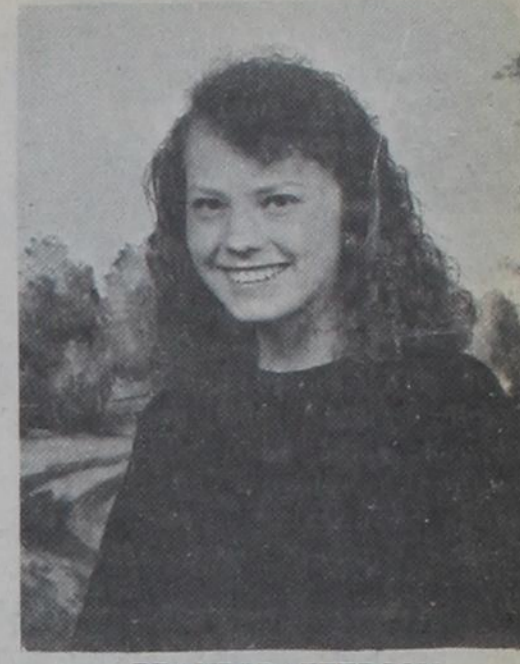

Chemical-Free Graduation Party

A planning session for the chemical-free graduation party was held at Wheeler High School, May 10, 1990. At this time, committees were named and plans were put in motion for area schools to attend. Representatives from Allison, Kelton, Mobeetie, Shamrock, and Wheeler were present to make suggestions to honor their graduating seniors with a party.

Project Graduation was conceived to provide an alcohol-free alternative to traditional drinking parties. Far too often the future potential of young adult lives and the happiness of special events have been marred by the tragedy of drinking-and-driving accidents. By providing this alternative, we hope to prevent such tragedies.

The chemical-free party will be held at 11:00 p.m. on Friday, May 25th. Students and their guests will be required to come tobacco-free, alcohol-free, and drug-free, remaining so throughout the party. A contract signed by the student and a parent will be required for admission. Contracts can be picked up at each high school, must be signed, notarized and returned to the principal no later than May 18, 1990.

The party this year will be held at the Boy Scout Camp, west of Wheeler. Activities will include a dance featuring all types of music by Shotgun Kelly, of Tumbleweed Sounds, skits, volleyball, games, many door prizes, and more food than anyone could eat in one night. Hamburgers, pizza, ice cream and soft drinks have been donated by area merchants.

Project Graduation is a joint school, family, community, and business project. We see this as an opportunity to provide a chemical-free, wholesome, and safe graduation celebration for the young people of Wheeler County.

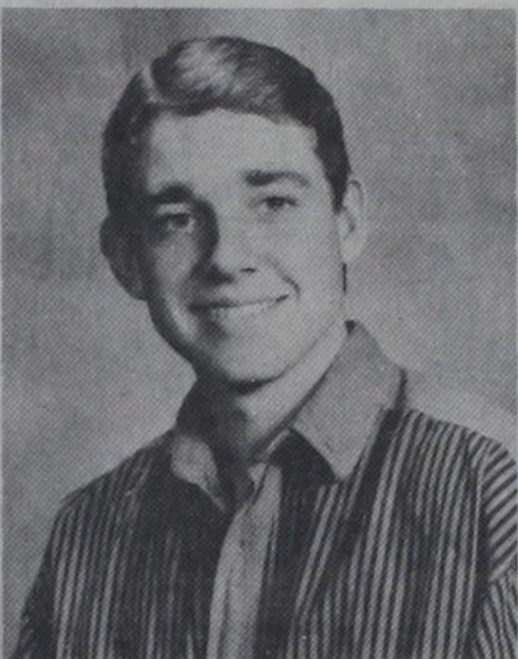

Friday consisted of paperwork the bigger part of the day for Frankie and I. There is just no end to it.

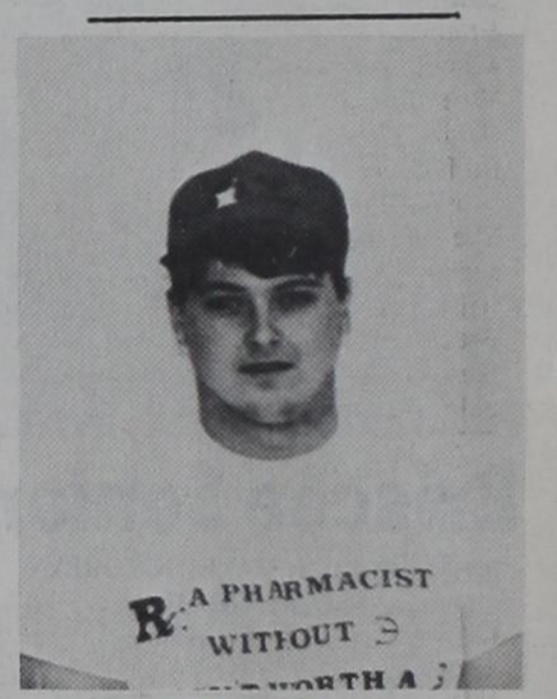

From The Minister's Desk:
There is a popular children's rhyme that says: "Pussycat, pussycat, where have you been? I've been to London to look at the Queen. Pussycat, pussycat, what did you there? I frightened a little mouse under the chair."
An important truth is emphasized in this little rhyme. This truth is that it is extremely easy to allow an unimportant fact to distract from an important fact. And it is a truth that more Bible students should recognize.

In my opinion, there are too many Bible students who have a purely academic attitude about the Bible and its great truths. For example, I once heard a man boast of his knowledge of the Bible, saying: "There are 919 chapters in the Old Testament which consist of 23,545 verses and 603,584 words. And there are 260 chapters in the New Testament which consist of 7,756 verses and 170,551 words." As I listened to this information, my initial, but silent reaction was: "So what?"

I believe that the ultimate goal of Bible study is application and not merely knowledge. The Apostle Paul declared that the Word of God—the Bible—is "...inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness..." And then he added: "...That the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3:16-17)

While this text is usually a "proof text" for the inspiration of the Bible, it is also emphasizes that the purpose of the Bible is to produce a godly life not merely a knowledgeable life. For this reason, serious Bible students will ask some questions about any Biblical text that they study. These questions are:

1. What problems of life does this solve?
2. What needs of life does this text meet?
3. What course of life does this text recommend?

With these questions, Bible students will not allow the unimportant facts of the Bible to distract from the important. And then they can be godly people not merely knowledgeable people.

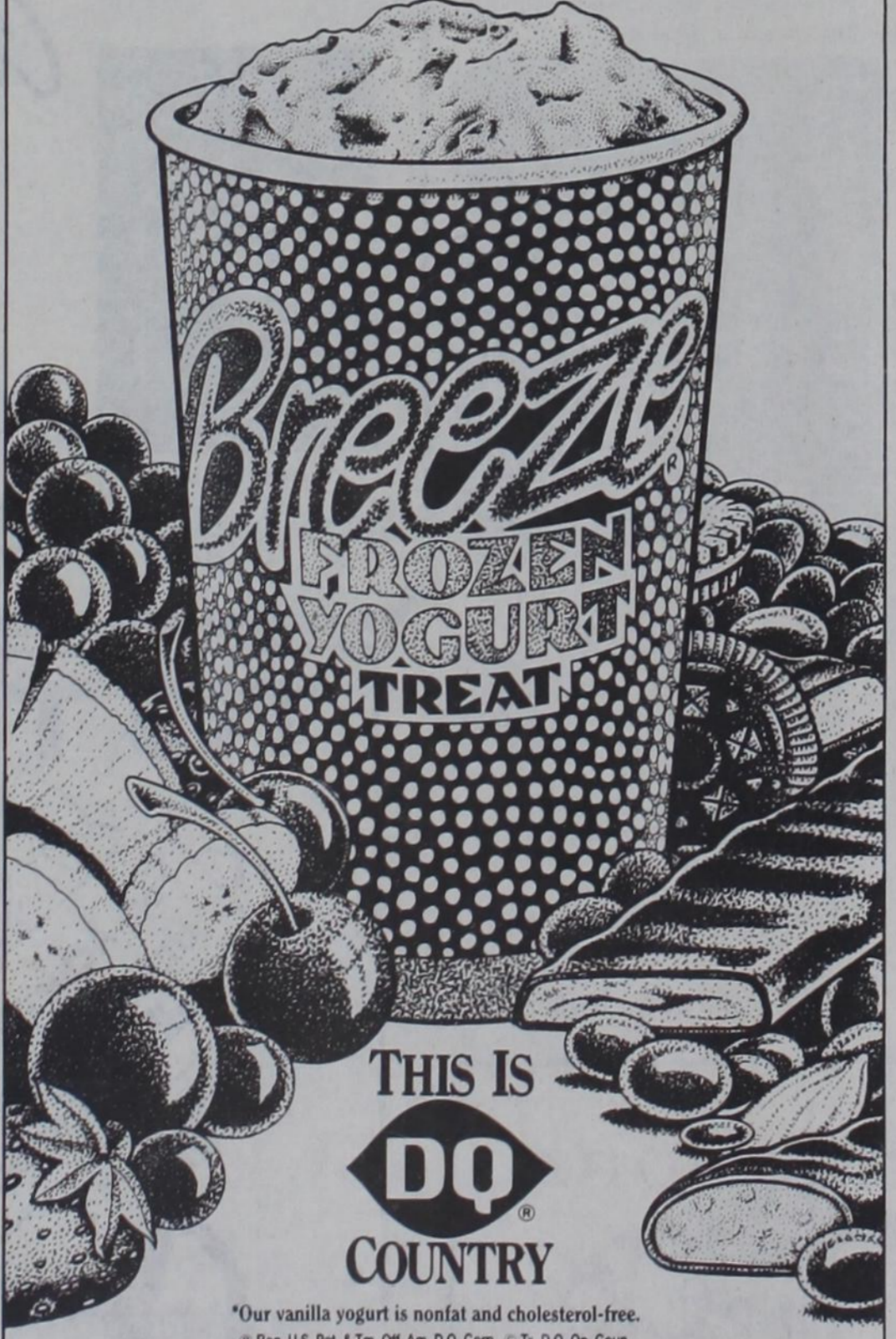

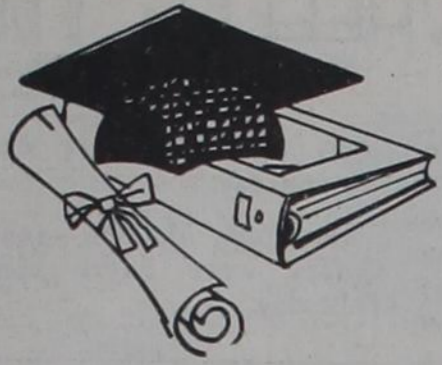

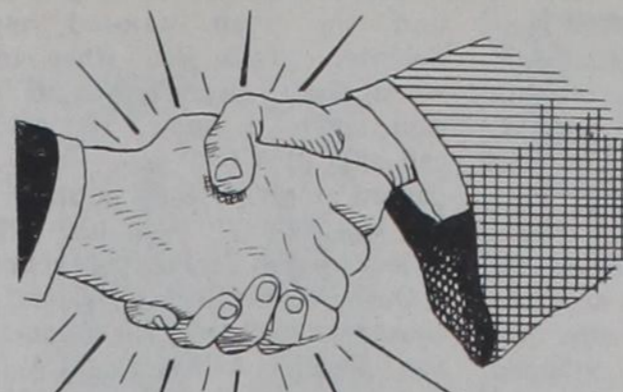

Kyle plans to attend W.T.S.U. and work for a Bachelors Degree in Science.

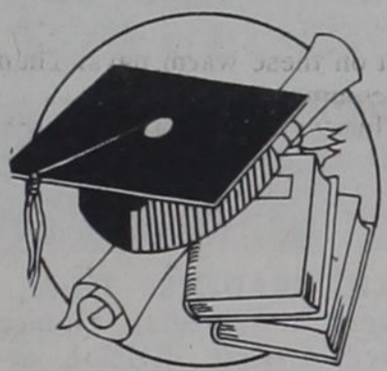

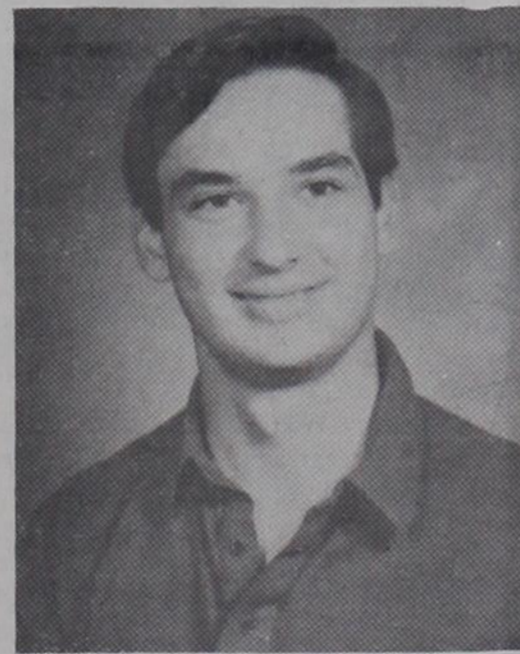

Tammy Helton Receives Phillips Scholarship

Tammy S. Helton has been selected to receive a college scholarship worth \$5,000 from the Educational Fund for Children of Phillips Petroleum Company Employees.

The winners may use the scholarship

to attend any accredited college or university of their choice.

Tammy is a senior at Wheeler High School. She is the daughter of Jimmy and Jo Ann Helton.

Selected as an alternate was Carla D. Sharp of Pampa High School, daughter of Royce and Katie Sharp.

As in past years, Phillips this year awarded 66 scholarships and named 30 alternates, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the company's scholarship fund. Winners were selected by a committee of educators and business people who have no connection with Phillips. This independent committee awarded scholarships on the basis of scholastic record, future promise, and financial need.

Each winner will receive a \$1,250 award renewable yearly based on scholastic achievement, for a four-year total scholarship of \$5,000. More than 432 students applied for scholarships this year.

The educational fund was established in 1939 to aid children of employees of Phillips and its subsidiaries in obtaining higher educations. Since then, more than 2,616 young people have received college educations from scholarships totalling \$5.8 million. Phillips annual scholarship contribution totals \$330,000 a year.

Qualifying students who did not receive scholarships may apply for low-interest loans to help finance their college educations from a separate Phillips educational fund.

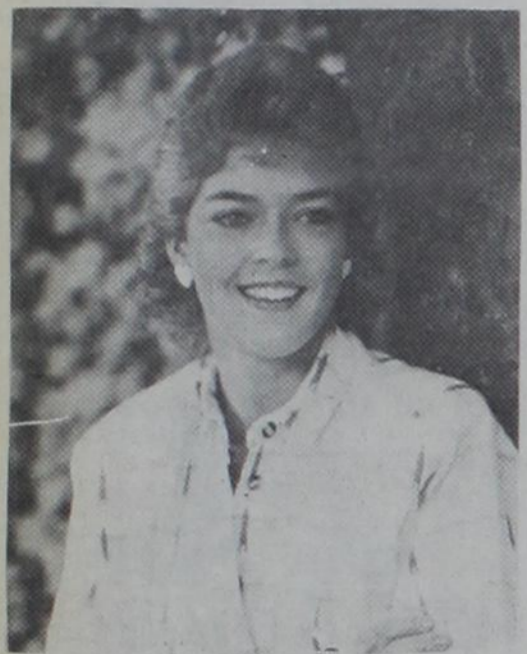

One hundred sixty-four West Texas State University undergraduates were named to the President's List and 662 earned mention on the Deans' List for the 1990 spring semester.

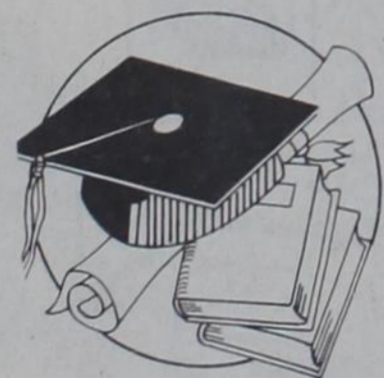
Students earning President's List recognition achieved a semester grade point average (GPA) of 3.850 (of a possible 4.000) or better with a minimum class load of 12 hours.

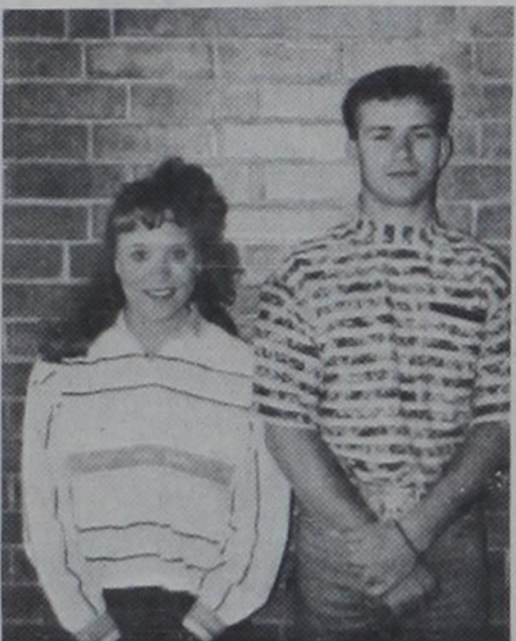
The steers will be ear tagged, nose printed and photographed.

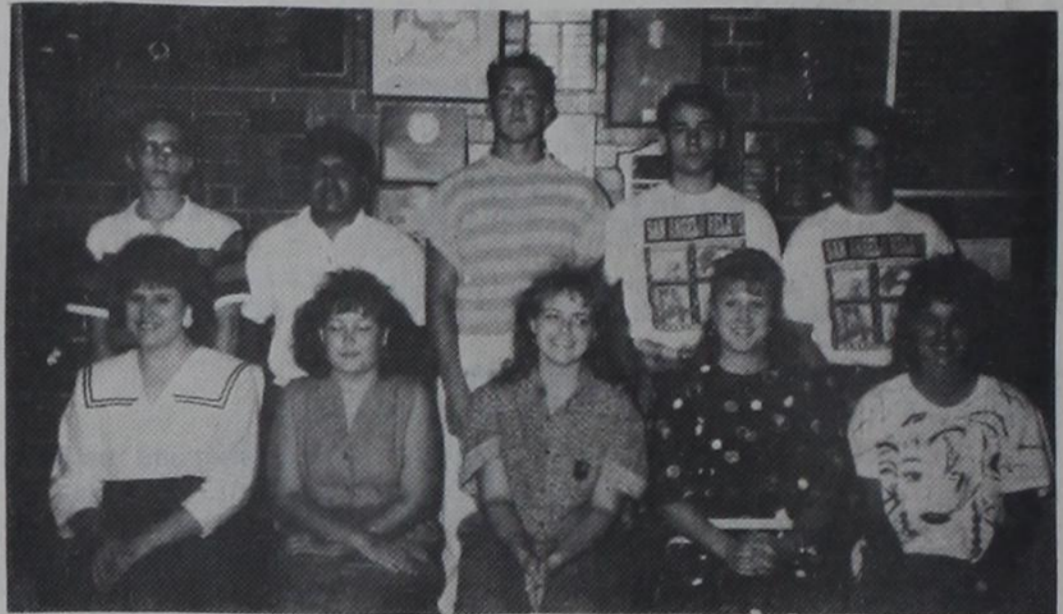
