On this particular day the city's businesses closed at 5:00 in the afternoon and people gathered on the corner of 4th and Shamrock St. at the sight of Wheeler's Historical Museum. The Velasquez's musical group was on hand with their vibrant, full-toned music. Judge Grainger McIlhany was the Master of Ceremonies. After his preliminary words he introduced, Mayor Pete Burton who presented Astronaut Bean and gave him the Key to the City. The Dedicatory Speech was made by Thomas Daughtry, followed by the unveiling of the sign: "Alan Bean Blvd." Following this a barbeque was served at the High School Gymnas-
