home economics. Afterwards, the study group will
reconvene, hear task force reports, and discuss how these issues impact Ind social welfare.
In 1986 , the task force on agriculture identified agricultural profitabil

Property Tax Exemptions for Disabled Veterans

## Veterans with a service-connect ed disability can receive property tax

 ed disabiity can receive property taxrelief in 1990 by filling out a simple
exemption form at the Local County exemption form at the Local County
Appraisal District office, Chief Appraisal District office, Chief
Appraiser Larry M. Schoenhals said.
The amount of exemption is based on the veteran's percentage of servic - connected disability and can range
from $\$ 1,500$ to $\$ 3,000$. Schoenhals explained who is eligible for the
