





Services Held For Robbie Willene Waters


Robbie Willene Waters, 71, died Sunday, May 20, 1990 in Pampa.

TURKEY PARADISE IS IN TEXAS

This will be my prayer, now that I've experienced the outdoor paradise #9213-R.B. Uselton vs Eunice for men who chase beards and spurs: Wheeler, Texas, located in the Pan-

In two days of hunting last week, I #9215-Rhonda Kaye Blanchard saw more than 400 turkeys. The four vs Kenneth Brent Blanchard, members of our hunting party bagged four gobblers, each with at least 11/4 -inch spurs within the first 45 minutes of leaving our the motel rooms. Each bird weighed more than 20 pounds and was more than 4 years old.

"We've got plenty of turkeys here in the Wheeler area, because no one hunts them much," Tom Puryear said. "Turkeys are very common in this region.'

Each year, the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce promotes a three-day turkey hunt at \$75 per hunter. The fee includes guides and the land on which to hunt during the three-day stay. The only other expenses for the hunters are their Texas licenses and the cost of their motel rooms and food. But as one of the members of the chamber explained to me, "Most hunters bag their birds the first day they're here.'

Something interesting about Wheeler, other than its numerous turkeys, are the photo opportunities available in that part of the nation. For instance, after the first hunt, when I bagged a tom, I was able to photograph longbeard gobblers and jake turkeys at less than 30 yards. Wheeler also is the booming (breeding) ground of the lesser prairie chicken. Wildlife photographers from around the world come to Wheeler to watch the prairie chicken as it performs its annual courtship dance. My second gobbler was taken on the second day of the hunt. (Texas has a two-gobbler-per-hunter limit per season). I was hunting with Preston Pittman of Lucedalc, Miss., owner of Preston Pittman Game Calls. We crawled up to the edge of a plum thicket and Pittman began to call. Soon two longbeards walked slowly toward us. When the first turkey was less than 20 yards away, I fired and the tom tumbled. Immediately, Pittman called once more. The second gobbler ran approximately 20 yards before turning and coming back to the spot where the first gobbler had been downed. Pittman bagged the second gobbler. Both birds had 11/2-inch spurs. My turkey weighed 22 pounds; Pittman's bird weighed 221/2 pounds. As turkey season draws to a close this weekend, you can be sure I'm already planning a trip next year to Wheeler to chase the Rio Grande turkeys across the desert.
