COLD HOUSES & HEAVY BLANKETS

was two miles east, and a mile and a half mile north of Wheeler. It had an old, two-story house that needed quite a bit of work on it. As soon as we got moved in, my folks started fixing it up. house. I guess our folks figured that kids could tolerate a hotter room in the summer, and the colder one in the winter, better than they could.

The water in our "water bucket" in the kitchen, would sometimes freeze over, and you'd have to break the ice to get a drink, or pour water in the "wash pan" to wash your face. If you forgot the night before, and left the dipper in the bucket, you'd have to be careful not to bend the handle, getting it out. I wasn't always careful enough..

Sleeping in an unheated room wasn't all that bad, if you had plenty of heavy quilts and blankets. It's not enough, however, to just have a lot of covers on top of you. If you didn't have a good quilt and blanket under you, you'd still be cold! It was also, helpful to have on a pair of long handle underwear, with the "trapdoor" in the back. Needless to say, you either had to wear something like a toboggan cap, or else sleep with your head under the covers! With all that and a good pair of heavy socks, I made it just fine.

Our first winter there it came a snow, and the wind blew really hard out of the north, all night! The next morning, there was a light dusting of snow in my room. We
