of us have had many. A minor headache is little more than a nuisance that's relieved by an over-the-counter pain reliever, some food or coffee, or a short rest. But if your headache is severe or unusual, you might worry about stroke, a tumor, or a blood clot. Fortunately, such problems are rare. Still, you should know when a headache needs urgent care and how to control the vast majority of headaches that are not threatening to your health.

**Not brain pain**  
Doctors don't fully understand what causes neck out of 10 headaches. But the blood vessels in the head and neck can signal pain, as can the tissues that surround the brain and some major nerves that originate in the brain. The scalp, sinuses, teeth, and muscles and joints of the neck can also cause head pain.

**When to worry**  
You can take care of many types of headaches by yourself, and your doctor can give you medication to control most of the tougher one but some headaches call for prompt medical care. Here are some warning signs:

- Headaches that first develop after age 50
- A major change in the pattern of your headaches
- An unusually severe "worst headache ever"
- Pain that increases with coughing or movement
- Changes in personality or mental function
- Headaches that are accompanied by fever, stiff neck, confusion, decreased alertness or memory, or neurological symptoms such as visual disturbances, slurred speech, weakness, numbness, or seizures
- Headaches that are accompanied by a painful red eye
- Headaches that are accompanied by pain and tenderness near the temples
- Headaches after a blow to the head
- Headaches that prevent normal daily activities
- Headaches that come on abruptly, especially if they wake you up
- Headaches in patients with cancer or impaired immune systems

**Living with headaches**  
For most of us, an occasional headache is nothing more than a temporary speed bump in the course of a busy day. Even so, most of us can ease the problem with simple lifestyle measures and nonprescription medications. But for some of us, headaches are a big problem. Learn to recognize warning signs that call for prompt medical care. And don't fall into the trap of overusing medications; for some of us, rebound headaches are the biggest pain of all.

ments used to examine or test physical evidence. (Currently, someone who does this can only be charged with a state jail felony.)

HB 358 allows law enforcement authorities to store only a small part of gambling machines that have been seized, instead of storing the whole machine. They would be able to remove and store just the computer chips in gambling machines, which are the core of the machines and contain the information necessary for prosecutions to go forward.

**Registered sex offenders:**  
SB 689 restricts Internet usage by certain registered sex offenders, and requires registered sex offenders to provide information about their e-mail addresses when they register.

**Motorcycles etc.:**  
Senate Bill 1967 requires that applicants for an original class M license or class A, B or C driver license (including commercial driver licenses and permits) with authorization to operate a motorcycle, provide evidence of completion of an approved motorcycle operator training course. It also repeals the helmet exemption sticker program. Current law requires a person be covered with a minimum of \$10,000 in health

insurance for injuries incurred in a motorcycle accident to be eligible for an exception for the offense of operating or riding a motorcycle without a helmet. As of
